## GRACE GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

---

### Loving One Another

“Do not reduce church to listening to a podcast. It’s so much more than that. It’s community. It’s worshiping with others, praying for others, hurting with others, serving others, being involved in the lives of others.” — Craig Groeschel

1. What does it mean to have “fellowship” with one another? What is the basis for such “fellowship”?
2. What does the fact that the church is community mean to you?
3. How does the idea of community affect the way you interact with other believers at Grace?
4. If we are going to build community here at Grace, what will that look like?
5. Why does Jesus in John 13:34 call this a new commandment?
6. What is the difference in the focus of the old commandment on “our neighbor” and the new commandment on “one another”?
7. How does verse 35 change the whole dynamic of loving one another?
8. In what ways do the following one another’s help us to love as Christ loved us?
  - a. Romans 12:16 “Live in harmony with one another.”
  - b. Romans 15:7 “Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you”.
  - c. Galatians 5:13 “For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another.”
  - d. Ephesians 4:32 “Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.”
  - e. 1 Thessalonians 5:11 “Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing.”
  - f. 1 Peter 1:22 “Having purified your souls by your obedience to the truth for a sincere brotherly love, love one another earnestly from a pure heart,”
  - g. 1 Peter 4:9 “Show hospitality to one another without grumbling.”
