Grace Group Discussion Questions
"The Fruits of Genuine Repentance"
2 Corinthians 7:13–16

Read Chapter 7

Observation (What Does the Passage Say?)

1. According to verse 13, what effect did the Corinthians' repentance have on Titus?
2. What did Paul say had proved true when Titus returned from Corinth (v. 14)?
3. How did the Corinthians receive Titus according to verse 15?

Interpretation (What Does It Mean?)

1. Why does Paul view repentance as evidence of God's transforming work rather than merely human effort?
2. What is the connection between obedience and genuine repentance in this passage?
3. How does repentance restore confidence and trust within relationships?

Correlation (How Does it Relate to Other Passages?)

1. Read Romans 2:4. How does God's kindness relate to the repentance described in this sermon?
2. Read John 15:5. How does abiding in Christ help explain the fruits of repentance seen in Corinth?
3. Read James 4:8. How does drawing near to God parallel Paul's description of repentance and restoration?

Application (How Can I Apply It to My Life?)

1. Are there spiritual activities or traditions you may be relying on more than Christ Himself?
2. How do you normally respond when confronted with sin or correction?
3. What practical step can you take this week to become a source of refreshment and encouragement to others?

Response (What Should My Response Be?)

1. Which of the four fruits of repentance—refreshment, truth, affection, or confidence—do you most need to grow in?
2. What area of your life is the Holy Spirit calling you to confess and surrender to Christ today?
3. How will you respond this week to God's kindness that leads you to repentance?
