Scripture alone

- As you understand it now, what was the Reformation and what made it so significant?
- Why do you think the doctrine of "Scripture alone" is still important today? Can the Bible be trusted? Explain.
- What kinds of thoughts and feelings flow from believing Scripture can be trusted and is the supreme authority for your life?
- How does the supreme authority of Scripture practically get expressed in your life?
- Read 2 Timothy 3:16. As expressed by Paul to Timothy, what is Scripture useful for?
- Are there ways you struggle to view Scripture as the authority for your life? Explain. In what ways can we lost the centrality of Scripture alone? What are the things in your life that compete with Scripture to be an equal or greater source of authority?
- Here at Grace, we talk about being Biblically saturated. How do the ideas of "Scripture alone" and "Biblically saturated" go together? What does it mean for how we pursue God corporately? What does it mean for how we pursue God individually?

Grace alone and Faith alone

- What's the difference between imputed righteousness and infused righteousness?
- How would you describe the difference between the Roman Catholic view of grace and the Protestants' view?
- According to Paul in Romans 3:21-26 and Ephesians 2:8-10, how is it that grace received produces our righteousness? Explain.
- Why is grace contrary to the human experience, or counter-intuitive? Why do we sometimes resist the idea, especially when it comes to a person's relationship with God?
- In what ways do we move away from the Gospel of salvation by grace through faith without realizing it?
- What do you believe are the effects God intends to produce in our life through the belief in salvation by grace alone? How does that impact our thoughts, feelings, and actions?
- How might you lovingly, humbly initiate this conversation with a Roman Catholic friend? With others in your spheres of influence?
