

Aaron Lorshbough John 13:21-30

Big Idea of John: Jesus Christ is the Son of God

Today's Big Idea: Jesus was loving and faithful to Judas even when he knew Judas wouldn't be either of those to Jesus.

- Jesus announces one of the disciples will betray him.
- Jesus continues to pour out honor and love to Judas, even though Jesus already knows Judas is the one who will betray him.
- During this passage, the other eleven disciples don't understand what's happening.
- Judas continues in his plan to betray Jesus.

GRACE GROUP QUESTIONS

- 1. Why was Jesus troubled in this passage.
- 2. Who was the disciple whom Jesus loved? Why do you think he never uses his name in his gospel account?
- 3. When did Jesus first know Judas would betray him? (See John 6:64). How is that significant to his relationship with Judas? Are there other warnings in the gospel of John one of the twelve would betray him? What are they?
- 4. If Jesus was going to go to the cross anyway, what does it matter that Judas was the one who was going to betray him? Is there hope for Judas going to heaven (see Mark 14:21)?
- 5. To whom did Jesus in this passage reveal Judas was going to betray him? Why did Jesus tell that disciple? What did the apostles think Judas was leaving to do? Why did they not recognize Judas as the one who would betray Jesus?
- 6. What is the significance of dipping the morsel and presenting it to a person, such as Jesus did for Judas? Describe the contrast between how Jesus treated Judas and how Judas treated Jesus, both at the meal and at other points in the gospel of John.
- 7. What do we learn from Jesus in how to treat even our enemies or those who would betray us?
- 8. Do you think Judas believed Jesus was the Son of God or the Christ? Why or why not?
- 9. The passage ends with, "And it was night." What is the significance of this? How does this part of our text fit with the theme of light and darkness in the gospel of John (see John 1:4-5; John 12:35-36 and 46).
