Congratulations to our new Senior Pastor, Pastor Kevin Kelley.

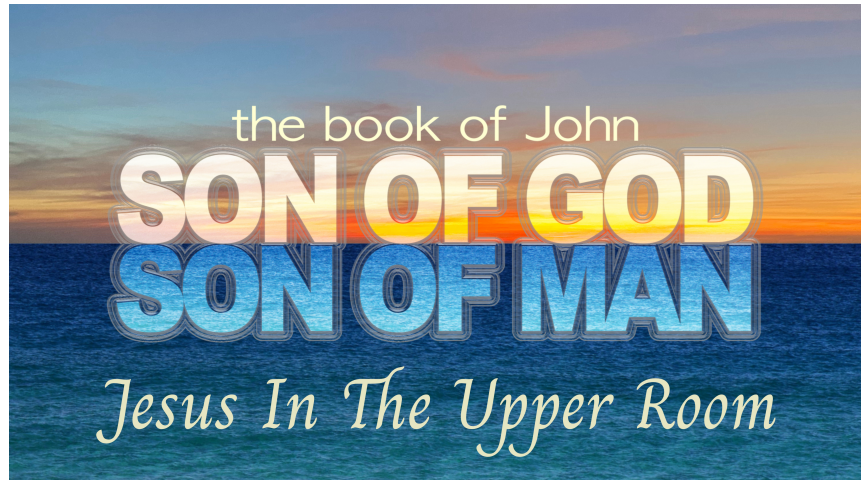
Quarterly Business Meeting: Members join us on **June 9th** after the service for our Quarterly Business Meeting.

John 13:1-11

1. The Setting: His Passover, His Timing, His Love (13:1)
2. His Betrayal: Judas Iscariot's Heart (13:2)
3. His Servanthood: Washing the Disciples' Feet (13:3-5)
4. His Disciple: Peter's Response, Resistance and Surrender (13:6-9)
5. His Spiritual Cleansing: Symbolism and Significance (13:10-11)

GRACE GROUP QUESTIONS

1. In the last part of verse 1, it says *He loved them to the end*. This literally meant that Jesus loved the disciples *to the uttermost* or *eternally*. In light of that, what do you think that means for you as a believer? How should this impact the way you face this world's ups & downs?
2. In verse 2 it states that the devil had put in Judas Iscariot's heart to betray Jesus. Do you think Judas was powerless to betray Jesus? What role did Judas play in this? What role did the Father play in this?
3. In light of the cultural norms of foot washing in Jesus' time, why was it so significant that Jesus washed the disciples' feet?
4. Do you think Peter's initial objection in verse 8 was justified? What do you think his objection showed about his feeling about himself with respect to Jesus?
5. Was Jesus really concerned that the disciples' feet were dirty or did His act symbolize more (see Psalm 51:2-7)? What ultimately cleansed the disciples?
6. What lessons/conclusions do you draw from Jesus' washing of the disciples' feet? What other words had Jesus spoken that back that up?
