People need **a more personal understanding of God** than is available through nature and general history. God has provided **particular revelation** of himself that provides us the opportunity to know Him and His saving work through His Son Jesus Christ.

The Definition and Necessity of Special Revelation

- <u>Special revelation</u>: God's manifestation of Himself to particular persons at definite times and places, enabling them to enter into a redemptive relationship with Him.
- Humans lost the relationship of favor they enjoyed with God when Adam and Eve fell
 into sin. It was necessary for them to come to know God in a fuller way if the conditions
 of fellowship were once again to be met.
- The objective of special revelation has always been **relationship** information was given for the purpose of transformation, resulting in a relationship with Him.
- The **insufficiency** of general revelation required the special revelation. Special revelation doesn't replace general revelation, rather **it builds on it**.

The Nature of Special Revelation

- Special revelation is personal, anthropic, and analogical
 - o Personal a personal God reveals himself to persons made in His image
 - o <u>Anthropic</u> A transcendent God reveals Himself in human language and human categories of thought and action. In other words, He speaks our language.
 - Analogical God uses concepts that are familiar to us. We may not know everything about God, but the things He has revealed of Himself are true.

The Modes of Special Revelation – History, Divine Speech, and the Incarnation

- <u>History</u> events by which God has made Himself known to human kind
 - The call of Abraham, the divine covenants, the Exodus, etc.
- Divine Speech God speaking to and through His people
 - Can be audible, inaudible, through dreams, etc. revelation and inspiration merged into one event (giving of Scripture to men)
- The Incarnation God became a man, the most complete form of revelation
 - When the prophets spoke, they were bearers of a message from God and about God. When Jesus spoke, it was God Himself speaking.

Special Revelation - Propositional, Personal, and Progressive

- Orthodox Christianity God's propositional truths (in Scripture) are revelation
- Neoorthodoxy my personal encounter with God through the propositions of Scripture
- <u>Progressive</u> Later revelation builds on earlier revelation complementary, not contradictory
