## Theology 1 The Goodness of God & the Trinity Dr. Todd Stinnett 3/8/23

The goodness of God may be discovered in all of his relationships with His creatures. It is most effectively demonstrated in **His moral attributes of purity and integrity**, and in the entire complex of characteristics that are identified as His **love**.

## The Holiness of God

- The first of God's main attributes is **holiness** He is **set apart** from His creation.
- The holiness of God is affirmed throughout Scripture (Isa. 6:3, 1 Peter 1:16).
- Out of the holiness of God proceed the following attributes:
  - o **Righteousness** God is right and does that which is right (Psalm 19:8)
  - o Justice Because God is right, His judgments are always correct
  - o **Genuineness** God is true (John 14:6)
  - Veracity God represents things as they really are (Titus 1:2)
  - o Faithfulness God proves His truthfulness (Lam. 3:23)

## The Love of God

- The second of God's main attributes is **love**. As His holiness is affirmed through Scripture, so is His love (1 John 4:8, 16, John 3:16, Rom. 5:8).
- Out of the love of God proceed the following attributes:
  - o **Benevolence** God is concerned for those whom He loves
  - Grace God acts according to His goodness and generosity. In other words, He
    doesn't just give us what we deserve He provides what we don't deserve.
  - Mercy God has tender-hearted, loving compassion for His people
  - Persistence God often withholds judgment from His creation (2 Pet. 3:9)
- While many have often pointed to a seeming contradiction between God's holiness and love, His love is only rightly understood against the backdrop of His holiness.

## The Trinity

- God is one "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one!" (Deut. 6:4)
- God is **three** "Baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit" (Matt. 28:19).
- Early heresies Arianism, Modalism
- Council of Constantinople (A.D. 381) "one ousia (substance) in three hypostases (persons)"
