## August 30th – The Result of Wisdom

"If the ax is dull and one does not sharpen the edge then he must use more strength, but wisdom brings success." (Ecc. 10:10)

Have you ever attempted to cut down a tree or split wood? I've split my fair share of wood and there's one thing I can tell you for certain — I'd much rather use a sharp ax than a dull one. Will a dull ax split wood? I know first hand that it will because I've used a dull ax on several occasions. But using a dull ax will cause a man to take many more swings to split the same piece of wood that could've been chopped easily with a sharp edge.
