June 27th – Adversity Is Opportunity

"At that time a great persecution arose against the church which was at Jerusalem; and they were all scattered throughout the regions of Judea and Samaria...therefore those who were scattered went everywhere preaching the word." (Acts 8:1, 4)

No one enjoys the trials of life, but all of us experience them. I once heard a man say, "You're either going into a storm, you're in the midst of a storm, or you're coming out of a storm." I think there is a lot of truth in that statement. Sometimes we wish we had a crystal ball to see what lies ahead, but it's probably a good thing we don't know the future because it would surely scare us to death.
