July 10th – Serving God is No Bed of Roses

"But when her masters saw that their hope of profit was gone, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged them into the marketplace to the authorities."

(Acts 16:19)

I bet you're familiar with the story of Paul and Silas. Both of them were men who loved the Lord and joined forces to spread the Gospel and plant churches. One of their missionary journeys brought them to the city of Philippi.
