Theology 2 Subjective Aspects of Salvation Dr. Todd Stinnett 10/11/23

The doctrine of salvation encompasses a **large and complex area** of biblical teaching and of human experience. Consequently, it is necessary to draw some **distinctions** among its various parts.

Effectual Calling

- Effectual calling is God's special work with the elect, enabling them to respond in repentance and faith, and rendering it certain that they will.
- How does it work?
 - <u>Conviction</u> The unbeliever is confronted with his sin through the power of the Holy Spirit (John 16:8). The Word of God is a key means of effectual calling (Rom. 10:17). The Gospel is the essential portion of God's Word that God uses to produce conviction and salvation (Rom. 1:16).
 - <u>An Opening of the Heart Through Illumination</u> A good example of this from the NT is Lydia: "The Lord *opened her heart* to give heed to what was said by Paul" (Acts 16:14).
- God has saved and will save all that He has called (John 6:37, 44).

Conversion

- A radical transformation that is evident in the life of everyone that God has called unto salvation. (2 Cor. 5:17)
- Conversion is a single entity which has two distinguishable but inseparable aspects (two sides of the same coin):
 - <u>Repentance</u> the **negative aspect** of conversion (repudiation of sin)
 - Turning from something sin and self (Luke 13:3, Acts 3:19)
 - Repentance involves a **genuine brokenness** and regret for one's sins in particular, what his sins have done to Christ.
 - Repentance also involves a **willingness to turn** away from that which grieves God through unconditional surrender to Him.
 - <u>Faith</u> the **positive aspect** of conversion (receiving the Savior)
 - Turning to Someone Jesus Christ alone (1 Cor. 15:3-4)
 - Faith is **believing that Jesus Christ paid my sin debt** through His sacrificial death on the cross.
 - The evidence of faith is a life that is surrendered to the Lordship of Christ (James 2:17-18).

Regeneration

- To be "born again," not of water but by the power of the Holy Spirit (John 3:3, 5-6).
- Evidence of rebirth presence of the Holy Spirit in the life of believers (1 John 2:20, 27)
