Message: One Response to God's Four-Fold Greatness

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Memory Verse: Psalm 23:4 NIV

Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I fear no evil, for You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me.

The goal of these questions is to foster meaningful discussion and to encourage participants to reflect on God's Word to lead to heart transformation. Feel free to modify or expand upon these questions based on the dynamics and needs of your Small Group.

Big Idea: There's only one correct response to the goodness of God: Worship.

Read Psalm 33

1. When we worship in song, we sing to God, not man. Does being musically gifted matter to God when we approach Him in worship? If you are not vocally or instrumentally talented, does this impact your heart's attitude toward worship?
2. What does it mean to you to "sing joyfully to the Lord"? What things easily lead you to worship? What can keep you from being worshipful? What would or does worshipping daily look like for you?
3. God is a creator and He has given us the ability to create. What are some ways that we can use our creative abilities to give glory to God? How can we bring creativity and joy into our worship?
4. In what ways have you experienced the earth being full of the goodness of the Lord? When you have something to praise the Lord about, how often do you share the news with others? How can sharing praises about what God is doing encourage other believers?



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5. Worship is an emotive experience where our hearts need to be submitted to God. Why is having our heart connected with God in worship important? Do you ever struggle with worship becoming ritualistic, like you are just “going through the motions”? What can be done to engage your heart and mind fully?
6. Worship is where we magnify and make much of God. We often give praise to objects or people instead of God. What are some idols that our nation tends to struggle with? Is there anything or anyone (including yourself) that you can place on a pedestal above God? If so, what/who?
7. God is not distant, He is close. He has fashioned our hearts and understands our works. As you think about your relationship with God, does He feel like an abstract concept or does He feel like a close friend? How can we grow to greater levels of relational connection with our Father God? What helps you experience closeness with God?
8. Do you find joy in knowing that God is our gracious Savior? Do you ever find yourself trusting in your own strength? What does it look like for you to trust in God’s strength and provision?



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
