Acts 20

1 After the uproar had ceased, Paul sent for the disciples, and when he had <u>exhorted</u> them and taken his leave of them, he left to go to Macedonia. 2 When he had gone through those districts and had given them much <u>exhortation</u>, he came to Greece.

Key Attributes of Healthy Churches

1. They **Encourage** one another

Acts 20

7 On the <u>first</u> day of the week, when we were gathered together to break bread, Paul began talking to them, intending to leave the next day, and he prolonged his message until midnight. 8 There were many lamps in the upper room where we were gathered together.

Acts 20

9 And there was a young man named Eutychus sitting on the window sill, sinking into a deep sleep; and as Paul kept on talking, he was overcome by sleep and fell down from the third floor and was picked up dead. 10 But Paul went down and fell upon him, and after embracing him, he said, "Do not be troubled, for his life is in him."

Acts 20

18 And when the elders had come to him, he said to them, "You yourselves know, from the first day that I set foot in Asia, how I was with you the whole time, 19 serving the <u>Lord</u> with all <u>humility</u> and with <u>tears</u> and with <u>trials</u> which came upon me through the plots of the lews;

- 2. Their leaders serve the Lord
- 3. Their leaders are <u>humble</u>, <u>caring</u>, and <u>involved</u>

Acts 20

20 I did not shrink from declaring to you anything that was profitable,

and <u>teaching</u> you publicly and from house to house, 21 solemnly testifying to both Jews and Greeks of repentance toward God and faith in our Lord Jesus Christ.

Acts 20 (NLT)

24 But my life is worth nothing to me unless I use it for finishing the work assigned me by the Lord Jesus—the work of telling others the Good News about the wonderful grace of God.

Acts 20

28 Be on guard for yourselves and for all the flock, among which the <u>Holy Spirit</u> has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God which He purchased with His own blood. 29 I know that after my departure savage wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock; 30 and from among your own selves men will arise, speaking perverse things, to draw away the disciples after them.
