Humbling ourselves! Or Humiliated?

- Job 1:20 Then Job got up, tore his robe, and shaved his head; then he fell to the ground and worshipped.
- He was sitting, got up . . . And fell to the ground!
- Tore his robe = stripped of all glory, H/W/P
- Shave his head = Ezra 9:3 sat down appalled
- And Worshipped! King David too! 2 Samuel 12:19-20

Humbling ourselves is the opposite of what most do when they

- 1. Questions Gods heart and goodness
- 2. Judge His unfairness to our worthiness
- 3. Curse His will, contrary to ours which is better

Job ... tore his robe, symbolizing inner turmoil and shock (cf. 2:12; Gen. 37:29, 34; 44:13; Jud. 11:35), and shaved his head (cf. Isa. 15:2; Jer. 48:37; Ezek. 7:18), depicting the loss of his personal glory. Falling to the ground, not in despair, but in obeisance to God, Job worshiped. Job recognized that his loss resembled his birth and his death: he had been naked at birth, and he would be naked at death. Similarly, now he was figuratively naked. The words naked I will depart (lit., "return there") suggest that he would return to his mother's womb. But how could that be? Speaking of the womb of one's mother was sometimes a poetic way of referring to the earth (cf. Ps. 139:15; Ecc. 5:15; 12:7). The connection is obvious; for man, formed in the womb, is also made "from dust from the ground" (Gen. 2:7; cf. Gen. 3:19; Job 10:9; 34:15; Ps. 103:14), and the earth, when it yields crops, "living" things, is something like a mother giving birth to a baby.

[2Sa 12:19-20 CSB] 19 When David saw that his servants were whispering to each other, he guessed that the baby was dead. So he asked his servants, <u>"Is the baby dead?" "He is dead," they replied.</u> 20 Then David got up from the ground. He washed, anointed himself, changed his clothes, went to the LORD's house, and worshiped. Then he went home and requested something to eat. So they served him food, and he ate.



- Displays God's compassion and mercy





"regardless of," "even though," or "notwithstanding." **Don't pass judgment just** yet!



[Job 33:14 NASB20] 14 "Indeed God speaks once, Or twice, [yet] no one notices it.





[Act 17:18 NASB20] 18 And some of the <u>Epicurean and Stoic philosophers</u> as well were conversing with him. Some were saying, "What could this scavenger of tidbits want to say?" Others, "He seems to be a proclaimer of strange deities,"-because he was preaching Jesus and the resurrection.

Epicurean and Stoics, Kirk and Spock!

Epicurus asserted that philosophy's purpose is to attain as well as to help others attain happy (*eudaimonic*), tranquil lives characterized by *ataraxia* (peace and freedom from fear) and *aponia* (the absence of pain).

Epicurus was an <u>empiricist</u>, meaning he believed that only the senses are a reliable source of knowledge about the world.



Presuppositional Apologetix!!

Don't let your adversary's set the rules for debate and discussion. We ALL have resumptions, including us!

God says the greatest Suffering is our sin against Him, our contemptuousness, our insolence, arrogance...

<u>First of All, Epicurus was judging his/Greek gods, who aren't real!</u> Epicurus taught that although the gods exist, they have no involvement in human affairs. He taught that people should act ethically not because the gods punish or reward them for their actions but because, due to the power of guilt, amoral behavior would inevitably lead to remorse

Secondly, define evil! Don't let your adversary's control the definition of terms. Can we agree on what today is Justice (unborn), Tolerance, Gay, Love, Woman,

Third, Who is the real victim or the one who suffers the most contempt? Us of God!

4th, Imagine what this world would be like If God left us entirely to ourselves!

Rom.1 God gave them over, 2Thess.2:7 For the mystery of lawlessness is already at work; only He[fn] who now restrains will do so until He[fn] is taken out of the way.

5th If God prevented evil from the beginning, NONE of us would still be here! 6th Its real easy to criticize the way things are, blaming God, but what does Atheism have to offer?!!!

To Epicureans, death is annihilation, the breakdown of the atomic connections that make us ourselves, and there is no afterlife.

Epicurus was popularly, though inaccurately, remembered as a patron of drunkards, whoremongers, and gluttons. Epicureanism quickly devolves into Eat, drink and be merry and then to Hedonism!

Why are you entitled to blessings, pleasures, comforts and health? So much so that you can demand it, call God unworthy and unloving and evil... Who are humans to judge God?!!

Scripture says we are entitled to Gods wrath!!! We deserve hell!

God suffers (long) our insolence, rebellion, sins...Humans are evil!!! Mt.7:11 Most of the evil in this world is inflicted by other people (who are good?) or ourselves! Epicurus died from gall bladder disease? according to Epicurus's successor Hermarchus, Epicurus died a slow and painful death in 270 BC at the age of seventy-two from a stone blockage of his urinary tract.[35][36] Epicurus: I have written this letter to you on a happy day to me, which is also the last day of my life. For I have been attacked by a painful inability to urinate, and also dysentery, so violent that nothing can be added to the violence of my sufferings. But the cheerfulness of my mind, which comes from the recollection of all my philosophical contemplation

Insolence - contemptuously rude or impertinent behavior or speech

You and I are Evil, still demand He deal with evil?!!

[Gen 8:21 NASB20] 21 The LORD smelled the soothing aroma, and the LORD said to


Himself, "I will never again curse the ground on account of man, for the intent of man's heart is evil from his youth; and I will never again destroy every living thing, as I have done.






Why didn't Epicurus blame Men, especially if he didn't really believe in God?


The two Hebrew words translated "painful sores" were used of the plagues of "festering boils" in Egypt (Ex. 9:8-11; Deut. 28:27) and of Hezekiah's illness (2 Kings 20:7, "boil"). Some scholars say the disease <u>may have been smallpox</u>; others say it was <u>elephantiasis</u>. It was apparently some skin condition with scabs or scales, such as pemphigus foliaceus (cf.
