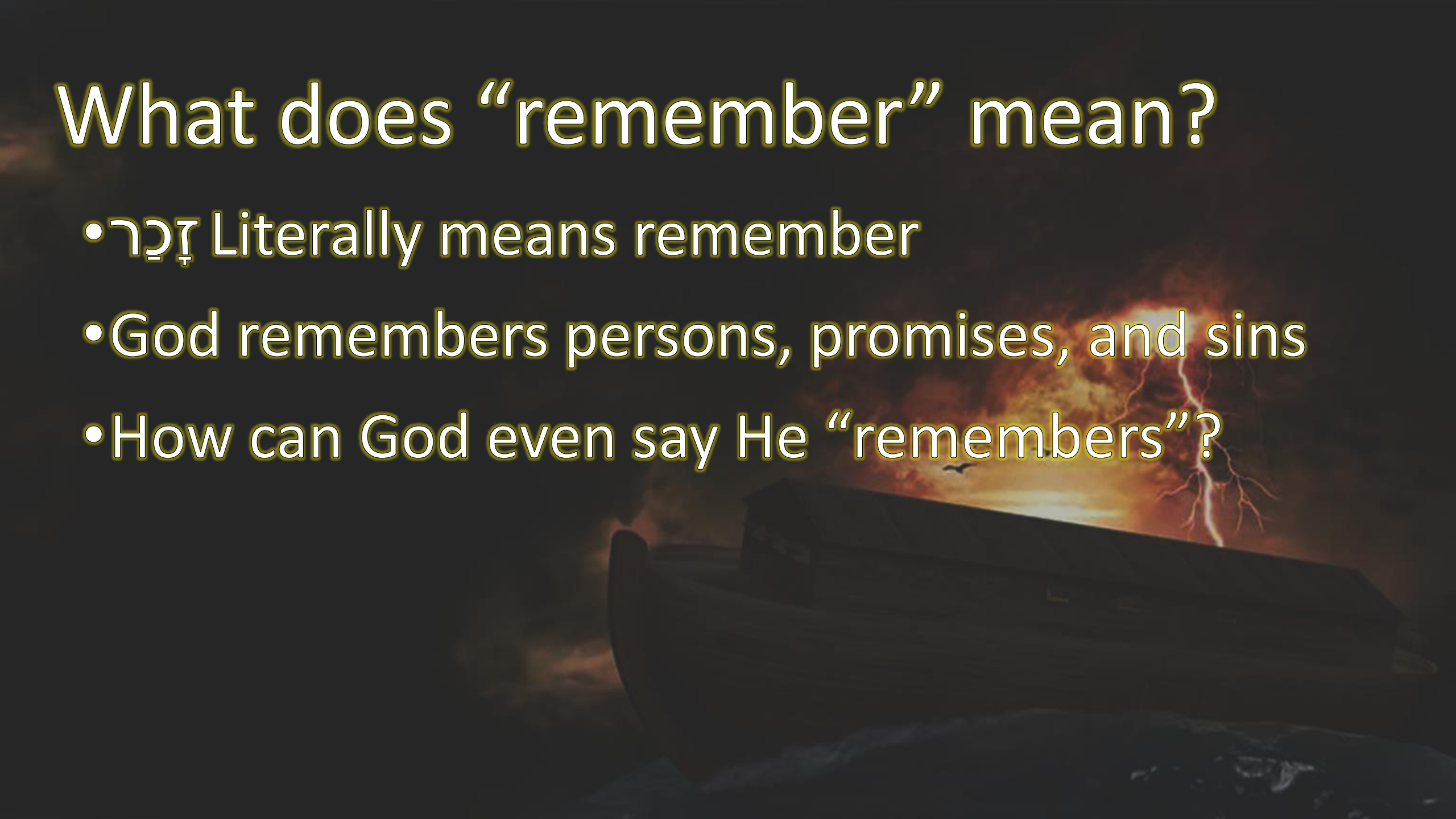

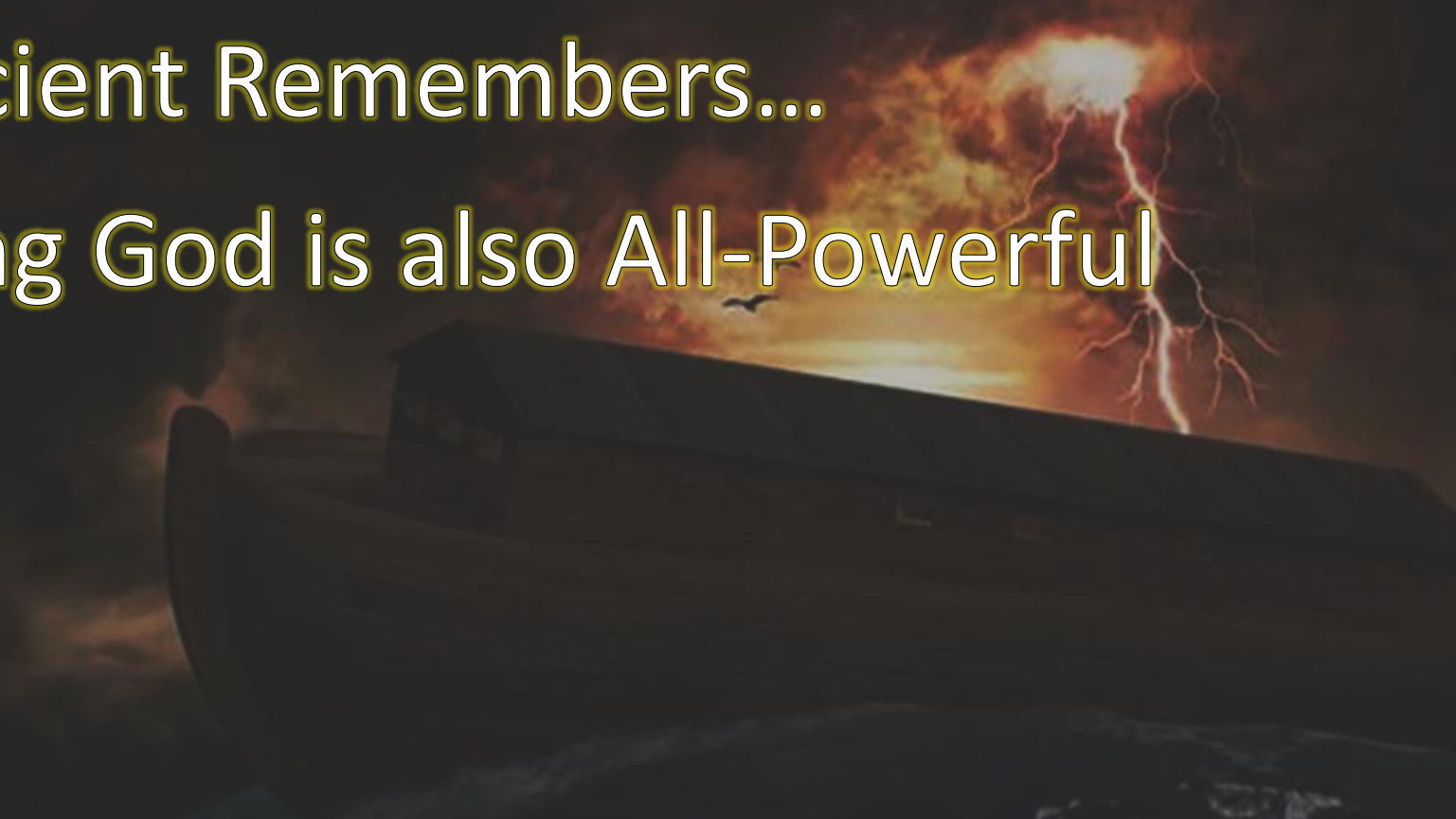
What does “remember” mean?

- How can God even say He “remembers”?



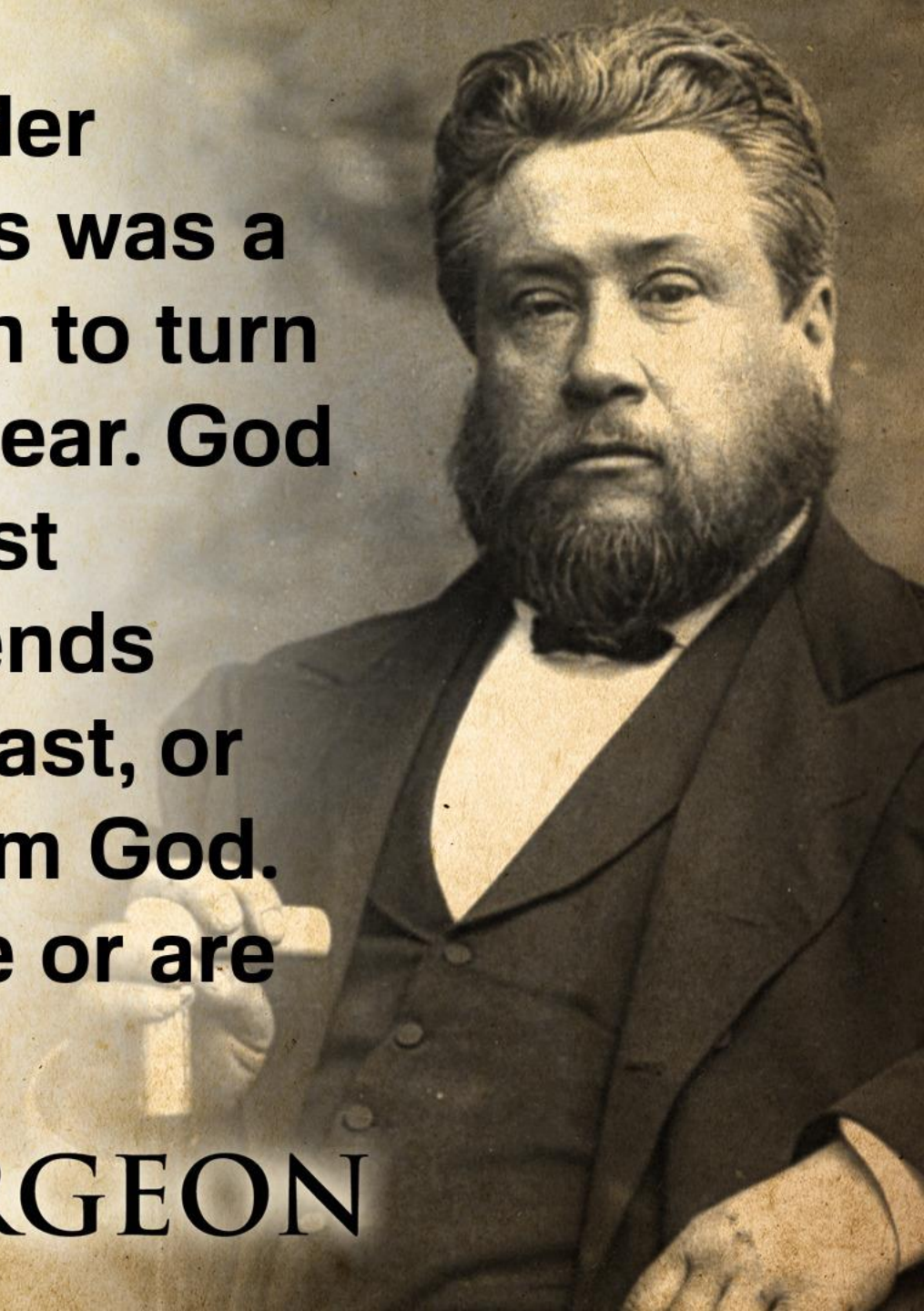
God: Omniscient and Remembering

- God is Omniscient: He is all knowing
- Yet the Omniscient Remembers...
- The All-Knowing God is also All-Powerful



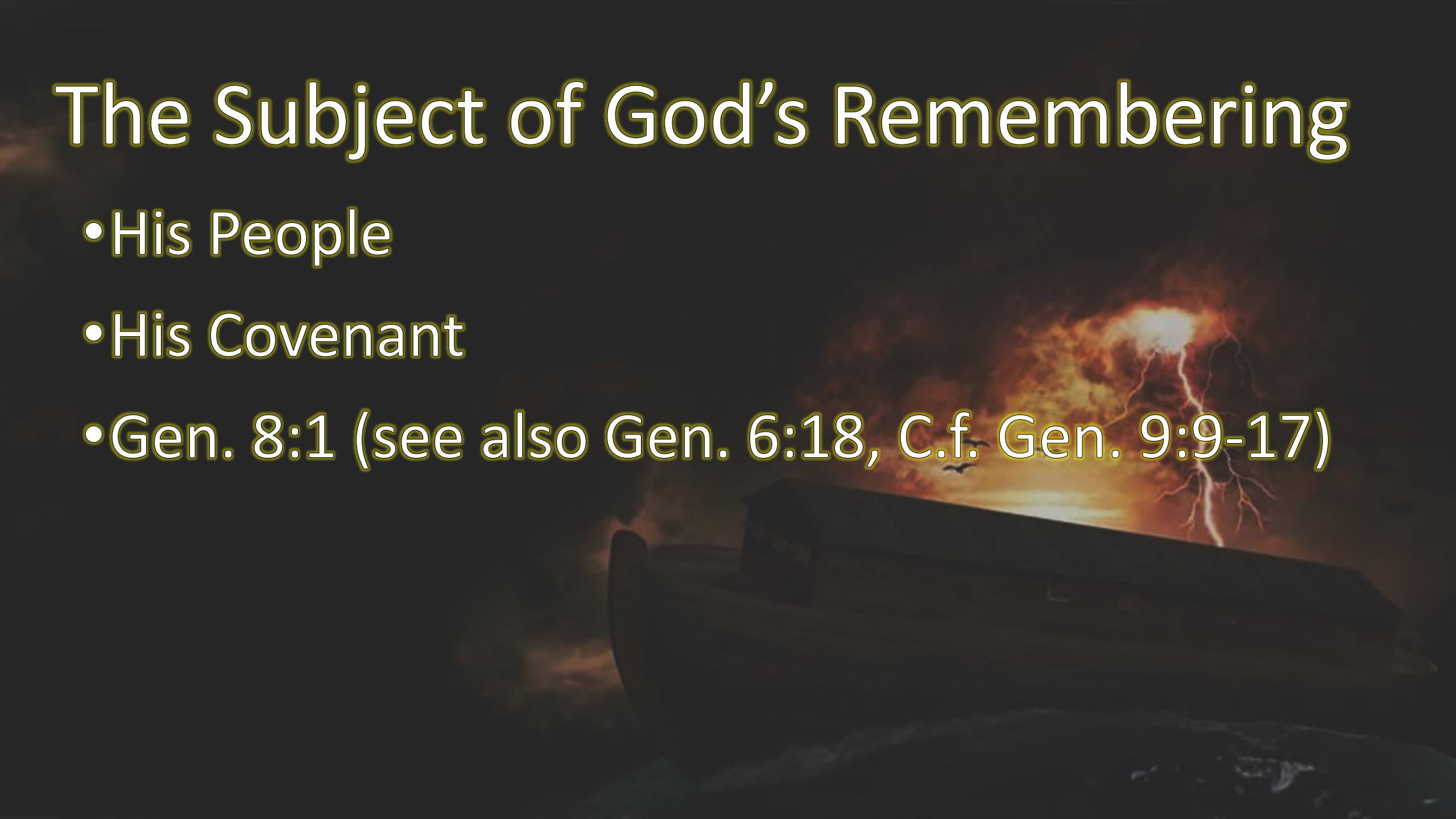

Feeling Forgotten in Evil Times

- God remembers the sins of the wicked (Jer. 14:10)
- God's patience is not forgetfulness
- God's patience is Him showing mercy



God Remembers Sins NO MORE

- God remembers evil vs. God remembers our sins no more
- Who is God referring to? The Wicked? The Righteous?
- God doesn't hold our sins against us in Christ

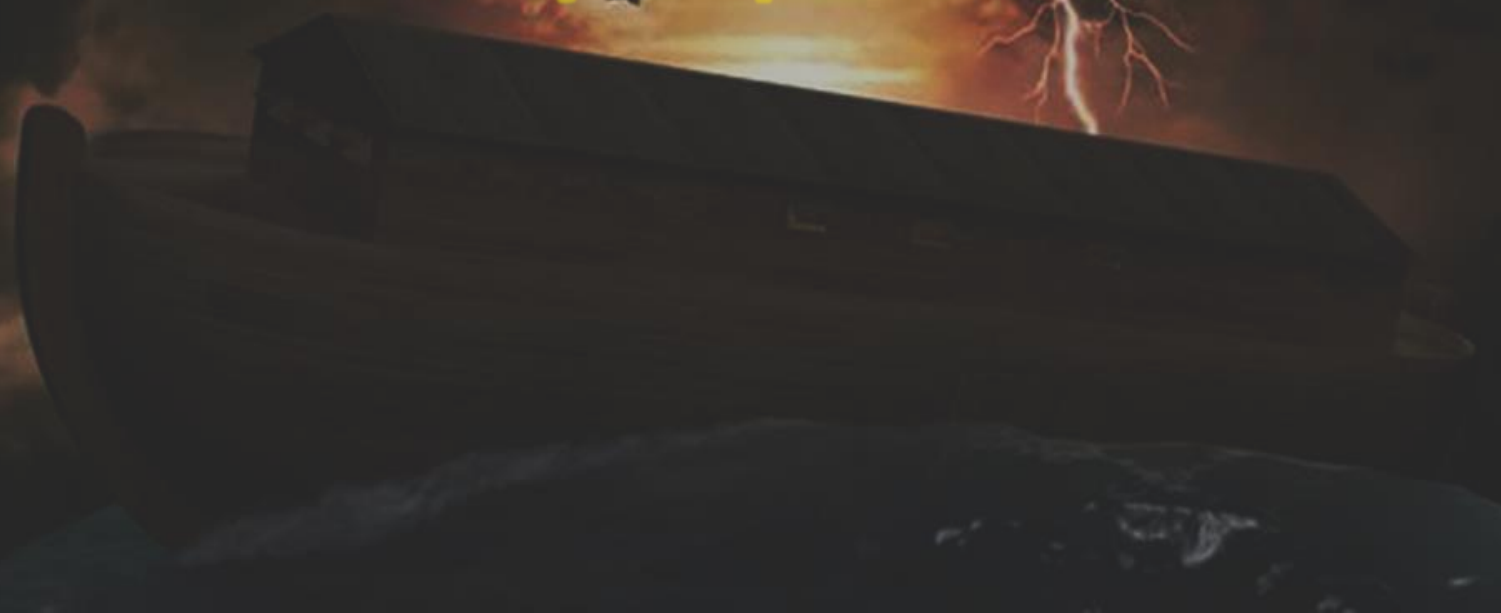

- Remind yourself God is worthy of praise




