

- Dinner Host: a Pharisee, Simon the Leper, Bethany or Galilee
- All said Woman washed feet with hair, costly perfume
- 2 said she poured it on Jesus' head, 2 say His feet
- 2 Focus on Simon, 2 focus on Lazarus as hosts, also Judas!
- Luke Describes her as "a sinner", tears / kisses! In Galilee?
- John: Lazarus, Martha and Mary! Cost, Judas! Burial, Passover

Is this similar to Jesus cleansing the Temple? We now believe there were 2 cleansings! 1 at the beginning, here in John, the other just before His crucifixion. Makes sense! So 2 feet washings?

Broken and poured out? The perfume or the woman?!

[Mar 14:3 NASB20] 3 While He was in Bethany at the home of Simon the Leper, He was reclining [at the table,] and a woman came with an alabaster vial of very expensive perfume of pure nard. She **broke the vial** and poured [the perfume] over His head. [Phl 2:17 NASB20] 17 But even if I am being poured out as a drink offering upon the sacrifice and service of your faith, I rejoice and share my joy with you all.

[2Ti 4:6 NASB20] 6 For I am already being poured out as a drink offering, and the time of my departure has come.

[Num 15:5 NASB20] 5 and you shall prepare wine for **the drink offering**, a fourth of a hin, with the burnt offering or for the sacrifice, **for each lamb**. Vs.7, 10, 24

Lk "in Galilee"<u>?</u> Early in Jesus' ministry, hosted by Pharisee named Simon, Jn.12 only days from Crucifixion

Sinful woman is assured of personal salvation Lk.7:50, Mary will be remembered with the gospel for preparing Jesus for burial, Salvation assured for all Mt. calls the host <u>Simon the Leper</u>, in Bethany [Luk 7:46-50 NASB20] 46 "You did not anoint My head with oil, but she anointed My feet with perfume. 47 "For this reason I say to you, her sins, which are many, have been forgiven, for she loved much; but the one who is forgiven little, loves little." 48 And He said to her, "Your sins have been forgiven." 49 And [then] those who were reclining [at the table] with Him began saying to themselves, "Who is this [man] who even forgives sins?" 50 And He said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you; go in peace."

[Jhn 12:7 NASB20] 7 Therefore Jesus said, "Leave her alone, so that she may keep it <u>for</u> <u>the day of My burial</u>.

[Mat 26:10, 13 NASB20] 10 But Jesus, aware of this, said to them, "Why are you bothering the woman? For she has done a good deed for Me. ... 13 "Truly I say to you, wherever this gospel is preached in the whole world, what this woman has done **will also be told in memory of her**."

[Jhn 12:7 NASB20] 7 Therefore Jesus said, "Leave her alone, so that she may keep it for the day of My burial.

She washed His feet **from behind** Him. To avoid appearance of impropriety? Lk.7:38 and standing behind [Him] at His feet, weeping, she began to wet His feet with her tears, and she wiped them with the hair of her head, and [began] kissing His feet and anointing them with the perfume







Why Hair? Hair is "a glory' to her! - 1 Cor 11
Why His feet? The very 1st Messianic Prophecy "you shall bruise Him on the heel." - Gen 3:15

• Why perfume? Mt 2:11, 2 Cor 2:14-16, Jn 12:7

Martha was serving at someone else's house?!! Since it was done for His burial, did Mary know?

[1Co 11:15 NASB20] 15 but <u>if a woman has long hair, it is a glory to her</u>? For her hair is given to her as a covering.

[Gen 3:15 NASB20] 15 And I will make enemies Of you and the woman, And of your offspring and her Descendant; He shall bruise you on the head, And **you shall bruise Him on the heel**."

[Gen 37:25 NASB20] 25 Then they sat down to eat a meal. But as they raised their eyes and looked, behold, a caravan of Ishmaelites was coming from Gilead, with their camels carrying labdanum resin, balsam, and myrrh, on their way to bring [them] down to Egypt.

[Est 2:12 NASB20] 12 Now when the turn came for each young woman to go in to King Ahasuerus, after the end of her twelve months under the regulations for the women--for the days of their beauty treatment were completed as follows: six months with oil of

myrrh and six months with balsam oil and the cosmetics for women--


[Mat 2:11 NASB20] 11 And after they came into the house, they saw the Child with His mother Mary; and they fell down and worshiped Him. Then they opened their treasures and presented to Him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

[Jhn 19:39 NASB20] 39 Nicodemus, who had first come to Him by night, also came, bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about a hundred litras [weight.]

Indignant: [Mat 26:8 NASB20] 8 But **the disciples were indignant** when they saw [this,] and said, "Why this waste?" Did Judas influence them or did they think the same?

Jhn 12:6 NASB20] 6 <u>Now he said this, not because he cared about the poor, but</u> <u>because he was a thief, and as he kept the money box, he used to steal from what</u> <u>was put into it</u>.

It is extremely curious that Judas response to this extravagant display of Love was to go right to the Pharisees for 30 pieces of silver!

When's the last time your depth of thankfulness became a dinner in someone's honor? How long does your gratitude last? Ask the wicked manager in Mt.18 What were Martha, and Lazarus doing? How much money does the avg. Christian give in a lifetime? Hours in ministry?... How many times have you opened your home to Christian hospitality?

[Rom 12:13 NASB20] 13 contributing to the needs of the saints, **practicing hospitality**.

[1Ti 3:2 NASB20] 2 An overseer, then, must be above reproach, the husband of one

wife, temperate, self-controlled, respectable, **hospitable**, skillful in teaching, [1Ti 5:10 NASB20] 10 having a reputation for good works; [and] if she has brought up children, if she has **shown hospitality to strangers**, if she has washed the saints' feet, if she has assisted those in distress, [and] if she has devoted herself to every good work. [Heb 13:2 NASB20] 2 **Do not neglect hospitality to strangers**, for by this some have entertained angels without knowing it.

[Pro 19:17 NASB20] 17 One who is gracious to a poor person lends to the LORD, And He will repay him for his good deed.

[Pro 21:13 NASB20] 13 One who shuts his ear to the outcry of the poor Will also call out himself, and not be answered.

[Pro 22:9 NASB20] 9 One who is generous will be blessed, Because he gives some of his food to the poor.

[Pro 28:27 NASB20] 27 One who gives to the poor will never lack [anything,] But one who shuts his eyes will have many curses.

[Pro 29:7 NASB20] 7 The righteous is concerned for the rights of the poor; The wicked does not understand [such] concern.

[Pro 31:9 NASB20] 9 Open your mouth, judge righteously, And defend the rights of the poor and needy.


So imminent is Jesus' death that he blesses Mary's gesture as perfectly acceptable in the context of an expected pattern of service to the poor, as if to say, "You will rightly be loving and serving the poor at all times, but this is truly my death week" (v. 8). As the Gospel of John repeatedly shows us, Jesus knew he was going to die.

, it is tempting to be attracted by a vision of the Christian life that is filled with warm hospitality and even extravagant worship, but that has no real room in it for a suffering and dying Lord or for the dying-to-ourselves way of life into which Jesus calls us. We worship a Lord whose power is made perfect in weakness, whose glory shines especially brightly as he washes his disciples' feet and offers himself on the cross. This is the Lord who calls to us this Lent, "Come, follow me." John D. Witvliet directs the Calvin Institute of Christian Worship and teaches at Calvin College and Calvin Theological Seminary


Jesus washed the disciples feet! Within a week! Why weren't the disciples washing Jesus' feet?

[Luk 8:41 NASB20] 41 And a man named Jairus came, and he was an official of the synagogue; and **he fell at Jesus' feet**, and [began] urging Him to come to his house; [Luk 17:16 NASB20] 16 and **he fell on his face at His feet**, giving thanks to Him. And **he was a Samaritan**.

[Rev 5:8, 14 NASB20] 8 When He had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb, each one holding a harp and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints. ... 14 And the four living creatures were saying, "Amen." And **the elders fell down and worshiped**. [Rev 22:8 NASB20] 8 I, John, am the one who heard and saw these things. And when I heard and saw [them,] I fell down to worship at the feet of the angel who showed me these things.





[Luk 22:20 NASB20] 20 And in the same way [He took] the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup, which is poured out for you, is the new covenant in My blood.
