A New & Better Covenant! Mk.2:13-28

Mk.2:13-17 **Self Righteousness was Never Gods plan (works salvation)**, He can save anyway and change them from inside out. Not commandments in stone but in heart 2Cor.3. **Jesus eats with Sinners!**

Mk.2:18-22 The Law cannot save, it cannot be kept. Rom.7 But we have always been saved by Grace! God foretold of a new covenant coming, now its here. Old/New

Mk.2:23-28 The Jews didn't keep the Sabbath anyways!! Jesus is our Rest!! Heb.4, He rested at right hand of Father! A new covenant and new day!

Sinners, Suppers (not fasting) and Sabbaths

[2Co 3:3, 5-10, 13-14, 17-18 ESV] 3 And you show that you are a letter from Christ delivered by us, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, **not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts**. ... 5 Not that we are sufficient in ourselves to claim anything as coming from us, but our sufficiency is from God, 6 who has made us sufficient to be **ministers of a new covenant, not of the letter but of the Spirit. For the letter kills,**

but the Spirit gives life. 7 Now if the ministry of death, carved in letters on stone, came with such glory that the Israelites could not gaze at Moses' face because of its glory, which was being brought to an end, 8 will not the ministry of the Spirit have even more glory? 9 For if there was glory in the ministry of condemnation, the ministry of righteousness must far exceed it in glory. 10 Indeed, in this case, what once had glory has come to have no glory at all, because of the glory that surpasses it. ... 13 not like Moses, who would put a veil over his face so that the Israelites might not gaze at the outcome of what was being brought to an end. 14 But their minds were hardened. For to this day, when they read the old covenant, that same veil remains unlifted, because only through Christ is it taken away. ... 17 Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. 18 And we all, with unveiled face, beholding the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another. For this comes from the Lord who is the Spirit.

What were the other disciples thinking?

As He Passed by ...

- Mark 2:14 **And as he passed by, he saw Levi** the son of Alphaeus sitting at the tax booth, and he said to him, "Follow me." And he rose and followed him.
- Mark 1:16, 2:14, 15:21 "And they compelled a passerby, Simon of Cyrene,...to carry his cross."
- John 9:1 As he passed by, he saw a man blind form birth

Drive by Discipleship as opposed to Driveby shootings or drive thrus or drive ins

[Pro 16:33 ESV] 33 The lot is cast into the lap, but its every decision is from the LORD.

Chance? Circumstance? Just happened to pass by?

[Jhn 4:4, 7 ESV] 4 And <u>he had to pass through Samaria</u>. ... 7 A woman from Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink."

[Jhn 9:1-3, 7 ESV] 1 As he passed by, he saw a man blind from birth. 2 And his disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" 3 Jesus answered, "It was not that this man sinned, or his parents, but that the works of God might be displayed in him. ... 7 and said to him, "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam" (which means Sent). So he went and washed and came back seeing.

[Mar 1:16 ESV] 16 Passing alongside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and Andrew the brother of Simon casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen.

[Mar 15:21 ESV] 21 And they compelled <u>a passerby</u>, Simon of Cyrene, who was coming in from the country, the father of Alexander and Rufus, to carry his cross.

[Mat 9:27 ESV] 27 And <u>as Jesus passed on from there, two blind men</u> followed him, crying aloud, "Have mercy on us, Son of David."

[Mat 20:30 ESV] 30 And behold, there were two blind men sitting by the roadside, and when they heard that <u>Jesus was passing by, they cried out,</u> "Lord, have mercy on us, Son of David!"

[Mar 15:21 ESV] 21 And they compelled a passerby, Simon of Cyrene, who was coming in from the country, the father of Alexander and Rufus, to carry his cross.

Spurgeon: "Blessed is that man who has done with chance, who never speaks of luck, but believes that from the least even to the greatest, all things are ordained of the Lord"

"Follow me." And he rose and followed him! Mk.2:!4

He immediately rose and left! Do you?!!

Jesus ushers in a new testament

- Mark 2:13-18 We see Jesus in 3 situations, questioned!
- Jesus recruits Levi/Matthew as a disciple
 Matthew 18:17
- Jesus asked about religious disciplines/duties/fasting

[Mat 18:17 ESV] 17 If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church. And <u>if he refuses to</u> <u>listen even to the church, let him be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector</u>.

[Luk 18:11, 13 ESV] 11 The Pharisee, standing by himself, prayed thus: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. ... 13 But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!'

- 1. [Mar 2:16, 18, 24 And the scribes of the Pharisees, when they saw that he was eating with sinners and tax collectors, said to his disciples, "Why does he eat with tax collectors and sinners?"...
- 2. 18 Now John's disciples and the Pharisees were fasting. And people came and said to him, "Why do John's disciples and the disciples of the Pharisees fast, but your disciples do not fast?" ...
- 3. 24 And the Pharisees were saying to him, "Look, why are they doing what is not lawful on the Sabbath?"

Just looking to get Jesus! Only 1 chapter later! Chapter 1 no one mentioned a problem of healing on Sabbath

Mar 3:1-2 Again he entered the synagogue, and a man was there with a withered hand. 2 And they watched Jesus, to see whether he would heal him on the Sabbath,

so that they might accuse him.

Mar 3:5-6 And he looked around at them with anger, grieved at their hardness of heart, and said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." He stretched it out, and his hand was restored. 6 The Pharisees went out and immediately held counsel with the Herodians against him, how to destroy him.

Calling Matthew would've likely upset the Disciples!

The Fasting question upset the "people" as they were comparing their tests of self denial, to the disciples

"working on the Sabbath" invited accusations against Jesus' Jewishness! Jesus did NOT break the Law! The Pharisees elevated their tradition above the Law! Legalism


[1Co 10:31 ESV] 31 So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God.

A friend of Tax collectors and Sinners

- Tax collectors (publicans) were hated as collaborators!
- "Tax collectors and sinners", usually in that order
- Luke 7:34 The Son of Man has come eating and drinking, and you say, 'Look at him! A glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners!' 15:1-2, 18:11, 19:7, Matthew 21:31-32

The Prideful criticism of Jesus became a emblem of hope for ALL Sinners!!

[Mar 2:13 ESV] 13 He went out again beside the sea, and all the crowd was coming to him, and he was teaching them.

[Mar 2:14 ESV] 14 And as he passed by, he saw Levi the son of Alphaeus sitting at the tax booth, and he said to him, "Follow me." And he rose and followed him.

because of their skimming off the top, the tax collectors were well-to-do.

Mat 5:46 ESV] 46 For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Do not even the tax collectors do the same?

[Mat 9:10-11 ESV] 10 And as Jesus reclined at table in the house, **behold, many tax collectors and sinners came and were reclining with Jesus** and his disciples. 11 And when the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with **tax collectors and sinners**?"

[Mat 11:19 ESV] 19 The Son of Man came eating and drinking, and they say, 'Look at him! A glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners!' Yet wisdom is justified by her deeds."

(Matthew 21:31–32). "Truly I tell you, the tax collectors and the prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God ahead of you. For John came to you to show you the way of righteousness, and you did not believe him, but the tax collectors and the prostitutes did. And even after you saw this, you did not repent and believe him"

Phrase used 3x in 2 verses! "he was eating with sinners and tax collectors"

Mar 2:15-16 ESV] 15 And as he reclined at table in his house, <u>many tax</u> <u>collectors and sinners were reclining with Jesus</u> and his disciples, for there were many who followed him. 16 And the scribes of the Pharisees, when they saw that he was eating with <u>sinners and tax collectors</u>, said to his disciples, "Why does he eat with tax collectors and sinners?"

Luk 3:12 ESV] 12 **Tax collectors also came to be baptized** and said to him, "Teacher, what shall we do?"

[Luk 5:29-30 ESV] 29 And Levi made him a great feast in his house, and there was a large company of tax collectors and others reclining at table with them. 30 And the Pharisees and their scribes grumbled at his disciples, saying, "Why do you eat and drink with tax collectors and sinners?"

[Luk 7:29, 34 ESV] 29 (When all the people heard this, and the tax collectors too, they declared God just, having been baptized with the baptism of John, ... 34 The Son of Man has come eating and drinking, and you say, 'Look at him! A glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners!'

[Luk 15:1 ESV] 1 Now the <u>tax collectors and sinners</u> were all drawing near to hear him.

[Mat 9:11 ESV] 11 And when the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?"

[Mar 2:16 ESV] 16 And the scribes of the Pharisees, when they saw that he was eating with sinners and tax collectors, said to his disciples, "Why does he eat with tax collectors and sinners?"

[Luk 5:30 ESV] 30 And the Pharisees and their scribes grumbled at his disciples, saying, "Why do you eat and drink with tax collectors and sinners?"

[Luk 7:34, 39 ESV] 34 The Son of Man has come eating and drinking, and you say, 'Look at him! A glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners!' ... 39 Now when the Pharisee who had invited him saw this, he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet, he would have known who and what sort of woman this is who is touching him, for she is a sinner." woman brought an alabaster flask

[Luk 15:1-2 ESV] 1 Now the tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to hear him. 2 And the Pharisees and the scribes grumbled, saying, "This man receives sinners and eats with them." 3 Parables

[Luk 18:11 ESV] 11 The Pharisee, standing by himself, prayed thus: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector.

[Luk 19:7 ESV] 7 And when they saw it, they all grumbled, "He has gone in to be the guest of a man who is a sinner." Zacchaeus

Mat 21:31-32 Which of the two did the will of his father?" They said, "The first." Jesus said to them, "Truly, I say to you, the tax collectors and the prostitutes go into the kingdom of God before you. 32 For John came to you in the way of righteousness, and you did not believe him, but the tax collectors and the prostitutes believed him. And even when you saw it, you did not afterward change your minds and believe him.

Tax Collectors:

Tax Collectors were hated treasonous collaborators with Rome who got rich off their kinsmen, Yet...

- 1. **Matthew** (Levi) was called to be an Apostle! Mat 9:9-10 As Jesus passed on from there, he saw a man called **Matthew** sitting at the tax booth, and he said to him, "Follow me." And he rose and followed him. 10 And as **Jesus reclined at** table in the house, behold, many tax collectors and sinners came and were reclining with Jesus and his disciples. Mk.2:13-17, Mt.11:19
- 2. Zaccheus Repented and repaid! Luk 19:2, 8-10 And behold, there was a man named Zacchaeus. He was a chief tax collector and was rich. ... 8 And Zacchaeus stood and said to the Lord, "Behold, Lord, the half of my goods I give to the poor. And if I have defrauded anyone of anything, I restore it fourfold." 9 And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, since he also is a son of Abraham. 10 For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost."
- 3. The Pharisee and the Tax collector! Luk 18:9-13-14 But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' 14 I tell you, this man went down to his house justified, rather than the other. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted."
- **3 of our sweetest verses of hope for the Lost** are found in direct relation to Tax collectors being saved!

Luk 5:29, 31-32 And Levi made him a great feast in his house, and there was a large company of tax collectors and others reclining at table with them. ... 31 And Jesus answered them, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. 32 I have not come to call the righteous but sinners to repentance."

[Luk 7:29 ESV] 29 (When all the people heard this, and the tax collectors too, they declared God just, having been baptized with the baptism of John, **Mat 9:11-13** ESV] 11 And when the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" 12

But when he heard it, he said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. 13 **Go and learn what this means:** 'I desire mercy, and not sacrifice.' For I came not to call the righteous, but sinners."

<u>Samaritan's</u>: the Assyrian conquest of the Kingdom of Israel in 722 BC, called also the Assyrian Exile. This event marked a pivotal moment that led to the deportation of the Israelite elite and their replacement with foreign populations (2 Kings 17:24).

Jn.4 the Samaritan Woman, Adulteress

Luke 10:25-37 Parable of Good Samaritan

Luke 17:11-19 Only 1 of the 10 Lepers returned

[Mar 2:18 ESV] 18 Now John's disciples and the Pharisees were fasting. And people came and said to him, "Why do John's disciples and the disciples of the Pharisees fast, but your disciples do not fast?"

Idea 31:31-34, 36 ESV] 31 "Behold, the days are coming, declares the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah, 32 not like the covenant that I made with their fathers on the day when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt, my covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, declares the LORD. 33 For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, declares the LORD: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts. And I will be their God, and they shall be my people. 34 And no longer shall each one teach his neighbor and each his brother, saying, 'Know the LORD,' for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, declares the LORD. For I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more." ... 36 "If this fixed order departs from before me, declares the LORD, then shall the offspring of Israel cease from being a nation before me forever."

New Wine – Covenant in my blood! [1Co 11:25 In the same way also he took the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

New Covenant/TESTAMENT!

New Symbol - Circumcision - Baptism

New Clerics - Levites/Priests - Priesthood of Believers

New Sacrifice – Animals – Lamb of God, no more blood letting. Its Finished

New Gathering place – Temple/Synagogue – Churches All over the world, not just Jerusalem

New teaching - Old testament - New testament, Sermon on the Mount!

New Deliverer! Moses - Jesus! Heb.2-4

New food laws! Kosher – Anything with Thanksgiving! Peters Vision New day of Worship! Sabbath to Lords day! Saturday to Sonday, and Everyday worship!

New Law – not tablets of stone that crushed us but tables of heart! 2 Cor.3 Internal change over external conformity

[Jer 3:1, 6-11, 15 ESV] 1 "If a man divorces his wife and she goes from him and becomes another man's wife, will he return to her? Would not that land be greatly polluted? You have played the whore with many lovers; and would you return to me? declares the LORD. ... 6 The LORD said to me in the days of King Josiah: "Have you seen what she did, that faithless one, Israel, how she went up on every high hill and under every green tree, and there played the whore? 7 And I thought, 'After she has done all this she will return to me,' but she did not return, and her treacherous sister Judah saw it. 8 She saw that for all the

adulteries of that faithless one, Israel, I had sent her away with a decree of divorce. Yet her treacherous sister Judah did not fear, but she too went and played the whore. 9 Because she took her whoredom lightly, she polluted the land, committing adultery with stone and tree. 10 Yet for all this her treacherous sister Judah did not return to me with her whole heart, but in pretense, declares the LORD." 11 And the LORD said to me, "Faithless Israel has shown herself more righteous than treacherous Judah. ... 15 "'And I will give you shepherds after my own heart, who will feed you with knowledge and understanding.

[Mat 9:17 ESV] 17 Neither is new wine put into old wineskins. If it is, the skins burst and the wine is spilled and the skins are destroyed. But new wine is put into fresh wineskins, and so both are preserved."

[Luk 5:38-39 ESV] 38 But new wine must be put into fresh wineskins. 39 And no one after drinking old wine desires new, for he says, 'The old is good."

Mans Righteousness

[Mat 6:16, 18 ESV] 16 "And when you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. ... 18 that your fasting may not be seen by others but by your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

[Mat 23:5 ESV] 5 They do all their deeds to be seen by others. For they make their phylacteries broad and their fringes long,

[Luk 18:12 ESV] 12 I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I get.'

[Rom 10:3 ESV] 3 For, being ignorant of the righteousness of God, and seeking to establish their own, they did not submit to God's righteousness.

New/Old

We need more than a refreshed Old Testament, We need a complete Makeover, Transformation!

New patch on old cloth? <u>Isa 64:6</u> NIV All of us have become like one who is unclean, and <u>all our righteous acts are like filthy rags</u>; <u>we all shrivel up like a leaf</u>, and like the wind our sins sweep us away.

Wine? 1Cor.11 Lords supper! A new Covenant in my blood!

[Gen 3:21 ESV] 21 And the LORD God made for Adam and for his wife garments of skins and clothed them.

[Isa 61:10 ESV] 10 I will greatly rejoice in the LORD; my soul shall exult in my God, for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation; he has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decks himself like a priest with a beautiful headdress, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels. Eph.5

[Isa 64:6 ESV] 6 We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are <u>like a polluted garment</u>. We all fade like a leaf, and our iniquities, like

the wind, take us away.

[Zec 3:3 ESV] 3 Now Joshua was standing before the angel, <u>clothed with</u> <u>filthy garments</u>.

[Rev 3:17-18 ESV] 17 For you say, "I am rich, I have prospered, and I need nothing," not realizing that you are wretched, pitiable, poor, blind, and naked. 18 I counsel you to buy from me gold refined by fire, so that you may be rich, and white garments so that you may clothe yourself and the shame of your nakedness may not be seen, and salve to anoint your eyes, so that you may see.

[Rev 7:13 ESV] 13 Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, "Who are these, <u>clothed in white robes</u>, and from where have they come?"

A new covenant, he makes the first one obsolete

- Hebrews 7:11 set aside because of its weakness and uselessness
- Hebrews 8:13 Obsolete...ready to vanish away
- Hebrews 9:10 until the time of reformation

8:5 They serve a copy and shadow Heb. 4, 7, 8, 9, 10

Heb 4:9 So then, there remains a Sabbath rest for the people of God, (High Priest)

Heb.7:11 set aside because of its weakness and uselessness

Heb.8:13 Obsolete...ready to vanish away

Heb.9:10 until the time of reformation

Heb.10:10 He does away with the first in order to establish the second. 10 And by that will we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

Eph 2:15 by abolishing the law of commandments

Col 2:14, 20 by canceling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands

under a new covenant (Jer. 31:31–34; Ezek. 36:26–27; 2 Cor. 3:6; Heb. 8:8–13

Heb.4, 7, 8, 9, 10

[Heb 8:1-2, 5-8, 10, 13 ESV] 1 Now the point in what we are saying is this: we have such a

high priest, one who is seated at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in heaven, 2 a minister in the holy places, in the true tent that the Lord set up, not man. ... 5 <u>They serve a copy and shadow</u> of the heavenly things. For when Moses was about to erect the tent, he was instructed by God, saying, "See that you make everything according to the pattern that was shown you on the mountain." 6 But as it is, Christ has obtained a ministry that is as much more excellent than the old as the covenant he mediates is better, since it is enacted on better promises. 7 For if that first covenant had been faultless, there would have been no occasion to look for a second. 8 For he finds fault with them when he says: "Behold, the days are coming, declares the Lord, when I will establish a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah, ... 10 For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, declares the Lord: I will put my laws into their minds, and write them on their hearts, and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. ... 13 <u>In speaking of a new covenant, he makes the first one</u> obsolete. And what is becoming obsolete and growing old is ready to vanish away.

[Heb 7:11-12, 18-19 Now if perfection had been attainable through the Levitical priesthood (for under it the people received the law), what further need would there have been for another priest to arise after the order of Melchizedek, rather than one named after the order of Aaron? 12 For when there is a change in the priesthood, there is necessarily a change in the law as well. ... 18 For on the one hand, a former commandment is set aside because of its weakness and uselessness 19 (for the law made nothing perfect); but on the other hand, a better hope is introduced, through which we draw near to God.

[1Co 13:8 ESV] 8 Love never ends. As for prophecies, they will pass away; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will pass away.

[Heb 9:9-10 ESV] 9 (which is symbolic for the present age). According to this arrangement, gifts and sacrifices are offered that cannot perfect the conscience of the worshiper, 10 but deal only with food and drink and various washings,

regulations for the body imposed <u>until the time of reformation</u>.

[Eph 2:15 ESV] 15 by <u>abolishing the law of commandments</u> expressed in ordinances, that he might create in himself one new man in place of the two, so making peace,

[Gal 3:10 ESV] 10 For all who rely on works of the law are under a curse; for it is written, "Cursed be everyone who does not abide by all things written in the Book of the Law, and do them."



It was before your eyes that Jesus Christ was publicly portrayed as crucified. 2 Let me ask you only this: Did you receive the Spirit by works of the law or by hearing with faith? 3 Are you so foolish? Having begun by the Spirit, are you now being perfected by the flesh? 4 Did you suffer so many things in vain--if indeed it was in vain? 5 Does he who supplies the Spirit to you and works miracles among you do so by works of the law, or by hearing with faith-- 6 just as Abraham "believed God, and it was counted to him as righteousness"? 7 Know then that it is those of faith who are the sons of Abraham. ... 10 For all who rely on works of the law are under a curse; for it is written, "Cursed be everyone who does not abide by all things written in the Book of the Law, and do them." 11 Now it is evident that no one is justified before God by the law, for "The righteous shall live by faith." 12 But the law is not of faith, rather "The one who does them shall live by them." ... 15 To give a human example, brothers: even with a manmade covenant, no one annuls it or adds to it once it has been ratified. 16 Now the promises were made to Abraham and to his offspring. It does not say, "And to offsprings," referring to many, but referring to one, "And to your offspring," who is Christ. 17 This is what I mean: the law, which came 430 years afterward, does not annul a covenant previously ratified by God, so as to make the promise void. 18 For if the inheritance comes by the law, it no longer comes by promise; but God gave it to Abraham by a promise. 19 Why then the law? It was added because of transgressions, until the offspring should come to whom the promise had been made, and it was put in place through angels by an intermediary. ... 21 Is the law then contrary to the promises of God? Certainly not! For if a law had been given that could give life, then righteousness would indeed be by the law. 22 But the Scripture imprisoned everything under sin, so that the promise by faith in Jesus Christ might be given to those who believe. 23 Now before faith came, we were held captive under the law, imprisoned until the coming faith would be revealed. 24 So then, the law was our guardian until Christ came, in order that we might be justified by faith. 25 But now that faith has come, we are no longer under a guardian, 26 for in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith. 27 For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. 28 There is





The "Messiah who breaks Sabbath" idea is explored by the Messianic Jewish organization First Fruits of Zion (FFOZ), which argues that Jesus did not abolish the Sabbath but rather redefined its purpose. According to FFOZ, Jesus challenged the rigid, legalistic interpretation of Sabbath laws by prioritizing acts of mercy, compassion, and healing. This is based on the principle that "the Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath" and that "the Son of Man is Lord of the Sabbath". Therefore, instead of being a Sabbath-breaker, Jesus was seen as justifying his actions by a higher principle of love and the need to alleviate suffering.

Tax Collectors were hated treasonous collaborators with Rome who got rich off their kinsmen, Yet...







A well-known example is the dinner, Simon, in <u>Luke 7</u>, where a sinful woman washes Jesus' feet, leading to a lesson on forgiveness and love. <u>Another account in Luke 14 describes Jesus teaching about humility</u> and who to invite to feasts.

[Luk 7:36-40, 42-45, 47-49 ESV] 36 One of the Pharisees asked him to eat with him, and he went into the Pharisee's house and reclined at table. 37 And behold, a woman of the city, who was a sinner, when she learned that he was reclining at table in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster flask of ointment, 38 and standing behind him at his feet, weeping, she began to wet his feet with her tears and wiped them with the hair of her head and kissed his feet and anointed them with the ointment. 39 Now when the Pharisee who had invited him saw this, he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet, he would have known who and what sort of woman this is who is touching him, for she is a sinner." 40 And Jesus answering said to him, "Simon, I have something to say to you." And he answered, "Say it, Teacher." ... 42 When they could not pay, he cancelled the debt of both. Now which of them will love him more?" 43 Simon answered, "The one, I suppose, for whom he cancelled the larger debt." And he said to him, "You have judged rightly." 44 Then turning toward the woman he said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I entered your house; you gave me no water for my feet, but she has wet my feet with her tears and wiped them with her hair. 45 You gave me no kiss, but from the time I came in she has not ceased to kiss my feet. ... 47 Therefore I tell you, her sins, which are many, are forgiven--for she loved much. But he who is forgiven little, loves little." 48 And he said to her, "Your sins are forgiven." 49 Then those who were at table with him began to say among themselves, "Who is this, who even forgives sins?"

[Luk 11:37-38, 42, 53-54 ESV] 37 While Jesus was speaking, a Pharisee asked him to dine with him, so he went in and reclined at table. 38 The Pharisee was astonished to see that he did not first wash before dinner. ... 42 "But woe to you Pharisees! For you tithe mint and rue and every herb, and neglect justice and the love of God. These you ought to have done, without neglecting the others. ... 53 As he went away from there, the scribes and the Pharisees began to press him hard and to provoke him to speak about many things, 54 lying in wait for him, to catch him in something he might say.

[Luk 14:1-6 ESV] 1 One Sabbath, when he went to dine at the house of a ruler of the Pharisees, they were watching him carefully. 2 And behold, there was a man before him who had dropsy. 3 And Jesus responded to the lawyers and Pharisees, saying, "Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath, or not?" 4 But they remained silent. Then he took him and healed him and sent him away. 5 And he said to them, "Which of you, having a son or an ox that has fallen into a well on a Sabbath day, will not immediately pull him out?" 6 And they could not reply to these things. 14:1-33

[Mar 7:6-11, 13 ESV] 6 And he said to them, "Well did Isaiah prophesy of you hypocrites, as it is written, "'This people honors me with their lips, but their heart is far from me; 7 in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines the commandments of men.' 8 You leave the commandment of God and hold to the tradition of men." 9 And he said to them, "You have a fine way of rejecting the commandment of God in order to establish your tradition! 10 For Moses said, 'Honor your father and your mother'; and, 'Whoever reviles father or mother must surely die.' 11 But you say, 'If a man tells his father or his mother, "Whatever you would have gained from me is Corban" (that is, given to God)-- ... 13 thus making void the word of God by your tradition that you have handed down. And many such things you do."

Nicodemus was a Pharisee who rightly considered Jesus "a teacher who has come from God" and honestly sought answers from Him (John 3:1–2). Nicodemus later defended Jesus before the Sanhedrin (John 7:50–51) and was on hand at Jesus' crucifixion to help bury the Lord's body (John 19:39). Some of

the early Christians were Pharisees, as well (Acts 15:5).

[Mat 27:57 ESV] 57 When it was evening, there came <u>a rich man from</u> **Arimathea**, named Joseph, who also was a disciple of Jesus.

[Mar 15:43 ESV] 43 <u>Joseph of Arimathea</u>, a <u>respected member of the</u> <u>council</u>, who was also himself looking for the kingdom of God, took courage and went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus.


[Luk 23:50 ESV] 50 Now there was a man named <u>Joseph, from the Jewish</u> town of Arimathea. He was a member of the council, a good and righteous man,

[Jhn 19:38 ESV] 38 After these things <u>Joseph of Arimathea</u>, who was a <u>disciple of Jesus</u>, but secretly for fear of the Jews, asked Pilate that he might take away the body of Jesus, and Pilate gave him permission. So he came and took away his body.

The apostle Paul was trained as a Pharisee, and his credentials in that group were sterling (Acts 26:5). Paul called himself "a Hebrew of Hebrews; in regard to the law, a Pharisee; as for zeal, persecuting the church; as for righteousness based on the law, faultless" (Philippians 3:5–6).

New Wineskin, Old Wineskin...What's the Difference?


Made from cleaned animal hides (skins -often goat), wineskins were used for carrying wine offerings, for travel and for storing new wine. As the wine inside continued to ferment, the skin would stretch to the point of losing its elasticity. If new wine was stored in an old skin, the skin would often burst from the pressure.


Grapes + Fermentation = Wine

- Skins of grapes already have yeast growing on them.
- As grapes are crushed, juice begins fermenting spontaneously.
- Yeast turns the natural sugars in the grape juice into alcohol and carbon dioxide.
- Fermentation process often continues after the wine has been stored in the wineskin.
- The release of the carbon dioxide causes the wineskins to expand.

- Wineskins are made from animal hide or bladders
- It is not known when the wineskin was invented, but are some of the oldest known containers for wine
- Wineskins were seen as useful, durable containers
