

Jesus allowed them to beat Him! Jhn 19:1 So Pilate then took Jesus and had Him flogged.

[Jhn 10:17-18 NASB20] 17 "For this reason the Father loves Me, because <u>I lay down</u> <u>My life so that I may take it back. 18 "No one has taken it away from Me, but I lay</u> <u>it down on My own. I have authority to lay it down, and I have authority to take it</u> <u>back</u>. This commandment I received from My Father."

[Mat 27:26 NASB20] 26 Then he released Barabbas for them; but after having Jesus flogged, he handed Him over to be crucified.

[Mar 15:15 NASB20] 15 Intent on satisfying the crowd, Pilate released Barabbas for them, and after having Jesus flogged, he handed Him over to be crucified.

[Luk 23:16, 23 NASB20] 16 "**Therefore I will punish Him** <u>and release Him</u>." ... 23 But they were insistent, with loud voices, demanding that He be crucified. And their voices [began] to prevail.

[Isa 50:6 NASB20] 6 <u>I gave My back to those who strike [Me,] And My cheeks to</u> <u>those who pull out My beard; I did not hide My face from insults and spitting</u>. [Psa 129:3 NASB20] 3 "<u>The plowers plowed upon my back; They lengthened their</u> <u>furrows</u>." [Isa 53:5 NASB20] 5 **But He was pierced for our offenses, He was crushed for our wrongdoings**; The punishment for our well-being [was laid] upon Him, And by His wounds we are healed.

[Mat 20:19 NASB20] 19 and they will hand Him over to the Gentiles to mock and flog and crucify, and on the third day He will be raised up."


[Mat 23:34 NASB20] 34 "Therefore, behold, I am sending you prophets and wise men and scribes; some of them you will kill and crucify, and some of them you will flog in your synagogues, and persecute from city to city,

[Mar 10:33-34 NASB20] 33 [saying,] "Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be handed over to the chief priests and the scribes; and they will condemn Him to death and will hand Him over to the Gentiles. 34 "And they will mock Him and spit on Him, and flog Him and kill [Him;] and three days later He will rise [from the dead.]"

[Luk 18:33 NASB20] 33 and after they have flogged Him, they will kill Him; and on the third day He will rise."

[2Co 11:24 NASB20] 24 **Five times I received from the Jews thirty-nine [lashes.]** [Heb 11:36 NASB20] 36 and others experienced mocking and flogging, and further, chains and imprisonment.

[1Pe 2:24 NASB20] 24 and He Himself brought our sins in His body up on the cross, so that we might die to sin and live for righteousness; by His wounds you were healed.



Then they often put Salt on the open wounds!

Pilate's perilous predicament

- Pilate knew the Sanhedrin's motives
 - Because of Envy! Mt 27:18-19, Mk 15:10
- Pilate declared Jesus innocent 3x!!!
 - I find in him no fault [at all], 18:38 (KJV)
 - I find no fault in him 19:4
 - For I find no fault in him 19:6; Mt 27:23-24; Jn 19:12
- Pilate tried at 4x to let Jesus go 19:8, 10, 12

The Unavoidable Ultimatum!

What you do with Jesus determines eternity!

[Mat 12:30 NASB20] 30 "The one who is not with Me is against Me; and the one who does not gather with Me scatters.

Pilate was historically and biblically a Violent, oppressive murderous man! Luk 13:1 Now on that very occasion there were some present who reported to Him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mixed with their sacrifices.

<u>Pilate was doing his job and had this dilemma thrust upon him</u>! He didn't ask for this or want it! He isn't a nice guy nor is he innocent but here's the thing! We all must make a judgment about Jesus Christ! He made us for Himself and He is God and we must decide what relationship we want with Him!

<u>Pilates perilous predicament is now yours too! [Act 13:46 NASB20] 46 Paul and</u> <u>Barnabas spoke out boldly and said, "It was necessary that the word of God be</u> <u>spoken to you first. Since you repudiate it and consider yourselves unworthy of</u> <u>eternal life, behold, we are turning to the Gentiles.</u>

2Th 1:8-9 in flaming fire, dealing out retribution to those who do not know God, and to those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus. 9 These people will

pay the penalty of eternal destruction, away from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of His power,

No Fault/<u>Guilt</u>/Reason/Cause/Crime/<u>Grounds</u>

[Mat 19:3 NASB20] 3 [Some] Pharisees came to Jesus, testing Him and asking, "Is it lawful [for a man] to divorce his wife for any reason[G156] [at all?]"

[Mat 27:37 NASB20] 37 And above His head they put up the charge[G156] against[G156] Him which read, "THIS IS JESUS THE KING OF THE JEWS."

[Act 13:28 NASB20] 28 "And though they found no grounds[G156] for [putting Him to] death, they asked Pilate that He be executed.

Mat 27:23-24 But he said, "<u>Why, what evil has He done?</u>" Yet they kept shouting all the more, saying, "Crucify Him!" 24 Now when Pilate saw that he was accomplishing nothing, but rather that <u>a riot was starting</u>, he took water and washed his hands in front of the crowd, saying, "I am innocent of this Man's blood; you yourselves shall see."

Jhn 19:12 As a result of this, <u>Pilate made efforts to release Him; but the Jews</u> <u>shouted, saying, "If you release this Man, you are not a friend of Caesar; everyone</u> <u>who makes himself [out to be] a king opposes Caesar</u>!"

[Jhn 18:38 KJV] 38 Pilate saith unto him, What is truth? And when he had said this, he went out again unto the Jews, and saith unto them, <u>I find in him no fault [at all].</u> [Jhn 19:4, 6 NASB20] 4 And [then] Pilate came out again and said to them, "See, I am bringing Him out to you so that you will know that <u>I find no grounds at all for charges</u> <u>in His case</u>." ... 6 So when the chief priests and the officers saw Him, they shouted, saying, "Crucify, crucify!" Pilate said to them, "Take Him yourselves and crucify [Him;] for <u>I find no grounds for charges in His case!</u>"

Pilate tried at least 3x to let Jesus go

- Pilate determined this was a local, non executable matter and goes to Herod. Lk.23:1-7
- 2. Pilate flogged Jesus to appease a growing riot and to satisfy their bloodlust. But they were riled up to cry Crucify Him! Lk.23:11-17, 20-24
- 3. After offering a choice of Barabbas and having flogged Jesus, Pilate says He still has the authority to release Jesus! Pilate was MORE AFRAID!
- 4. Pilates wife had a Dream and pleaded with Him and Jesus did NOT!!! How strange!!!
- 5. Pilate presented Jesus to the People yet again, after all the above, trying to argue on Jesus behalf?

Pilate *said to them, "**Behold**, <u>the Man</u>!" 19:5, 7. What is significant about this? *Pilate* *said to them, "**Look**, <u>your King</u>!" 19:14

Pilate *said to them, "Shall I crucify your King?" 19:15 The chief priests answered, "We have no king except Caesar."

Pilate Knowingly/admittedly Crucified an innocent man!!!

[Psa 129:3 NASB20] 3 "The plowers plowed upon my back; They lengthened their furrows."

[Isa 53:5 NASB20] 5 But He was pierced for our offenses, He was crushed for our wrongdoings; The punishment for our well-being [was laid] upon Him, And by His wounds we are healed.

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[Mar 10:33-34 NASB20] 33 [saying,] "Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be handed over to the chief priests and the scribes; and they will condemn Him to death and will hand Him over to the Gentiles. 34 "And they will mock Him and spit on Him, and flog Him and kill [Him;] and three days later He will rise [from the dead.]"

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[1Pe 2:24 NASB20] 24 and He Himself brought our sins in His body up on the cross, so that we might die to sin and live for righteousness; by His wounds you were healed.

[Mar 15:10 NASB20] 10 For he was aware that the chief priests had handed Him over because of envy.

[Act 5:17 NASB20] 17 But the high priest stood up, along with all his associates (that is the sect of the Sadducees), and they were filled with jealousy.

[Act 13:45 NASB20] 45 But when the Jews saw the crowds, they were filled with jealousy and [began] contradicting the things spoken by Paul, and were blaspheming.

[Jas 4:5 NASB20] 5 Or do you think that the Scripture says to no purpose, "He jealously desires the Spirit whom He has made to dwell in us"?

Ancient historians report that the Roman governor Pontius Pilate clashed with the Jewish population on several sensitive issues. One such conflict involved bringing to the holy city, Jerusalem, the military standards featuring the image of the emperor. Because of political and religious problems, Judea, from the Rom. point of view, was a difficult province to govern. Pilate outraged the Jews by sending soldiers into Jerusalem with Rom. military standards bearing emblems that the Jews regarded as idolatrous.

This had been attempted before, and the Jewish opposition was so strong that the Rom. authorities removed the offensive insignia from standards that were carried into the city of Jerusalem. When Pilate reversed this policy he met with deter mined Jewish resistance, which he sought to overcome by threatening to kill the objectors. Finding them adamant in their opposition and not afraid to die, Pilate finally had to yield the point. This incident reveals poor judgment, stubbornness, and finally weakness on Pilate's part. Pilate fuither outraged the Jews by appropriating the *corban* money, or religious contributions from the Temple treasury, to finance the construction of an aqueduct, some twenty-five m. in length, to bring water to Jerusalem from the highlands S of the city. The Jews considered this action sacrilegious and reacted violently. Many rioters were killed by Pilate's soldiers. This may be the atrocity mentioned in Luke 13:1, 2.

Philo of Alexandria (quoting Agrippa I) says of Pilate in the *Legatio ad Gaium* (38), that the Jews

exasperated Pilate to the greatest possible degree, as he feared lest they might go on an embassy to the Emperor, and might impeach him with respect to other particulars of his government—his corruptions, his acts of insolence, his rapine, his habit of insulting people, his cruelty, and his continual murders of people untried and uncondemned, and his never-ending, gratuitous and most grievous inhumanity.


This appraisal of Pilate must be regarded as greatly exaggerated, as shown by the much more moderate tone of statements about Pilate in the NT. That he was able to continue in office as procurator of Judea for ten years would seem to indicate the extreme bias of Philo's words.

Pilate's political ruin came about through his own folly. A Samaritan put forth the claim that he knew where on top of Mt. Gerizim, Moses had hidden golden objects pertaining to the Tabernacle. This claim proceeded from ignorance and fanaticism, for Moses had never crossed the Jordan and thus could not have visited Mt. Gerizim. A large assembly of Samaritans, however, gathered at the base of the mountain, intending to climb to the summit to search for the alleged treasures. Foolishly they were armed with weapons which Pilate interpreted as a threatened insurrection. Many of the Samaritans were killed by Pilate's soldiers. The Mt. Gerizim affair, however, was a mere passing incident and certainly no real threat to Rom. rule in Pal. Pilate had killed so many people that the Samaritans filed a complaint with Pilate's superior, Vitellius, the Rom. governor of Syria. Vitellius deposed Pilate as procurator of Judea and ordered him to Rome for the judgment of the emperor on his rash conduct in the Gerizim affair. This ended Pilate's ten years as procurator.

The emperor Tiberius died 16 March a.d. 37, before Pilate's arrival in Rome. Apparently Pilate escaped trial because of the emperor's death. All accounts of Pilate after his arrival at Rome are of late date and are considered doubtful and legendary by historians. The common story is that he was banished to the city of Vienne in Gaul where he eventually committed suicide. This is found in Eusebius (HE, ii. 7). According to another story, Pilate was beheaded by order of Tiberius, but repented before his execution. The spurious book *Acta Pilati* (dating from the 4th or 5th cent. a.d.) clears Pilate of all blame, and even represents him as confessing that Jesus is the [[Son of God]] (ch. 46). Other books entitled *Acta Pilati* are extant, which differ among themselves, and all of which are spurious. One legend claims that Pilate's wife became a Christian. The [[Coptic Church]] is said to observe June 25 as a day honoring Pilate as a saint and martyr (A. Souter in HDCG, ii, 366). This idea lacks historical basis. It is much more likely that Pilate committed suicide, but this also cannot be proved.



The punishment for Blasphemy was Stoning!


[Lev 24:10-11, 14-16 NASB20] 10 Now the son of an Israelite woman--his father was an Egyptian--went out among the sons of Israel; and the Israelite woman's son and an Israelite man had a fight within the camp. 11 And the son of the Israelite woman blasphemed the Name and cursed. So they brought him to Moses. (Now his mother's name was Shelomith, the daughter of Dibri, of the tribe of Dan.) ... 14 "Bring the one who has cursed outside the camp, and have all who heard him lay their hands on his head; then have all the congregation stone him. 15 "You shall also speak to the sons of Israel, saying, 'If anyone curses his God, then he will bear [the responsibility for] his sin. 16 'Moreover, the one who blasphemes the name of the LORD must be put to death; all the congregation shall certainly stone him. The stranger as well as the native, when he blasphemes the Name, shall be put to death.

[1Ki 21:10, 13 NASB20] 10 and seat two worthless men opposite him, and have them testify against him, saying, 'You cursed God and the king.' Then take him out and stone him to death." ... 13 Then the two worthless men came in and sat opposite him; and the worthless men testified against him, against Naboth, before the people, saying, "Naboth cursed God and the king." So they took him outside the city and stoned him to death with stones.

[Jhn 8:58-59 NASB20] 58 Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly I say to you, before Abraham

was born, I am." 59 Therefore they picked up stones to throw at Him, but Jesus hid Himself and left the temple [grounds.]

[Jhn 10:33 NASB20] 33 The Jews answered Him, "We are not stoning You for a good work, but for blasphemy; and because You, being a man, make Yourself [out to be] God."



Wasn't Crucifixion enough? That alone was cruel, brutal and would've made most of us vomit and pass out! Why all this? Mankind Hates God! Make NO mistake about it!

[2Co 11:24 NASB20] 24 Five times I received from the Jews thirty-nine [lashes.]

(Apostle Paul)!!!

[2Co 11:23-25 NASB20] 23 Are they servants of Christ?--I am speaking as if insane--I more so; in far more labors, in far more imprisonments, beaten times without number, often in [danger of] death. 24 Five times I received from the Jews thirtynine [lashes.] 25 Three times I was beaten with rods, once I was stoned, three times I was shipwrecked, a night and a day I have spent [adrift] at sea. [Gal 6:17 NASB20] 17 From now on let no one cause trouble for me, for I bear on my body the marks of Jesus.

[Gen 3:14, 17-19 Then the LORD God said to the serpent, "**Because you have done this**, **Cursed are you** more than all the livestock, And more than any animal of the field; On your belly you shall go, And dust you shall eat All the days of your life; ... 17 Then to Adam He said, "Because you have listened to the voice of your wife, and have eaten from the tree about which I commanded you, saying, 'You shall not eat from it'; <u>Cursed is the ground because of you; With hard labor you shall eat [from] it All the days of your life. 18 "Both thorns and thistles it shall grow for you; Yet you shall eat the plants of the field; 19 By the sweat of your face You shall eat bread, Until you return to the ground, Because from it you were taken; For you are dust, And to dust you shall return."</u>

[Exo 20:5 "You shall not worship them nor serve them; for I, <u>the LORD your God, am a</u> jealous God, inflicting the punishment of the fathers on the children, on the third and the fourth generations of those who hate Me,

[Deu 5:9 NASB20] 9 'You shall not worship them nor serve them; for I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, inflicting the punishment of the fathers on the children, even on the third and fourth [generations] of those who hate Me,




[2Ti 3:4 NASB20] 4 treacherous, reckless, conceited, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God,

Strange bedfellows! Pharisees and Sadducees, Jews and Romans!

[Luk 23:12 NASB20] 12 And [**so] Herod and Pilate became friends with one another that very day; for previously, they had been enemies toward each other**. [Act 4:25-27 NASB20] 25 who by the Holy Spirit, [through] the mouth of our father David Your servant, said, 'WHY WERE THE NATIONS INSOLENT, AND <u>THE PEOPLES</u> **PLOTTING IN VAIN? 26 'THE KINGS OF THE EARTH TOOK THEIR STAND, AND THE RULERS WERE GATHERED TOGETHER AGAINST THE LORD AND AGAINST HIS CHRIST.' 27 "For truly in this city there were gathered together against Your holy servant Jesus, whom You anointed, both Herod and Pontius Pilate, along with the Gentiles and the peoples of Israel**,

[Mat 16:1 NASB20] 1 **The Pharisees and Sadducees came up, and putting [Jesus] to the test**, they asked Him to show them a sign from heaven.

[Mar 15:1 NIV] 1 Very early in the morning, <u>the chief priests, with the elders, the</u> <u>teachers of the law and the whole Sanhedrin, made their plans. So they bound</u> <u>Jesus, led him away and handed him over to Pilate</u>.

[Jhn 18:31 NASB20] 31 So **Pilate said to them, "Take Him yourselves, and judge Him according to your law." The Jews said to him, "We are not permitted to put**

anyone to death."

[Jhn 19:7 NASB20] 7 The Jews answered him, "We have a law, and by that law He ought to die, **because He made Himself [out to be] the Son of God**!"

Joh 5:18 Therefore the Jews sought the more to kill him, because he not only had broken the sabbath, but said also that God was his Father, making himself equal with God. Joh 7:30 Then they sought to take him: but no man laid hands on him, because his hour was not yet come.

Joh 7:44 And some of them would have taken him; but no man laid hands on him.

Joh 8:20 These words spake Jesus in the treasury, as he taught in the temple: and no man laid hands on him; for his hour was not yet come.

Joh 8:37 I know that ye are Abraham's seed; but ye seek to kill me, because my word hath no place in you.

Joh 8:40 But now ye seek to kill me, a man that hath told you the truth, which I have heard of God: this did not Abraham.

Joh 8:59 **Then took they up stones to cast at him**: but Jesus hid himself, and went out of the temple, going through the midst of them, and so passed by.

Joh 10:31 Then the Jews took up stones again to stone him.

Joh 10:39 ¶ Therefore they sought again to take him: but he escaped out of their hand,

Joh 11:8 His disciples say unto him, Master, the Jews of late sought to stone thee; and goest thou thither again?

Joh 11:53 Then from that day forth they took counsel together for to put him to death. 54 Jesus therefore walked no more openly among the Jews;

[Jhn 18:19-23, 29-38 The high priest then questioned Jesus about His disciples, and about His teaching. 20 Jesus answered him, "I have spoken openly to the world; I always taught in synagogues and in the temple [area,] where all the Jews congregate; and I said nothing in secret. 21 "Why are you asking Me? Ask those who have heard what I spoke to them. Look: these people know what I said." 22 But when He said this, one of the officers, who was standing nearby, struck Jesus, saying, "Is that the way You answer the high priest?" 23 Jesus answered him, "If I have spoken wrongly, testify of the wrong; but if rightly, why do you strike Me?" ... 29 Therefore Pilate came out to them and said, "What accusation are you bringing against this Man?" 30 They answered and said to him, "If this Man were not a criminal, we would not have handed Him over to you." 31 So Pilate said to them, "Take Him yourselves, and judge Him according to your law." Your own nation and the chief priests handed You over to me; what have You done?" 36 Jesus answered, "My kingdom is not of this world. If My kingdom were of this world, My servants would be fighting so that I would not be handed over to the Jews; but as it is, My kingdom is not of this realm." 37 Therefore Pilate said to Him, "So You are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say [correctly] that I am a king. For this [purpose] I have been born, and for this I have come into the world: to testify to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth listens to My voice." 38 Pilate said to Him, "What is truth?" And after saying this, he came out again to the Jews and said to them, "I find no grounds at all for charges in His case.

[Mat 27:11 NASB20] 11 Now Jesus stood before the governor, and the governor questioned Him, saying, **"[So] You are the King of the Jews?" And Jesus said to him, "[It is as] you say."**

[Mar 15:2 NASB20] 2 Pilate questioned Him: "[So] You are the King of the Jews?" And He answered him, "[It is as] you say."

[Luk 23:3 NASB20] 3 Now Pilate asked Him, saying, "[So] You are the King of the Jews?" And He answered him and said, "[It is as] you say."

[Jhn 18:33, 37 NASB20] 33 Therefore Pilate entered the Praetorium again, and summoned Jesus and said to Him, "You are the King of the Jews?" ... 37 Therefore Pilate said to Him, "So You are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say [correctly] that I am a king. For this [purpose] I have been born, and for this I have come into the world: to testify to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth listens to My voice." [Jhn 19:8-12 NASB20] 8 Therefore when Pilate heard this statement, he was [even] more afraid; 9 and he entered the Praetorium again and said to Jesus, "Where are You from?" But Jesus gave him no answer. 10 So Pilate said to Him, "Are you not speaking to me? Do You not know that I have authority to release You, and I have authority to crucify You?" 11 Jesus answered him, "You would have no authority over Me at all, if it had not been given to you from above; for this reason the one who handed Me over to you has [the] greater sin." 12 As a result of this, Pilate made efforts to release Him; but the Jews shouted, saying, "If you release this Man, you are not a friend of Caesar; everyone who makes himself [out to be] a king opposes Caesar!"

Blasphemy...Treason against Rome/Caesar! Lk.23:1-7, Jn.19 Destroying the Temple

Mat 27:11-15, 17-25 NASB20] 11 Now Jesus stood before the governor, and the governor questioned Him, saying, "[So] You are the King of the Jews?" And Jesus said to him, "[It is as] you say." 12 And while He was being accused by the chief priests and elders, He did not offer any answer. 13 Then Pilate said to Him, "Do You not hear how many things they are testifying against You?" 14 And [still] He did not answer him in regard to even a single charge, so the governor was greatly amazed. 15 Now at [the Passover] Feast the governor was accustomed to release for the people [any] one prisoner whom they wanted. ... 17 So when the people gathered together, Pilate said to them, "Whom do you want me to release for you: Barabbas, or Jesus who is called Christ?" 18 For he knew that [it was] because of envy [that] they had handed Him over. 19 And while he was sitting on the judgment seat, his wife sent him [a message,] saying, "[See that you have] nothing [to

do] with that righteous Man; for last night I suffered greatly in a dream because of Him." 20 But the chief priests and the elders persuaded the crowds to ask for Barabbas, and to put Jesus to death. 21 And the governor said to them, "Which of the two do you want me to release for you?" And they said, "Barabbas." 22 Pilate said to them, "Then what shall I do with Jesus who is called Christ?" They all said, "Crucify Him!" 23 But he said, "Why, what evil has He done?" Yet they kept shouting all the more, saying, "Crucify Him!" 24 Now when Pilate saw that he was accomplishing nothing, but rather that a riot was starting, he took water and washed his hands in front of the crowd, saying, "I am innocent of this Man's blood; you yourselves shall see." 25 And all the people replied, "His blood [shall be] on us and on our children!"

[Mar 14:60-62 KJV] 60 And the high priest stood up in the midst, and asked Jesus, saying, Answerest thou nothing? what [is it which] these witness against thee? 61 But he held his peace, and answered nothing. Again the high priest asked him, and said unto him, **Art thou the Christ, the Son of the Blessed? 62 And Jesus said, I am: and ye shall see the Son of man sitting on the right hand of power, and coming in the clouds of heaven**.

[Mar 15:9-14 KJV] 9 But Pilate answered them, saying, Will ye that I release unto you the King of the Jews? 10 For he knew that the chief priests had delivered him for envy. 11 But the chief priests moved the people, that he should rather release Barabbas unto them. 12 And Pilate answered and said again unto them, What will ye then that I shall do [unto him] whom ye call the King of the Jews? 13 And they cried out again, Crucify him. 14 Then Pilate said unto them, Why, what evil hath he done? And they cried out the more exceedingly, Crucify him.

[Luk 23:1-7 KJV] 1 And the whole multitude of them arose, and led him unto Pilate. 2 And they began to accuse him, saying, <u>We found this [fellow] perverting the nation,</u> <u>and forbidding to give tribute to Caesar, saying that he himself is Christ a King.</u> 3 And Pilate asked him, saying, Art thou the King of the Jews? And he answered him and said, Thou sayest [it]. 4 Then said Pilate to the chief priests and [to] the people, I find no fault in this man. 5 And they were the more fierce, saying, <u>He stirreth up the people,</u> <u>teaching throughout all Jewry, beginning from Galilee to this place</u>. 6 When Pilate heard of Galilee, he asked whether the man were a Galilaean. 7 And as soon as he knew that he belonged unto Herod's jurisdiction, he sent him to Herod, who himself also was at Jerusalem at that time.

Every one that is of the truth heareth my voice. 38 Pilate saith unto him, What is truth? And when he had said this, he went out again unto the Jews, and saith unto them, I find in him no fault [at all]. 39 But ye have a custom, that I should release unto you one at the passover: will ye therefore that I release unto you the King of the Jews? 40 Then cried they all again, saying, Not this man, but Barabbas. Now Barabbas was a robber.

[Jhn 19:4, 6 KJV] 4 Pilate therefore went forth again, and saith unto them, Behold, I bring him forth to you, that ye may know that I find no fault in him. ... 6 When the chief priests therefore and officers saw him, they cried out, saying, Crucify [him], crucify [him]. Pilate saith unto them, Take ye him, and crucify [him]: for I find no fault in him.





[Heb 2:1, 3, 5-18 For this reason we must pay much closer attention to what we have heard, so that we do not drift away [from it.] ... 3 how will we escape if we neglect so great a salvation? After it was at first spoken through the Lord, it was confirmed to us by those who heard, ... 5 For He did not subject to angels the world to come, about which we are speaking. 6 But someone has testified somewhere, saying, "WHAT IS MAN, THAT YOU THINK OF HIM? OR A SON OF MAN, THAT YOU ARE CONCERNED ABOUT HIM? 7 "YOU HAVE MADE HIM FOR A LITTLE WHILE LOWER THAN ANGELS; YOU HAVE CROWNED HIM WITH GLORY AND HONOR; 8 YOU HAVE PUT EVERYTHING IN SUBJECTION UNDER HIS FEET." For in subjecting all things to him, He left nothing that is not subject to him. But now we do not yet see all things subjected to him. 9 But we do see Him who was made for a little while lower than the angels, [namely,] Jesus, because of His suffering death crowned with glory and honor, so that by the grace of God He might taste death for everyone. 10 For it was fitting for **<u>Him</u>**, for whom are all things, and through whom are all things, in bringing many sons to glory, to perfect the originator of their salvation through sufferings. 11 For both He who sanctifies and those who are sanctified are all from one [Father;] for this reason He is not ashamed to call them brothers [and sisters,] 12 saying, "I WILL PROCLAIM YOUR NAME TO MY BROTHERS, IN THE MIDST OF THE ASSEMBLY I WILL SING YOUR



"THEY <u>CAST LOTS</u> FOR MY CLOTHING." How calloused and oblivious could these soldier be?!! Do not play games with Christ! Is trusting Jesus a gamble? No, but... Believing in Christ is not a roll of the dice! Put all your eggs in only 1 basket! All \$\$\$ on one spot Who has the most to lose? Who has the most proof!

Our faith is NOT blind! Its in a person! Its in His love!

We are saved by faith, not fact! Even the Devils believe and tremble! Heb.11, [Jas 2:19 NASB20] 19 You believe that God is one. You do well; the demons also believe, and shudder.

The Onus is ON US! One thing is certain! We will all die and our choices will have consequences in this life and the next!

In other words! Pascal was graciously trying to engage the atheistic skeptic **Eternity is not a game!** We ALL live by some measure of faith! Its ALL or nothing! You're playing for keeps! We are all in the game! It's a matter of Abundant and eternal Life or Death, the 2nd death in a lake of fire!

Go with the best Odds! Ask God for open eyes! Ask Him to save you from the deceitfulness of your own heart and the subjectiveness of your judgments. [1Pe 2:23 NASB20] 23 and while being abusively insulted, He did not insult in return; while suffering, He did not threaten, but kept entrusting [Himself] to Him who judges righteously;

In the book *Science Speaks*, Peter Stoner and Robert Newman discuss the statistical improbability of one man, whether accidentally or deliberately, fulfilling just eight of the prophecies Jesus fulfilled. The chance of this happening, they say, is 1 in 10¹⁷ power. Stoner presents a scenario that illustrates the magnitude of such odds:


Suppose that we take 10¹⁷ silver dollars and lay them on the face of Texas. They will cover all of the state two feet deep. Now mark one of these silver dollars and stir the whole mass thoroughly, all over the state. Blindfold a man and tell him that he can travel as far as he wishes, but he must pick up one silver dollar and say that this is the right one. What chance would he have of getting the right one? Just the same chance that the prophets would have had of writing these eight prophecies and having them all come true in any one man, from their day to the present time, providing they wrote using their own wisdom.

The mathematical improbability of 300, or 47, or even just eight fulfilled prophesies of Jesus stands as evidence to his messiahship.





[Isa 53:1-5 NASB20] 1 Who has believed our report? And to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed? 2 For He grew up before Him like a tender shoot, And like a root out of dry ground; He has no [stately] form or majesty That we would look at Him, Nor an appearance that we would take pleasure in Him. 3 He was despised and abandoned by men, A man of great pain and familiar with sickness; And like one from whom [people] hide their faces, He was despised, and we had no regard for Him. 4 However, [it was] our sicknesses [that] He Himself bore, And our pains [that] He carried; Yet we ourselves assumed that He had been afflicted, Struck down by God, and humiliated. 5 **But He was pierced for our offenses, He was crushed for our wrongdoings; The punishment for our well-being [was laid] upon Him, And by His wounds we are healed.**

[Gen 2:21-23 NASB20] 21 So the LORD God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; then **He took one of his ribs and closed up the flesh at that place**. 22 And the **LORD God fashioned into a woman the rib which He had taken from the man, and brought her to the man**. 23 Then the man said, "**At last this is bone of my bones**, And flesh of my flesh; She shall be called 'woman,' Because she was taken out of man."

Psa 69:20-21 **<u>Disgrace has broken my heart</u>**, and I am so sick. And I waited for sympathy, but there was none; And for comforters, but I found none. 21 They also gave me a bitter herb in my food, And for my thirst they gave me vinegar to drink.



3 Marys at the Cross! Why weren't they afraid? Where are the Disciples? Mary of Nazareth, Jesus' Mom must've had a different perspective. On this Mothers day, How would you have felt? Crucifixion typically resulted in death through one of two ways. The first way was hypovolemic shock. The prolonged rapid heartbeat resulting from hypovolemic shock can cause fluid to gather in the area around the heart. This is called pericardial effusion.

The second way death often occurred during crucifixion was due to asphyxiation. This simply means the person is unable to breathe in enough oxygen to survive. Crucifixion victims typically had to pull their weight up with their hands or wrists that were nailed to the crossbeam along with pushing up with the feet or ankles that had another nail through them. Over time, the ability to push up to breathe would end and oxygen flow would be restricted. This asphyxiation can also result in the buildup of fluid around the heart.

In either case, the account of John is quite accurate. The Roman executioners saw that the other two crucifixion victims were still alive and broke their legs so they would no longer be able to push themselves up to breathe, resulting in death within minutes. In the case of Jesus, they saw He had become unconscious and likely was already dead. To confirm, a spear was shoved into His side, likely under His ribs, that ruptured the pericardial sack, resulting in a flow of both blood and water.

While this manner of death was a brutal end for Jesus, there was also prophetic significance to this event. John states https://www.compellingtruth.org/blood-water-Jesus.html



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
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While this manner of death was a brutal end for Jesus, there was also prophetic significance to this event. John states in John 19:36-37, "For these things took place that the Scripture might be fulfilled: 'Not one of his bones will be broken.' And again another Scripture says, 'They will look on him whom they have pierced.'" The first reference is likely to Exodus 12:46. The second reference is from Zechariah 12:10. Both were written hundreds of years before this event.


In summary, there were both practical and prophetic reasons for the blood and water that flowed from the side of Jesus at His crucifixion. The pierced side confirmed His human death while also fulfilling the messianic prophecies mentioned by John.
