[Mat 14:5 ESV] 5 And though he wanted to put him to death, he feared the people, because they held him to be a prophet.


[Mat 21:26 ESV] 26 But if we say, 'From man,' we are afraid of the crowd, for they all hold that John was a prophet."

The first example occurs in <u>Genesis 3</u>, with <u>Adam</u> and <u>Eve</u> disobeying God and experiencing shame because of it.

Later, we see King David committing adultery and murder (2 Samuel 11–12) (Psalm 51)

Peter's betrayal of Christ (John 13:37–38; Luke 22:31–34) The apostle Peter denied Jesus three times, just as Jesus said he would (John 13:37–38; Luke 22:31–34). Peter's shame and regret after his third denial is clear when "he went out and wept bitterly" (Luke 22:61–62). Jesus's forgiveness of Peter is shown in His commissioning Peter to feed His sheep (John 21:15–19).

Bible Kings/Rulers: Many people misunderstand that some "Names" are Actually "Titles" of Kings!

<u>Pharaohs, Caesars (Julius!)(Augustus</u> and <u>Tiberius</u>, render to Caesar...<u>Claudius</u>, <u>Nero</u> executed Paul and Peter, Acts 25, 1Pet.), <u>Herod's</u> (The Great, Antipas) Abimelech's

Ramesses II (c. 1279–1213 BC): Ramesses II, or Ramesses the Great, is the most common figure for the Exodus pharaoh as Rameses is mentioned in the Bible as a place name (see Genesis 47:11, Exodus 1:11, Numbers 33:3, etc).

Later, named pharaohs like Necho (King Neco) and Hophra (Apries) appear in Kings and Jeremiah, with specific interactions with Israel and Judah, while Pharaohs of David's time (possibly Horemheb) and Solomon's (father-in-law) are also mentioned, often linked to historical figures like Ramesses II (Exodus) or Shishak (Shosheng I).





A Nagging Conscience!

- "John the Baptist has been raised from the dead"

 - John had been saying to Herod, "It is not lawful for you to have your brother's wife." (6:18, Leviticus 18:16, 20:21)
- A Nagging Wife! (6:19)

That is why these miraculous powers are at work in him." Mk.6:14

So why would Herod think John has Risen?

Jesus and John were linked in a few ways,

They both were Prophesied about,

Prophets were highly respectable because of their singular devotion and pure behaviors as Gods representatives!





 Luke 22:62)


How bad must Eve have felt for over 900 years as she watches her progeny spiral downward into sin? they were ashamed at their nakedness (Genesis 3:10).

Jhn 7:7 The world cannot hate you, but it hates me because I testify about it that its works are evil.





SYNOPSIS

Herod the Great, king of the holy land in the time of Christ, is best known for the Massacre of the Innocents: the Gospel of Matthew's apocryphal slaughter of Bethlehem's male infants. But Herod's bloody reputation has always hidden another side of one of the Bible's greatest villains. He was an architectural mastermind of breathtaking proportions. Herod built more and larger monuments than virtually anyone in ancient times, perhaps in all time. He certainly took Zerubbabel's Temple and enlarged it far beyond Solomons!, Even the Disciples bragged on it!

Paul stood on trial too!

- He shared his testimony: sin, shame and salvation
- Acts 26:27 "King Agrippa, do you believe the prophets? I know that you believe."
- Acts 26:28 And Agrippa said to Paul, "In a short time would you persuade me to be a Christian?"
- Paul was later executed, Agrippa was Condemned

[Act 24:14-16, 25-27 ESV] 14 But this I confess to you, that according to the Way, which they call a sect, I worship the God of our fathers, believing everything laid down by the Law and written in the Prophets, 15 having a hope in God, which these men themselves accept, that there will be a resurrection of both the just and the unjust. 16 So I always take pains to have a clear conscience toward both God and man. ... 25 And as he reasoned about righteousness and self-control and the coming judgment, Felix was alarmed and said, "Go away for the present. When I get an opportunity I will summon you." 26 At the same time he hoped that money would be given him by Paul. So he sent for him often and conversed with him. 27 When two years had elapsed, Felix was succeeded by Porcius Festus. And desiring to do the Jews a favor, Felix left Paul in prison.


[Act 26:6, 8, 11, 18, 21-23 ESV] 6 And now I stand here on trial because of my hope in the promise made by God to our fathers, ... 8 Why is it thought incredible by any of you that God raises the dead? ... 11 And I punished them often in all the synagogues and tried to make them blaspheme, and in raging fury against them I persecuted them even to foreign cities. ... 18 to open their eyes, so that they may turn from darkness to light and from the power of Satan to God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins and a place among those who are sanctified by faith in me.' ... 21 For this reason the Jews seized me in the temple and tried to kill me. 22 To this day I have had the help that comes from God, and so I stand here testifying both to small and great, saying nothing but what the prophets and Moses said would come to pass: 23 that the Christ must suffer and that, by being the first to rise from the dead, he would proclaim light both to our people and to the Gentiles."

[Act 26:24-27 ESV] 24 And as he was saying these things in his defense, Festus said with a loud voice,

"Paul, you are out of your mind; your great learning is driving you out of your mind." 25 But Paul said, "I am not out of my mind, most excellent Festus, but I am speaking true and rational words. 26 For the king knows about these things, and to him I speak boldly. For I am persuaded that none of these things has escaped his notice, for this has not been done in a corner. 27 King Agrippa, do you believe the prophets? I know that you believe."


[Act 26:30 ESV] 30 Then the king rose, and the governor and Bernice and those who were sitting with them.

[Act 26:31-32 ESV] 31 And when they had withdrawn, they said to one another, "This man is doing nothing to deserve death or imprisonment." 32 And Agrippa said to Festus, "This man could have been set free if he had not appealed to Caesar."

- Son of Antipater and Kypros
- Was an Edomite
- Appointed procurator of Judea by Julius Caesar
- Was advised by Antony and Octavian
- Made "King of the Jews" by Roman Senate in 40 or
- Was married 10 times
 - Doris
- Pallas • Phaedra
 - Mariamne I
 - Mariamne II • Elpis
 - Malthace • To a daughter of Salome
 - Cleopatra • To a niece
- A prolific builder
- Reconstructed the Temple at Jerusalem
- Was despised by the Jews
- Jesus was born shortly before Herod's death (Matthew 2:1) — "Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king behold there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem."
- Ordered the slaughter of the Jewish male babies (Matthew 2:16) - "Then Herod, when he saw tha was deceived by the wise men, was exceedingly angry; and he sent forth and put to death all the n children who were in Bethlehem and in all its distr from two years old and under, according to the tin which he had determined from the wise men."
















