What would it take for you to bring you to your knees before Jesus?

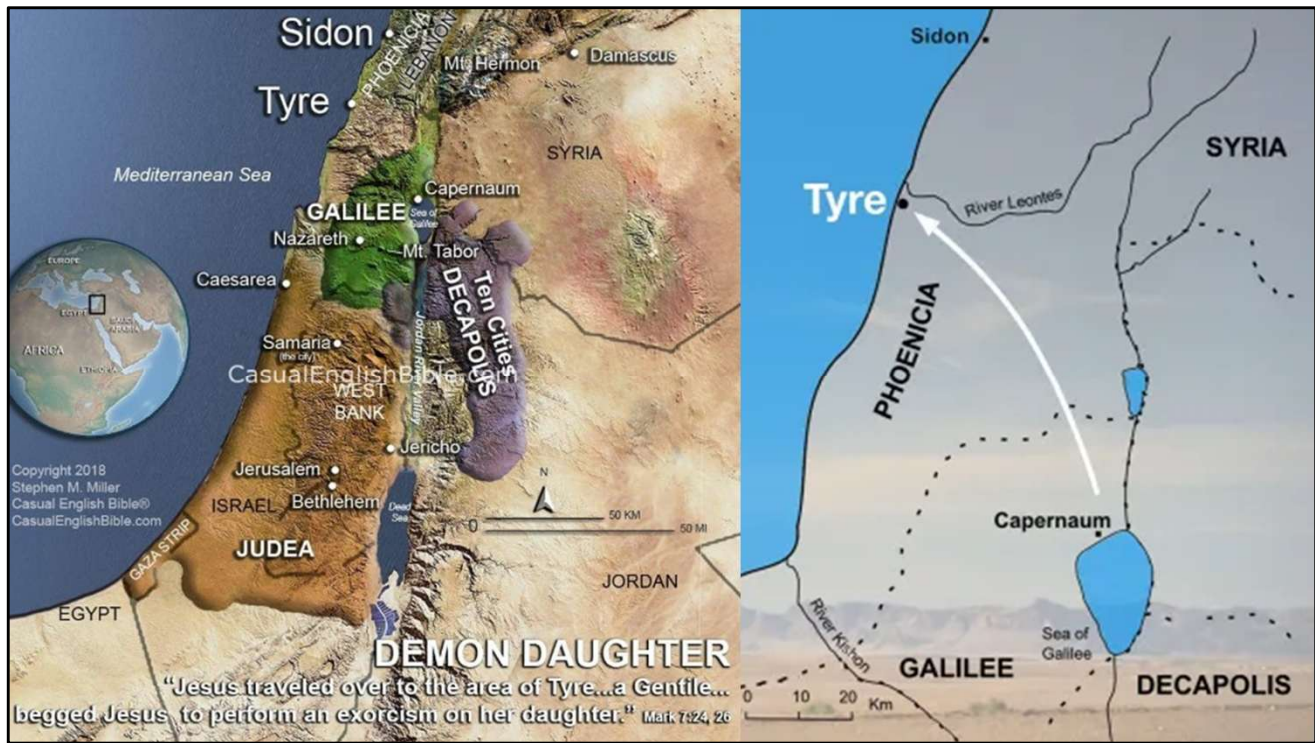
[Mar 7:24-37 ESV] 24 And from there he arose and went away to the region of Tyre and Sidon. And he entered a house and did not want anyone to know, yet he could not be hidden. 25 But immediately a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit heard of him and came and fell down at his feet. 26 Now the woman was a Gentile, a Syrophenician by birth. And she begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter. 27 And he said to her, "Let the children be fed first, for it is not right to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs." 28 But she answered him, "Yes, Lord; yet even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs." 29 And he said to her, "For this statement you may go your way; the demon has left your daughter." 30 And she went home and found the child lying in bed and the demon gone. 31 Then he returned from the region of Tyre and went through Sidon to the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. 32 And they brought to him a man who was deaf and had a speech impediment, and they begged him to lay his hand on him. 33 And taking him aside from the crowd privately, he put his fingers into his ears, and after spitting touched his tongue. 34 And looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." 35 And his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. 36 And Jesus charged them to tell no one. But the more he charged them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. 37 And they were astonished beyond measure, saying, "He has done all things well. He even makes the deaf hear and the mute speak."

Tyre and Sidon? Jesus left Israel!

- Roughly 35-50 miles from Galilee, in Phoenicia
- Tyre and Sidon, seats of enemy powers
- Sidon, Home of Jezebel, Baal worship
- Jesus said they were more receptive than Israel!
- Symbolic of Elijah's ministry, also rejected – 1 Kings 17, Luke 4

After the obstinate Jewish leaders, Some may have mistakenly thought he was ReTYREing?

After the early portion of Mark 7 where Jesus rebuked Pharisees, the best religious representatives of the chosen people!

roughly 35-50 miles from Galilee, Major Seaport cities

crowds from Tyre and Sidon came to see and listen to Him (Mark 3:7-8

Jesus mentions Tyre and Sidon in Luke 10:13-14 (see also Matthew 11:20-24), comparing them to several cities in which He had performed miracles

Elijah and Zarephath (1 Kings 17:8-24), Lk.4. 2 Kings 4:8-37 ESV - Elisha and the Shunammite Woman,

[Luk 4:24-26 ESV] 24 And he said, "Truly, I say to you, no prophet is acceptable in his hometown. 25 But in truth, I tell you, there were many widows in Israel in the days of Elijah, when the heavens were shut up three years and six months, and a great famine came over all the land, 26 and Elijah was sent to none of them but only to Zarephath, in the land of Sidon, to a woman who was a widow.

[1Ki 17:9, 12, 17-22 ESV] 9 "Arise, go to Zarephath, which belongs to Sidon, and dwell there. Behold, I have commanded a widow there to feed you." ... 12 And she said, "As the LORD your God lives, I have nothing baked, only a handful of flour in a jar and a little oil in a jug. And now I am gathering a couple of sticks that I may go in and prepare it for myself and my son, that we may eat it and die." ... 17 After this the son of the woman, the mistress of the house, became ill. And his illness was so severe that there was no breath left in him. 18 And she said to Elijah, "What have you against me, O man of God?"

You have come to me to bring my sin to remembrance and to cause the death of my son!" 19 And he said to her, "Give me your son." And he took him from her arms and carried him up into the upper chamber where he lodged, and laid him on his own bed. 20 And he cried to the LORD, "O LORD my God, have you brought calamity even upon the widow with whom I sojourn, by killing her son?" 21 Then he stretched himself upon the child three times and cried to the LORD, "O LORD my God, let this child's life come into him again." 22 And the LORD listened to the voice of Elijah. And the life of the child came into him again, and he revived.

Daniels ministry likely inspired the Wise men at Jesus' birth

Elijahs ministry likely inspired the Sidonian people to believe in Jesus now, 900 yrs later

The Old Testament mentions Israel's dealings with these cities, including the Israelites' failure to conquer Sidon in the conquest of the Promised Land ([Judges 1:31](#)), their **worship of Sidonian gods on several occasions** ([Judges 10:6–16](#); [1 Kings 11](#)), and their **obtaining materials from Sidon and Tyre for the building of the temple** ([1 Chronicles 22:4](#)). King Hiram of Tyre provided many of the temple furnishings for Solomon ([1 Kings 7:13–51](#)). Tyrians and Sidonians are also mentioned in helping rebuild the temple in Ezra's time ([Ezra 3:7](#)). [Queen Jezebel](#) was a Sidonian ([1 Kings 16:31](#)). **The Sidonian city of Zarephath was where a [widow](#) took care of Elijah and the Lord provided oil and flour for her through the famine; later, the widow's son became ill, and Elijah raised him from the dead ([1 Kings 17:8–24](#)).**

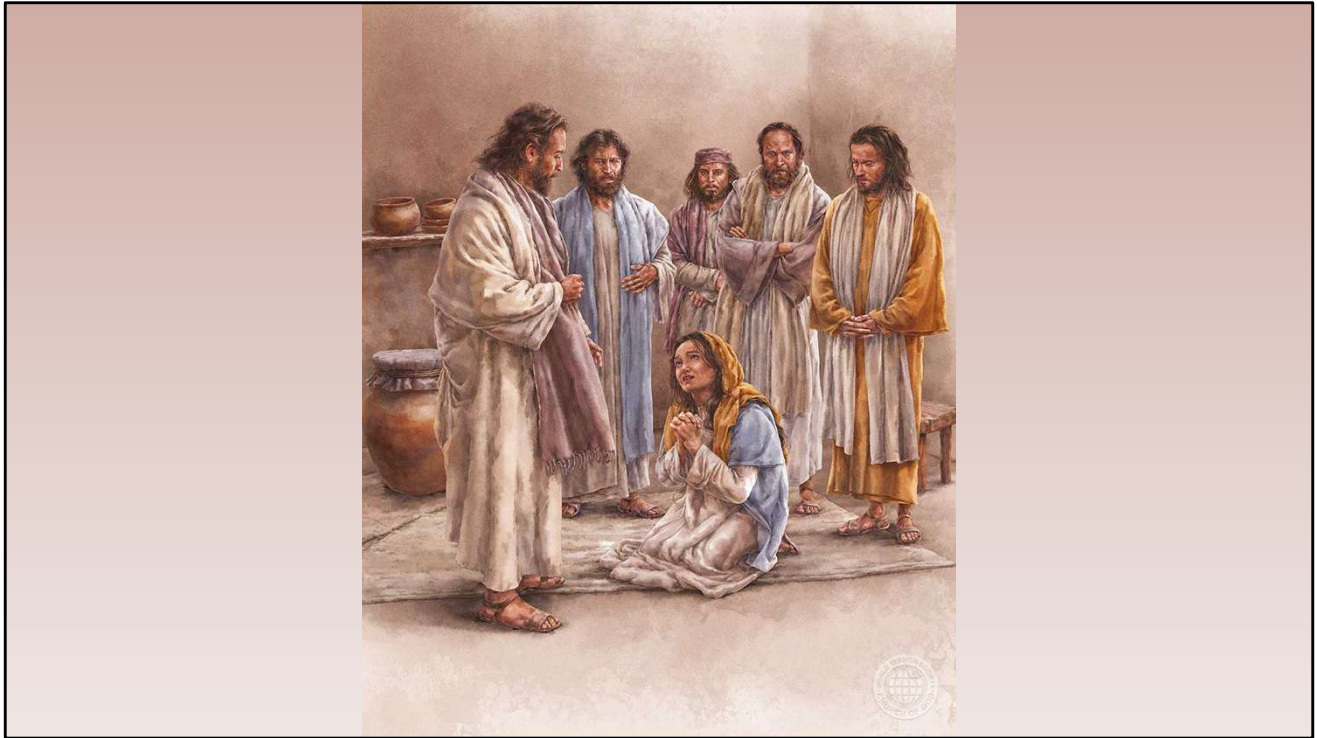
The Old Testament also has several prophecies against Tyre and Sidon that **predicted a complete overthrow** ([Isaiah 23](#); [Jeremiah 25](#); [27](#); [47](#); [Ezekiel 26–28](#); [Joel 3](#); [Amos 1:9–10](#); [Zechariah 9:1–4](#)). Nebuchadnezzar besieged Tyre from 585–572 BC. Alexander the Great conquered Tyre in 322 BC, completely destroying the city. The Persian king Artaxerxes conquered Sidon. In short, God's prophesied judgment came to pass. Later, both cities became prosperous provinces of Rome.

crowds from Tyre and Sidon came to see and listen to Him ([Mark 3:7–8](#)). Jesus helped a [Syrophoenician woman](#) and commended her faith ([Matthew 15:21–28](#)).

Jesus mentions Tyre and Sidon in [Luke 10:13–14](#) (see also [Matthew 11:20–24](#)),

comparing them to several cities in which He had performed miracles. These cities of Israel had been blessed with Jesus' presence, preaching, and power, yet they had not repented. Jesus pronounces woes on them, stating that Tyre and Sidon, given the same opportunity, would have turned from their wickedness and been saved: **"Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! For if the miracles that were performed in you had been performed in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago, sitting in sackcloth and ashes. But it will be more bearable for Tyre and Sidon at the judgment than for you."** Jesus also says [Capernaum](#) is under God's judgment for their rejection of Christ (verse 15), because "whoever rejects me rejects him who sent me" (verse 16).

The distance from the Sea of Galilee region (like Gennesaret) to the ancient cities of Tyre and Sidon in [Phoenicia](#) (modern Lebanon) is roughly 35-50 miles (56-80 km) by foot, a journey Jesus and his disciples took,

 - God/Jesus is NOT obliged to explain everything
 - We miss the bigger mystery’s, That He loves us at all!
- “Immediately”
 - Action focused, direct cause and effect, responsive
 - Urgency, connects Divine Providence and purpose

Jesus was Available, w/o being Used! Most people only wanted to USE Jesus

Key Elements of the Mystery

The Messianic Secret: Jesus often forbids those who recognize him (like demons or healed individuals) from revealing his identity.

Parable Teaching: He speaks in parables to crowds, stating it's a way to keep outsiders from understanding the "mystery of the kingdom" (Mark 4:11-12).

Confused Disciples: Even his closest followers struggle to grasp who Jesus is, often failing to understand his actions and teachings.

Supernatural Knowledge: While humans are confused, demons and God at Jesus's baptism and transfiguration clearly know his divine identity.

Reader Engagement: The secrecy acts as a literary device, inviting readers to discover Jesus's true identity alongside the narrative's progression.

Theories on the Secrecy

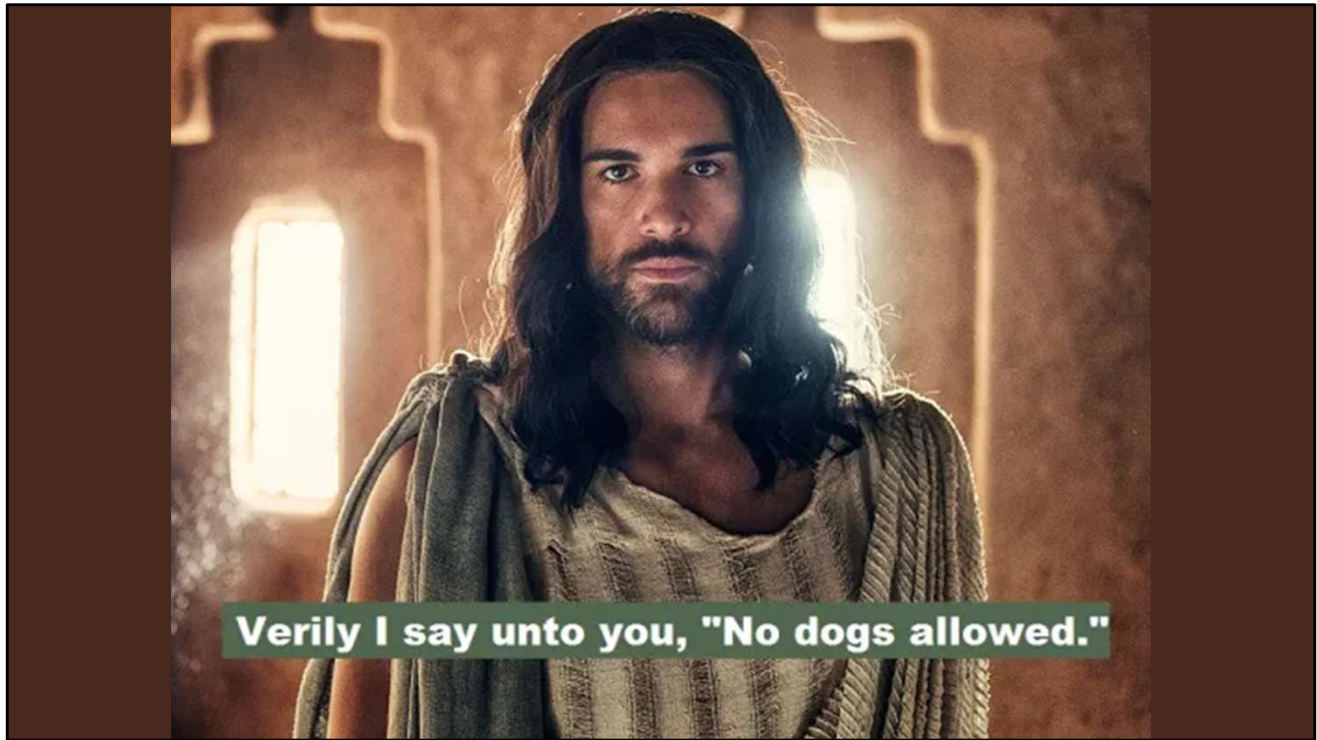
Historical: Jesus might have wanted to avoid political upheaval or premature acclaim as a military Messiah.

Literary/Theological: It's a way to build suspense, highlight the true nature of the Messiah (suffering servant, not warrior), and challenge readers to move from external signs to internal faith.

Mark uses "immediately" (Greek: euthys) frequently (around 40 times) to create a fast-paced, urgent

tone, highlighting Jesus's swift, action-oriented ministry and divine purpose, showing His prompt obedience and the critical need for immediate response to His message, unlike the more contemplative pace of other Gospels. This stylistic choice emphasizes Jesus's power and the critical nature of His mission, moving quickly from one event to the next, from healings to calls for discipleship, demanding an urgent response

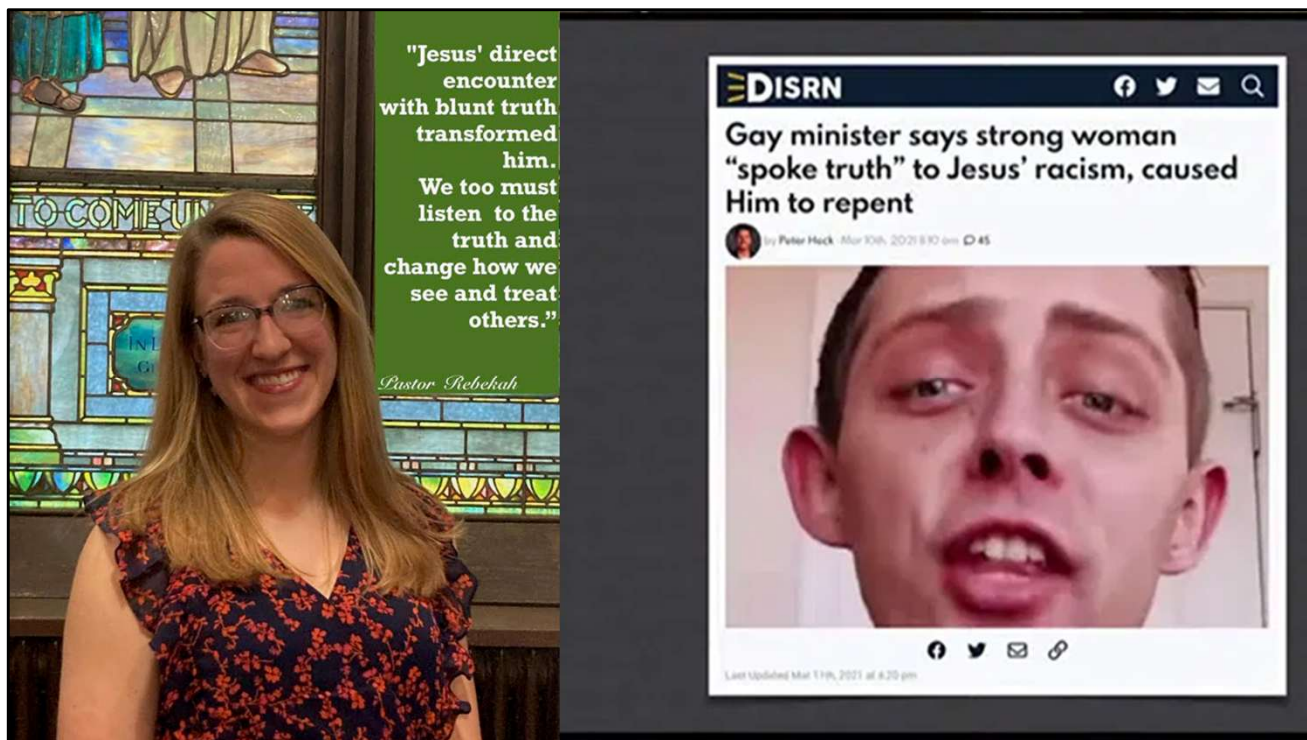

In her sermon on the Second Sunday of Easter, **Interim Pastor Rebekah Anderson** preached on the story of **“The Syrophoenician Woman’s Faith,”** as recorded in the Scripture [Mark 7:24-30](#). She stated that when people are brought into direct contact with the truth, they are transformed. Whatever is obstructing their view is removed and allows them to see clearly something they couldn’t see before. In the case of Jesus, it’s as if, for one moment, he lost sight of his mission. He seemingly forgot that he had just taught the crowd of Scribes and Pharisees that “what comes out of our hearts supersedes the law.”

The Syrophoenician woman of great faith asked Jesus to heal her daughter. She, who was a Gentile, not Jewish, taught Jesus to be more tolerant. **This woman brought Jesus into a direct encounter with the truth and reminds him of his mission’s entire point, thus empowering him to transform**

others. Pastor Rebekah reminds us “that as Christians, we are called to listen deeply to ourselves, to others, and to God.” We are often afraid to listen, she said, “because when we do, we are often confronted with things that are really uncomfortable.” She invites us to honor God with our hearts and actions by listening to those who are different from us, who can remind us of what we are called to be. God’s unconditional love for us will help us listen deeply.

Pastor” Brandon Robertson made in a recent TikTok:

Did you know that there's a part of the [Gospel](#) of Mark where [Jesus](#) uses a racial slur? In Mark chapter 7 there's the account of the Syrophoenician woman. A woman who is Syrian and Greek, both of which there were strong biases against within the Jewish community.

And she comes to ask Jesus to heal her daughter who is possessed by a demon. And what is Jesus' response? He says it's not good for me to give the children's food—meaning the children of Israel's food—to dogs. He calls her a dog.

What's amazing about this account is that the woman doesn't back down. She speaks

truth to power, she confronts Jesus and says, 'Well you can think that about me but even dogs deserve the crumbs from the table.'

Her boldness and bravery to speak truth to power actually changes Jesus' mind. Jesus repents of His racism and extends healing to this woman's daughter.

I love this story because it's a reminder that Jesus is human. He had prejudices and bias. And when confronted with it, He was willing to do His work. And this woman was willing to stand up and speak truth.

[Exo 33:2 ESV] 2 I will send an angel before you, and I will drive out the Canaanites, the Amorites, the Hittites, the Perizzites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites.

Hence, Sidon is called the "firstborn" of Canaan ([Ge 10:15](#), though compare Jud 3:3), and the Septuagint translates "Canaanites" by "Phoenicians" and "Canaan" by the "land of the Phoenicians" ([Ex 16:35](#); [Jos 5:12](#)).

Deu 7:2 and when the LORD your God gives them over to you, and you defeat them, then you must devote them to complete destruction. You shall make no covenant with them and show no mercy to them.

[Deu 12:29-31 ESV] 29 "When the LORD your God cuts off before you the nations whom

you go in to dispossess, and you dispossess them and dwell in their land, 30 take care that you be not ensnared to follow them, after they have been destroyed before you, and that you do not inquire about their gods, saying, 'How did these nations serve their gods?--that I also may do the same.' 31 You shall not worship the LORD your God in that way, for every abominable thing that the LORD hates they have done for their gods, for they even burn their sons and their daughters in the fire to their gods.

[Lev 18:26-30 ESV] 26 But you shall keep my statutes and my rules and do none of these abominations, either the native or the stranger who sojourns among you 27 (for the people of the land, who were before you, did all of these abominations, so that the land became unclean), 28 lest the land vomit you out when you make it unclean, as it vomited out the nation that was before you. 29 For everyone who does any of these abominations, the persons who do them shall be cut off from among their people. 30 So keep my charge never to practice any of these abominable customs that were practiced before you, and never to make yourselves unclean by them: I am the LORD your God."

WHY DID JESUS CALLED THE WOMAN DOG?

Does Jesus offend you?

They called Him: out of his mind, Insane, Demon possessed, a Liar/Deceiver, a Samaritan, **Beelzebul, the prince of demons, unworthy of following!!!**

[Mar 3:21 ESV] 21 And when his family heard it, they went out to seize him, for they were saying, "**He is out of his mind.**"

[Jhn 7:12 ESV] 12 And there was much muttering about him among the people. While some said, "He is a good man," others said, "**No, he is leading the people astray.**"

[Jhn 7:20 ESV] 20 The crowd answered, "**You have a demon!** Who is seeking to kill you?"

[Jhn 7:47 ESV] 47 The Pharisees answered them, "**Have you also been deceived?**

[Jhn 8:52 ESV] 52 The Jews said to him, "Now we know that **you have a demon!** Abraham died, as did the prophets, yet you say, 'If anyone keeps my word, he will never taste death.'

[Jhn 8:48 ESV] 48 The Jews answered him, "**Are we not right in saying that you are a Samaritan and have a demon?**"

[Jhn 9:24 ESV] 24 So for the second time they called the man who had been blind and said to him, "Give glory to God. **We know that this man is a sinner.**"

[Jhn 10:20 ESV] 20 Many of them said, "**He has a demon, and is insane; why listen to him?**"

[Mat 12:24 ESV] 24 But when the Pharisees heard it, they said, "It is only by **Beelzebul, the prince of demons,** that this man casts out demons."

Beg? Bow? Brag!

- Fell down at his feet...knelt before him – Matthew 15:25
- Crying, ...she is crying out
- “my daughter is severely oppressed by a demon.”
- But he did not answer her a word.
- Matthew 15:24 – He answered, “I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.”

If you were her, what would you have thought/Said?!!

Mat 15:21-28 And Jesus went away from there and withdrew to the district of Tyre and Sidon. 22 And behold, a Canaanite woman from that region came out and was crying, "Have mercy on me, O Lord, Son of David; my daughter is severely oppressed by a demon." 23 But he did not answer her a word. And his disciples came and begged him, saying, "Send her away, for she is crying out after us." 24 He answered, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." 25 But she came and knelt before him, saying, "Lord, help me." 26 And he answered, "It is not right to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs." 27 She said, "Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters' table." 28 Then Jesus answered her, "O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you desire." And her daughter was healed instantly.

[Luk 16:3, 27 ESV] 3 And the manager said to himself, 'What shall I do, since my master is taking the management away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. ... 27 And he said, 'Then I beg you, father, to send him to my father's house--

[Jhn 9:8 ESV] 8 The neighbors and those who had seen him before as a beggar were saying, "Is this not the man who used to sit and beg?"

[Act 21:39 ESV] 39 Paul replied, "I am a Jew, from Tarsus in Cilicia, a citizen of no obscure city. I beg you, permit me to speak to the people."

[Act 24:4 ESV] 4 But, to detain you no further, I beg you in your kindness to hear us briefly.

[Act 26:3 ESV] 3 especially because you are familiar with all the customs and controversies of the Jews. Therefore I beg you to listen to me patiently.

[2Co 2:8 ESV] 8 So I beg you to reaffirm your love for him.

[2Co 10:2 ESV] 2 I beg of you that when I am present I may not have to show boldness with such confidence as I count on showing against some who suspect us of walking according to the flesh.

[Heb 12:19 ESV] 19 and the sound of a trumpet and a voice whose words made the hearers beg that no further messages be spoken to them.

[Mar 10:46 ESV] 46 And they came to Jericho. And as he was leaving Jericho with his disciples and a great crowd, Bartimaeus, a blind beggar, the son of Timaeus, was sitting by the roadside.

[Jhn 9:8 ESV] 8 The neighbors and those who had seen him before as a beggar were saying, "Is this not the man who used to sit and beg?"

[1Co 1:29, 31 ESV] 29 so that no human being might boast in the presence of God. ... 31 so that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord."

We have nothing to offer God and Everything to gain!

A baby's heart begins to beat around **22 days (3 weeks) after fertilization. AiG**

**5 Weeks:** The "heart" tube pulses about 110 times per minute, detectable by ultrasound.

**Weeks 5-8:** The embryo has a recognizable human form, with distinct limbs, facial features (eyes, ears), and internal organs like the liver and lungs taking shape.

**By Week 8:** The brain is complex enough for basic functions like thumb-sucking, yawning, and even left/right hand preference.

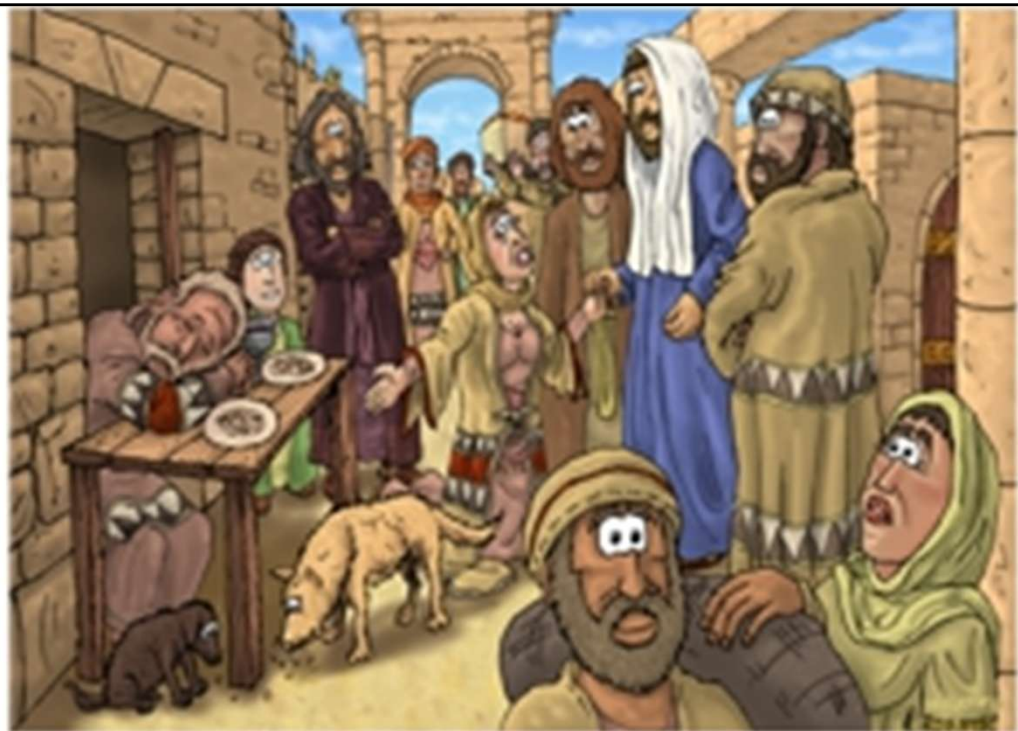

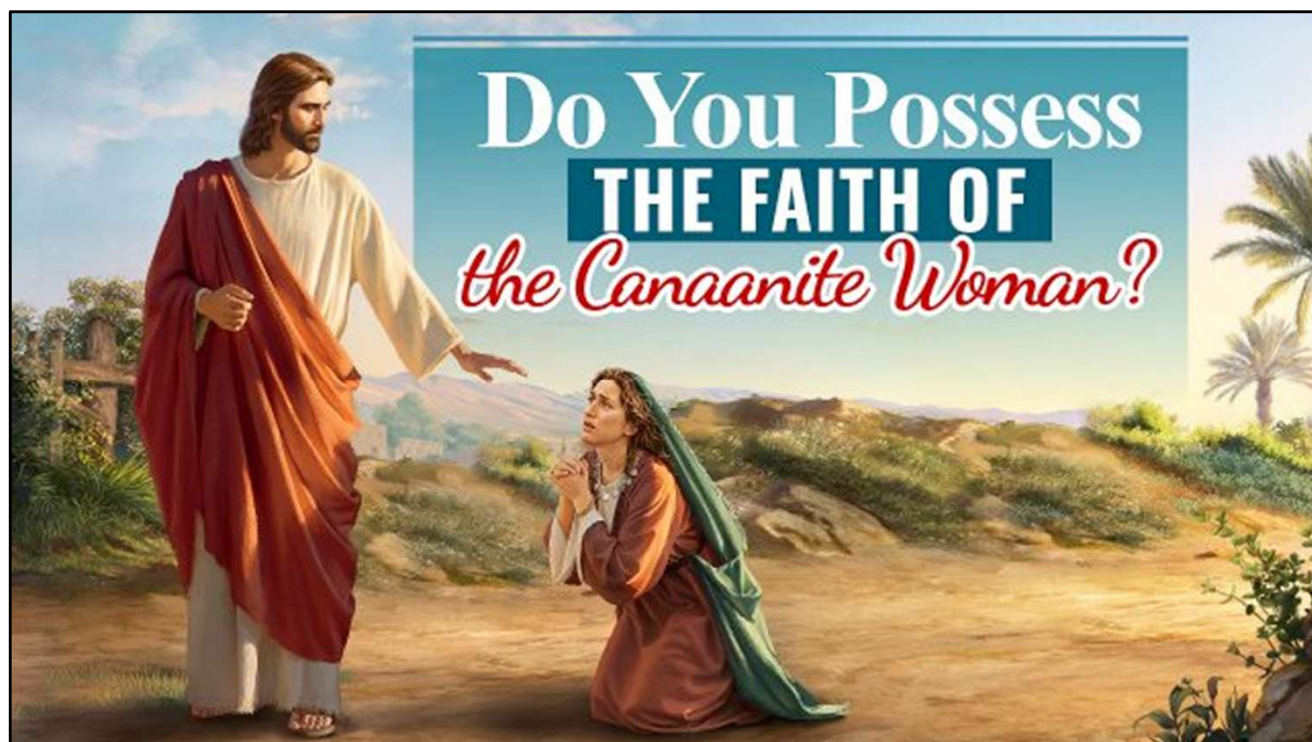
