

The Holy Spirit is a person, not merely an essence, the Scripture refers to HIM in the masculine pronoun and HE is equal to and IS God!

The Father and Son are Holy; Holy/Holy/Holy yet the <u>Holy</u> Spirit emphasizes His sanctifying work! Pentecost, He came as a <u>Fire, purifying!</u>

Notice the Triangle is pointed and flat at the top depending on the image

[Rom 8:9 NASB20] 9 <u>However, you are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if indeed</u> the Spirit of God dwells in you. But if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he does not belong to Him.

THE PERSON AND WORK OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

We believe that the Holy Spirit is co-equal with God the Father and God the Son and is of the same essence. Yet He is also distinct from them.

Scripture describes the Holy Spirit in personal terms, not as an impersonal force, when it says that He teaches, guides, comforts and intercedes. He possesses emotions, intellect and will. The Holy Spirit spoke to Philip and gave counsel to the church at

Jerusalem.³ He was sinned against and lied to.⁴

The Scriptures also attest to the deity of the Holy Spirit. He is spoken of as God and is identified with the title of Jehovah.⁵ The Christian who is indwelt by the Spirit is indwelt by God.⁶ The Holy Spirit possesses the attributes of deity, such as omniscience, omnipresence, omnipotence and eternality.⁷ He does works only God can do, such as creating, regenerating and sanctifying.⁸ He is equally associated with the other members of the Trinity.⁹

The work of the Holy Spirit in the Old Testament differed somewhat from His work in the New Testament. The possession of the Holy Spirit by the believer was not permanent in every case. ¹⁰ The Spirit had a ministry of restraining sin and in the creation of the world. ¹¹

The Holy Spirit today plays a major role in the application of salvation to the individual. It is the Spirit who brings conviction to the unbeliever and causes him to see the truth of the gospel in a clear light. Those who respond to this conviction and place their faith in Jesus Christ receive eternal life and a new nature. He Holy Spirit unites the believer with Christ and places him in the body of Christ, the church. He also unites the believer with Christ in His death, enabling him to live victoriously over \sin^{15} The Holy Spirit controls the believer who yields to God and submits himself to God's Word. When these conditions are met, the believer lives in the power of the Spirit and produces the fruit of the Spirit.

The Holy Spirit indwells the believer permanently. While the child of God may sin and grieve the Spirit, the Spirit will never leave the true believer. Absence of the Holy Spirit is the mark of the unsaved. The Holy Spirit seals the believer. This ministry guarantees the security of the believer "until the day of redemption."

The Holy Spirit sovereignly bestows spiritual gifts or abilities for service to every believer.²³ Although His restraint of evil in the world today will cease with the rapture,²⁴ He will continue to be present in the earth. In the tribulation period the Spirit will be involved in salvation and filling.²⁵ In the coming kingdom of Jesus Christ, the Spirit will be in God's people and the Spirit will be upon the King.²⁶

Jhn 14:16, 26 NASB20] 16 "I will ask the Father, and He will give you another Helper[G3875], so that He may be with you forever; ... 26 "But the Helper[G3875], the Holy Spirit whom the Father will send in My name, **He will teach you all things, and remind you of all that I said to you**.

[Jhn 15:26 NASB20] 26 "When the Helper[G3875] comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, [namely,] **the Spirit of truth who comes from the Father, He will testify about Me**,

Remember Jesus often sent the disciples out 2x2, without Himself?

The Holy Spirit will go with us even when we're alone!

The Holy spirit indwelled believers in the Old Testament too, He just didn't stay permanently!

Some Bible readers assume that the Spirit's activity in Scripture is limited to the New Testament. But actually He is just as active in the Old Testament.

No clearer statement of the intimate interworking of the triune God—Father, Son and Holy Spirit—and especially of the Spirit's powerful role can be found in the Old Testament than in Isaiah's prophecy of the Servant of the Lord (Isaiah 42:1–9). The passage summarizes the redeeming work of all three Persons of the Trinity in the salvation of the lost. Thus it ties together in remarkable harmony both the Old Testament and New Testament understandings of God's grace. It also sheds light on our understanding of the Holy Spirit.

- 1. The Spirit participated in creation (Genesis 1:2; Job 26:13; Isaiah 32:15).
- 2. The Spirit gives life to humanity and the other creatures (**Psalm 104:29, 30**). It is

- interesting that when Genesis says God endows people with life by breathing into their nostrils the "breath of life" (Genesis 2:7), the word for "breath" is the same word translated elsewhere as "spirit."
- 3. The Spirit strives with sinners (<u>Genesis 6:3</u>), which is perhaps related to His work in convicting people of sin (<u>John 16:8–11</u>).
- 4. The Spirit came upon certain judges, warriors, and prophets in a way that gave them extraordinary power: for example, Joshua (Numbers 27:18), Othniel (Judges 3:10), Gideon (Judges 6:34), Samson (Judges 13:25; 14:6), and Saul (1 Samuel 10:9, 10). However, the Spirit later departed from Saul because of his disobedience (1 Samuel 16:14). 1Sa 16:14 14 Now the Spirit of the LORD left Saul, and an evil spirit from the LORD terrified him.
- 5. The Spirit played a prominent role in the long span of Old Testament prophecy. David declared that "the Spirit of the Lord spoke by me, and His word was on my tongue" (2 Samuel 23:2). Likewise, Ezekiel reported that "the Spirit entered me when He spoke to me" (Ezekiel 2:2).
- 6. The Spirit inspired holiness in Old Testament believers (<u>Psalm 143:10</u>). And Scripture promised that someday God would put His Spirit in His people in a way that would cause them to live according to His statutes (<u>Ezekiel 36:27</u>).
- 7. The Spirit was crucial in helping God's people anticipate the ministry of the Messiah. For example, <u>Isaiah 11:1–5</u> is a trinitarian preview of the working of the Father, the Spirit, and the Son, who is the Branch of Jesse. Looking forward to the ministry of Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit inspired Isaiah to prophesy: "The Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon Him" (<u>Isaiah 11:2</u>), inspiring God's Chosen One with wisdom, understanding, counsel, might, knowledge, fear of the Lord, righteousness, and faithfulness. Thus we come full cycle to the New Testament, where Jesus claimed to be the fulfillment of this prophecy (<u>Isaiah 61:1</u>, 2; <u>Luke 4:18, 19</u>).

The Helper, the Holy Spirit

Jn 14:16, 26 - "I will ask the Father, and He will give you another Helper, so that He may be with you forever;" . . . "But the Helper, the Holy Spirit whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and remind you os all that I said to you."

- 1. Another helper of the same kind! Like Jesus...with you forever! "He", not it, not her...
- 2. Helper!....He is specifically emphasized as being **Holy**! How is He helping you?!!
- 3. Teach you all things! And <u>Remind</u> you of all <u>I said</u> (The written word!) <u>He speaks</u> <u>most powerfully and clearly in/thru scripture</u> (Which He inspired and would <u>never contradict</u>)
- 4. Then Spirit of Truth. Jhn 16:13 "But when He, the Spirit of truth, comes, He will guide you into all the truth; for He will not speak on His own, but whatever He hears, He will speak; and He will disclose to you what is to come.
- 5. <u>He always points attention to Jesus, never to Himself!</u> [Jhn 16:14 NASB20] 14 "He will glorify Me, for He will take from Mine and will disclose [it] to you." <u>He always exalts Jesus, above Himself and especially YOU! Humility</u>

Its always easiest to hear the voice of the one with whom you are most familiar (closest) and in tune/love, obey

So then, IF you are living a life of disobedience and self will, its hard to hear the Holy Spirit, IF He is even talking to you in the moment.

[Rom 8:26-27 NASB20] 26 Now in the same way the Spirit also helps our weakness; for we do not know what to pray for as we should, but the Spirit Himself intercedes for [us] with groanings too deep for words; 27 and He who

searches the hearts knows what the mind of the Spirit is, because He intercedes for the saints according to [the will of] God.

Jesus had spoken only the Father's words, but the disciples always had trouble understanding Him during His earthly ministry. For example, John 12:16 says, "These things His disciples did not understand at the first; but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things were written of Him, and that they had done these things to Him." In John 16:12 Jesus says, "I have many more things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now."

Now He was turning over His teaching of the disciples to the Holy Spirit, who would dwell in them: "These things I have spoken to you while abiding with you. But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all that I said to you" (John 14:25-26).

The Helper, the Holy Spirit

Our conscience is not always God speaking! We can have a poorly trained conscience! Don't always let your conscience be your guide!

[Act 23:1 NASB20] 1 Now looking intently at the Council, Paul said, "Brothers, I have lived my life with an entirely good conscience before God up to this day."

[Act 24:16 NASB20] 16 "In view of this I also do my best to maintain a blameless conscience [both] before God and before [other] people, always.

[Rom 2:15 NASB20] 15 in that they show the work of the Law written in their hearts, their conscience testifying and their thoughts alternately accusing or else defending them,

[Rom 9:1 NASB20] 1 I am telling the truth in Christ, I am not lying; my conscience testifies with me in the Holy Spirit,

[1Co 10:25, 27-29 NASB20] 25 Eat anything that is sold in the meat market without asking questions, for the sake of conscience; ... 27 If one of the unbelievers invites you and you want to go, eat anything that is set before you without asking questions, for the sake of conscience. 28 But if anyone says to you, "This is meat sacrificed to idols," do not eat [it,] for the sake of that one who informed [you] and for the sake of conscience; 29 Now [by] "conscience" I do not mean your own, but the other person's; for why is my freedom judged by another's conscience?

2Co 1:12 For our proud confidence is this: the testimony of our conscience, that in holiness and godly sincerity, not in fleshly wisdom but in the grace of God, we have conducted ourselves in the world, and especially toward you.

2Co 4:2 but we have renounced the things hidden because of shame, not walking in trickery nor distorting the word of God, but by the open proclamation of the truth commending ourselves to every person's conscience in the sight of God.

[1Ti 1:5, 19 But the goal of our instruction is love from a pure heart, [from] a good conscience, and [from] a sincere faith. ... 19 keeping faith and a good conscience, which some have rejected and suffered shipwreck in regard to their faith.

[1Ti 3:9 NASB20] 9 [but] holding to the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience.

[1Ti 4:2 NASB20] 2 by means of the hypocrisy of liars seared in their own conscience as with a branding iron,

[2Ti 1:3 NASB20] 3 I thank God, whom I serve with a clear conscience the way my forefathers did, as I constantly remember you in my prayers night and day,

[1Pe 2:19 NASB20] 19 For this [finds] favor, if for the sake of conscience toward God a person endures grief when suffering unjustly.

[1Pe 3:16, 21 NASB20] 16 and keep a good conscience so that in the thing in which you

[Jas 1:21 NASB20] 21 Therefore, ridding [yourselves] of all filthiness and [all] that remains of wickedness, in humility receive the word implanted, which is able to save your souls.

[Act 4:31 NASB20] 31 And when they had prayed, the place where they had gathered

together was shaken, and **they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and [began] to speak the word of God with boldness**.

[Eph 6:17 NASB20] 17 And take the helmet of salvation and **the sword of the Spirit**, **which is the word of God**.

[1Th 1:5-6 NASB20] 5 for our gospel did not come to you in word only, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction; just as you know what kind of men we proved to be among you for your sakes. 6 You also became imitators of us and of the Lord, having received the word during great affliction with the joy of the Holy Spirit,

[Mat 12:32 NASB20] 32 "And whoever speaks a word against the Son of Man, it shall be forgiven him; but whoever speaks against the Holy Spirit, it shall not be forgiven him, either in this age or in the [age] to come.

Jesus had spoken only the Father's words, but the disciples always had trouble understanding Him during His earthly ministry. For example, John 12:16 says, "These things His disciples did not understand at the first; but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things were written of Him, and that they had done these things to Him." In John 16:12 Jesus says, "I have many more things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now."

Now He was turning over His teaching of the disciples to the Holy Spirit, who would dwell in them: "These things I have spoken to you while abiding with you. But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all that I said to you" (John 14:25-26).



The revelation which our Lord promises the apostles is not only from Christ, it is Christ-centered: "He will glorify me, because he will receive from me what is mine and will tell it to you. Everything that the Father has is mine; that is why I said the Spirit will receive from me what is mine and will tell it to you" (John 16:14-15).

The revelation which is promised is that truth which has come from the Father, to the Son, and through the Spirit. It is thus our Lord's teaching. But it is not merely the teaching of (i.e. from) our Lord; it is the teaching concerning our Lord. False revelations are those which appeal to man's fallen desires (2 Timothy 4:1-4; 2 Peter 2:18-22), which elevate men (Acts 20:30; 1 Corinthians 1:10ff.), and which draw men's focus away from Christ (1 Corinthians 1:22-31; 2 Peter 2:1; 1 John 2:18-25).





Pro 29:25 The fear of man lays a snare, but whoever trusts in the LORD is safe.

Rom 10:3-4 For <u>not knowing about God's righteousness and seeking to establish</u> their own, they did not subject themselves to the righteousness of God. 4 For Christ is the end of the Law for righteousness to everyone who believes.

<u>**Judgment because Satan has been defeated!**</u>

[Mat 12:36, 41 NASB20] 36 "But I tell you that [for] every careless word that people speak, they will give an account of it on [the] day of judgment. ... 41 "The men of Nineveh will stand up with this generation at the judgment, and will condemn it because they repented at the preaching of Jonah; and behold, [something] greater than Jonah is here. [Rom 2:3, 5 NASB20] 3 But do you suppose this, you [foolish] person who passes judgment on those who practice such things, and [yet] does them [as well,] that you will escape the judgment of God? ... 5 But because of your stubbornness and unrepentant heart you are storing up wrath for yourself on the day of wrath and revelation of the righteous judgment of God,

[Rom 14:10 NASB20] 10 But [as for] you, why do you judge your brother [or sister?] Or you as well, why do you regard your brother [or sister] with contempt? For we will all appear before the judgment seat of God.

The Holy Spirit convicts the world concerning three things: sin and righteousness and judgment. The singular form of hamartias (sin) refers not to sin in general but specifically to the ultimate sin of refusing to believe in Jesus Christ. It is that sin that finally damns people, since all others are forgiven when a person believes savingly in Him (cf. Matt. 12:31–32). In John 3:18 Jesus said, "He who believes in Him (Christ) is not judged; he who does not believe has been judged already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God." In 5:40 He rebuked those who were "unwilling to come to [Him] so that [they might] have life." He solemnly warned the unbelieving Jews, "Unless you believe that I am He, you will die in your sins" (John 8:24). The sole issue that determines people's eternal destiny is how they react to the Spirit's convicting ministry concerning their own sin and the provision of forgiveness by grace through Jesus Christ.

Second, Jesus told the disciples, "the Holy Spirit convicts the world concerning righteousness, because I go to the Father and you no longer see Me." The righteousness here is that which belongs to Jesus Christ by nature as the holy Son of God. This is the flip side of the previous point; not only does the Spirit convict unbelievers of their sin, but also of the necessity of having the perfect

righteousness of Christ (cf. Matt. 5:20, 48). When their wickedness is compared to His sinless holiness, their sin is seen more truly for the detestable evil that it is. And the sinner is face-to-face with the impossibility of salvation by any effort, work, or achievement he may do.

The Lord's statement, because I go to the Father and you no longer see Me, provides the supreme evidence of His righteousness: His acceptance into the Father's presence. Habakkuk 1:13 says of God, "Your eyes are too pure to approve evil, and You can not look on wickedness with favor." When the Father "highly exalted Him, and bestowed on Him the name which is above every name" (Phil. 2:9), He Himself testified to Christ's righteousness. Those who heed the Spirit's testimony about their utter sinfulness and Christ's perfect righteousness and respond to the gospel in genuine faith, are instantly clothed with His righteousness. Their sins are placed fully on Him and, in His death at the hands of God's holy justice, He paid the penalty in full (Phil. 3:9; cf. Rom. 3:21–22; 4:5, 13; 5:21; 10:10; 1 Cor. 1:30; 2 Cor. 5:21). God justifies sinners when He accounts their sins to have been paid for by Christ's death and Christ's righteousness is credited to them by His grace alone.

Finally, the Holy Spirit convicts the world concerning judgment, because the ruler of this world has been judged. The world's judgments are erroneous and evil, as was supremely demonstrated by its rejection of the Son of God. But while the world is incapable of judging righteously (cf. 7:24), the Spirit always does so. He convicts people of their false assessment of Jesus Christ.

The ruler of this world is Satan (12:31; 14:30; 1 John 5:19). He has already been judged and cast from heaven along with the rest of the angels who rebelled with him (Rev. 12:7-9; cf. Luke 10:18). He was totally defeated at the cross (Col. 2:15; Heb. 2:14; 1 John 3:8), when what appeared to be his hour of triumph was in reality the hour of his undoing. Though Satan has been defeated and judged, the final sentence against him will not be carried out until the end of the millennium (Rev. 20:10). In the meantime he goes about as the god of this age, seeking to capture and devour souls. The sobering warning to those who embrace the world system is that since its ruler will not escape judgment, neither will they, unless they repent. The Devil's fate guarantees the judgment of every unrepentant sinner.


There are only two possible responses to the convicting work of the Spirit: repentance or rejection. From those who reject the Spirit's conviction will come hostility to the followers of Christ. Their end is "eternal destruction, away from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of His power" (2 Thess. 1:9). Those who repent when the Spirit convicts them will spend eternity in the inexpressible glory and joy of heaven. Yet they will, in this life, face fiery trials of persecution without a fatal defection because "greater is He who is in [them] than he who is in the world" (1 John 4:4).


