



James: 1. An Apostle Son of Zebedee and Salome,

James: An Intimate Companion of Jesus, and Present with Him: At the great catch of fish, Luk 5:10;

James: 2. An Apostle Son of Alphaeus, [Mat 10:3 NASB20] 3 Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus;

James' conversion cries out for an explanation. How could someone come to believe so strongly that their big brother was the divine Messiah?

[Mat 10:2 NASB20] 2 Now the names of the twelve apostles are these: The first, Simon, who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew; and James the son of Zebedee, and his brother John;

<u>Jewishness of James</u>, and likely Jesus too (they grew up in a devoutly <u>JEW</u>ish home!)

- There is no mention of the incarnation or of the resurrection. In book of James
- The word "gospel" does not occur in the epistle There is no suggestion that the Messiah has appeared
- interested in conduct more than in creed.
- It has very little formulated theology, less than any other epistle in the New Testament
- Their meeting-place is called "your synagogue" (2:2)
- Abraham is mentioned as "our father" (2:21).
- God is given the Old Testament name, "the Lord of Sabaoth" (5:4).
- The law is not to be spoken against nor judged, but reverently and loyally obeyed. It is a royal law to which every loyal Jew will be subject.
- The sins of the flesh are not inveighed against in the epistle, but those sins to which the Jews were more conspicuously liable, such as the love of money and the distinction which money may bring (2:2-4), worldliness and pride (4:4-6), impatience and murmuring (5:7-11), and other sins of the temper and tongue (3:1-12; 4:11,12)
- The illustrations of faithfulness and patience and prayer are found in Old Testament characters, in <u>Abraham (2:21), Rahab (2:25), Job (Jas 5:11), and Elijah (Jas 5:17,18)</u>. The whole atmosphere of the epistle is Jewish.



Jacob (Hebrew) is equivalent to the Greek name James, Like Jesus is Greek for Joshua (Hebrew)

Leader of the Messianic mother church in Jerusalem Lived through Famine, poverty, persecution

Enemy before Jesus' death, James did NOT believe Jesus

He thought Jesus was insane

[Mar 3:21 NASB20] 21 And when His own people heard [about this,] they came out to take custody of Him; for they were saying, "He has lost His senses."...NKJV "He is out of His mind."

Friend after Jesus death, James believed he had seen the Risen Jesus and became an Apostle.

[1Co 15:7 NASB20] 7 then He appeared to James, then to all the apostles; James became the leader of the church at Jerusalem

[Act 21:18 NASB20] 18 And the following day Paul went in with us to James, and all the elders were present.

Wrote the book that bears his name

[Jas 1:1 NASB20] 1 James, a bond-servant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ, To the twelve tribes who are dispersed abroad: Greetings.

James was martyred for his belief in Jesus

Peter and Paul defer to him. Paul mentions his name before that of Peter and John.

Most all Biblical scholars concur that James the brother of Jesus is not to be identified as James, the brother of John and the son of Zebedee. That James was killed (Acts 12:2) before the Jerusalem Council led by James the brother of Jesus.

The tradition of the church has identified this James with the brother of our Lord.

<u>Clement of Alexandria</u> says that Peter and James and John, who were the three apostles most honored of the Lord,

<u>Josephus</u> (Ant., XX, ix) tells us that Ananus the high priest had James stoned to death, and that the most equitable of the citizens immediately rose in revolt against such a lawless procedure

<u>Hegesippus</u> says that James was first thrown from a pinnacle of the temple, and then they stoned him because he was not killed by the fall, and he was finally beaten over the head with a fuller's club

All tradition agrees in describing James as a Hebrew of the Hebrews, a man of the most rigid and ascetic morality, faithful in his observance of all the ritual regulations of the Jewish faith. Hegesippus tells us that he was holy from his mother's womb. He drank no wine nor strong drink. Hegessipus records the following about James' death, as <u>quoted by Eusebius</u>, a 4th century Church historian: Thrown of the edge of the Temple and stoned to death.

James' martyrdom wasn't just recorded in Christian sources (<u>Hegesippus</u>) but by the 1st-century Jewish historian **Josephus**.

In his book Antiquities of the Jews 20.200, Josephus wrote:

"But this younger Ananus, who, as we told you already, took the high priesthood, was a bold man in his temper, and very insolent...He assembled the Sanhedrin of judges and brought before them the brother of Jesus the so-called Christ, whose name was James, and some others. When he had formed an accusation against them as breakers of the law, he delivered them over to be stoned."

The overdue disciple

Imagine the broken humility it would take to admit you have been so very wrong about your own brother! Especially after almost 3 years of Jesus gathering disciples! "Slow disciple's playing"

How many people make significant changes in their family/personal religion? Especially to faith in Jesus Christ!

And then to preach in his name to the point of martyrdom!

Notice he doesn't capitalize on Jesus as his brother and names favoritism as a grievous sin in Ja.2!!!

[Mat 12:46-50 NASB20] 46 While He was still speaking to the crowds, behold, His mother and brothers were standing outside, seeking to speak to Him. 47 [Someone said to Him, "Look, Your mother and Your brothers are standing outside, seeking to speak to You."] 48 But Jesus replied to the one who was

telling Him and said, "Who is My mother, and who are My brothers?" 49 And extending His hand toward His disciples, He said, "Behold: My mother and My brothers! 50 "For whoever does the will of My Father who is in heaven, he is My brother, and sister, and mother."

[Mat 13:54-55, 57-58 NASB20] 54 And He came to His hometown and [began] teaching them in their synagogue, with the result that they were astonished, and said, "Where [did] this man [acquire] this wisdom and [these] miraculous powers? 55 "Is this not the carpenter's son? Is His mother not called Mary, and His brothers, James, Joseph, Simon, and Judas? ... 57 And they took offense at Him. But Jesus said to them, "A prophet is not dishonored except in his hometown and in his [own] household." 58 And He did not do many miracles there because of their unbelief.

[Mat 27:56 NASB20] 56 Among them were Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James and Joseph, and the mother of the sons of Zebedee.

[Mar 6:3 NASB20] 3 "Is this not the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James, Joses, Judas, and Simon? And are His sisters not here with us?" And they took offense at Him.

[Luk 24:10 NASB20] 10 Now [these women] were Mary Magdalene, Joanna, and Mary the [mother] of James; also the other women with them were telling these things to the apostles.

[Jhn 7:1-10 NASB20] 1 After these things Jesus was walking in Galilee, for He was unwilling to walk in Judea because the Jews were seeking to kill Him. 2 Now the feast of the Jews, the Feast of Booths, was near. 3 So His brothers said to Him, "Move on from here and go into Judea, so that Your disciples also may see Your works which You are doing. 4 "For no one does anything in secret when he himself is striving to be [known] publicly. If You are doing these things, show Yourself to the world." 5 For not even His brothers believed in Him. 6 So Jesus said to them, "My time is not yet here, but your time is always ready. 7 "The world cannot hate you, but it hates Me because I testify about it, that its deeds are evil. 8 "Go up to the feast yourselves; I am not going up to this feast, because My time has not yet fully arrived." 9 Now having said these things to them, He stayed in Galilee. 10 But when His brothers had gone up to the feast, then He Himself also went up, not publicly, but as [though] in secret.


(This is toward the end of Jesus' ministry, likely about six months before His Crucifixion) Even after more than two years of miracles, James is a skeptic. It would, after all, be rather hard to swallow the idea that the brother you had

grown up with was really the Son of God.

[Act 15:1-2, 4-20 NASB20] 1 Some men came down from Judea and [began] teaching the brothers, "Unless you are circumcised according to the custom of Moses, you cannot be saved." 2 And after Paul and Barnabas had a heated argument and debate with them, [the brothers] determined that Paul and Barnabas and some others of them should go up to Jerusalem to the apostles and elders concerning this issue. ... 4 When they arrived in Jerusalem, they were received by the church, the apostles, and the elders, and they reported all that God had done with them. 5 But some of the sect of the Pharisees who had believed stood up, saying, "It is necessary to circumcise them and to direct them to keep the Law of Moses." 6 The apostles and the elders came together to look into this matter. 7 After there had been much debate, Peter stood up and said to them, "Brothers, you know that in the early days God made a choice among you, that by my mouth the Gentiles would hear the word of the gospel and believe. 8 "And God, who knows the heart, testified to them giving them the Holy Spirit, just as He also did to us; 9 and He made no distinction between us and them, cleansing their hearts by faith. 10 "Since this [is the] case, why are you putting God to the test by placing upon the neck of the disciples a yoke which neither our forefathers nor we have been able to bear? 11 "But we believe that we are saved through the grace of the Lord Jesus, in the same way as they also are." 12 All the people kept silent, and they were listening to Barnabas and Paul as they were relating all the signs and wonders that God had done through them among the Gentiles. 13 After they stopped speaking, James responded, saying, "Brothers, listen to me. 14 "Simeon has described how God first concerned Himself about taking a people for His name from among the Gentiles. 15 "The words of the Prophets agree with this, just as it is written: 16 'AFTER THESE THINGS I will return, AND I WILL REBUILD THE FALLEN TABERNACLE OF DAVID, AND I WILL REBUILD ITS RUINS, AND I WILL RESTORE IT, 17 SO THAT THE REST OF MANKIND MAY SEEK THE LORD, AND ALL THE GENTILES WHO ARE CALLED BY MY NAME, '18 SAYS THE LORD, WHO MAKES THESE THINGS known from long ago. 19 "Therefore, it is my judgment that we do not cause trouble for those from the Gentiles who are turning to God, 20 but that we write to them that they abstain from things contaminated by idols, from [acts of] sexual immorality, from what has been strangled, and from blood.


[Act 15:19, 22 NASB20] 19 "Therefore, it is my judgment that we do not cause trouble for those from the Gentiles who are turning to God, ... 22 Then it seemed good to the apostles and the elders, with the whole church, to choose men from among them to send to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas: Judas who was called Barsabbas, and Silas, leading men among the brothers,

[Act 21:20-21 NASB20] 20 And when they heard [about them,] they [began] glorifying God; and they said to him, "You see, brother, how many thousands there are among the Jews of those who have believed, and they are all zealous for the Law; 21 and they have been told about you, that you are teaching all the Jews who are among the Gentiles to abandon Moses, telling them not to circumcise their children nor to walk according to the customs.

[Gal 1:11-19 NASB20] 11 For I would have you know, brothers [and sisters,] that the gospel which was preached by me is not of human invention. 12 For I neither received it from man, nor was I taught it, but [I received it] through a revelation of Jesus Christ. 13 For you have heard of my former way of life in Judaism, how I used to persecute the church of God beyond measure and tried to destroy it; 14 and I was advancing in Judaism beyond many of my contemporaries among my countrymen, being more extremely zealous for my ancestral traditions. 15 But when He who had set me apart [even] from my mother's womb and called [me] through His grace was pleased 16 to reveal His Son in me so that I might preach Him among the Gentiles, I did not immediately consult with flesh and blood, 17 nor did I go up to Jerusalem to those [who were] apostles before me; but I went away to Arabia, and returned once more to Damascus. 18 Then three years later I went up to Jerusalem to become acquainted with Cephas, and stayed with him for fifteen days. 19 But I did not see another one of the apostles except James, the Lord's brother.

[Gal 2:9, 11-21 NASB20] 9 and recognizing the grace that had been given to me, James and Cephas and John, who were reputed to be pillars, gave to me and Barnabas the right hand of fellowship, so that we [might] [go] to the Gentiles, and they to the circumcised. ... 11 But when Cephas came to Antioch, I opposed him to his face, because he stood condemned. 12 For prior to the coming of some men from James, he used to eat with the Gentiles; but when they came, he [began] to withdraw and separate himself, fearing those from the circumcision. 13 The rest of the Jews joined him in hypocrisy, with the result that even Barnabas was carried away by their hypocrisy. 14 But when I saw that they were not straightforward about the truth of the gospel, I said to Cephas in the presence of all, "If you, being a Jew, live like the Gentiles and not like the Jews, how [is it that] you compel the Gentiles to live like Jews? 15 "We [are] Jews by nature and not sinners from the Gentiles; 16 nevertheless, knowing that a person is not justified by works of the Law but through faith in Christ Jesus, even we have

believed in Christ Jesus, so that we may be justified by faith in Christ and not by works of the Law; since by works of the Law no flesh will be justified. 17 "But if, while seeking to be justified in Christ, we ourselves have also been found sinners, is Christ then a servant of sin? Far from it! 18 "For if I rebuild what I have [once] destroyed, I prove myself to be a wrongdoer. 19 "For through the Law I died to the Law, so that I might live for God. 20 "I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the [life] which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself up for me. 21 "I do not nullify the grace of God, for if righteousness [comes] through the Law, then Christ died needlessly."



About 20 years ago <u>a powerfully affirming piece of Archaeology was presented</u> <u>of James</u>, the brother of Jesus! Ossuary of James!

Holden and Geisler write, "Professor Camil Fuchs, head of the statistics department at Tel Aviv University, researched deceased males in Jerusalem in the first century AD. He concluded (based on conservative estimates of a growing Jerusalem population between AD 6 and 70, minus all women, minus children who would not have reached manhood by the time of James's death, minus non-Jews, and considering the fame of Jesus as a brother to warrant the inscription, time of death, and literacy) that with 95 percent assurance there existed at the time in Jerusalem 1.71 people named James who had a father named Joseph and brother named Jesus." [18]

James' mention of Jesus implies that he believed in the resurrection.

Ben Witherington writes, "James lived in an honor and shame culture, and

crucifixion was the most shameful way to die in that culture. If crucifixion had been the final event in Jesus' earthly life, then it is hard to believe that thirty years later someone would be bragging on an ossuary about being related to him. The last part of the inscription reads, almost emphatically, 'His brother [is] Jesus!' or 'He's the brother of Jesus!' What had happened that redeemed the honor of the crucified Jesus? It was his resurrection. So, I like to say, James is in the box, and Jesus is on the box, because of the resurrection."[19]


The James Ossuary is a 1st-century <u>limestone</u> box that was used for containing the bones of the dead. An <u>Aramaic</u> inscription meaning "Jacob (James), son of Joseph, brother of Jesus" is cut into one side of the box. The ossuary attracted scholarly attention due to its apparent association with the Christian <u>holy family</u>. The existence of the ossuary was announced at an October 21, 2002, Washington press conference co-hosted by the <u>Discovery Channel</u> and the <u>Biblical Archaeology Society</u>. The owner of the ossuary is <u>Oded Golan</u>, an Israeli engineer and antiquities collector. The inscription was initially translated by <u>André Lemaire</u>, a Semitic <u>epigrapher</u>, whose article claiming that the ossuary and its inscription were authentic was published in the November/December 2002 issue of <u>Biblical Archaeology Review</u>.
