


Passage: Job 42:1-9

- When is the last time you repented?
- What are "Things too wonderful for me"??
- Arent you thankful the Lord often does NOT deal with us according to our folly?!
- God says to Jobs friend: "you have not spoken of Me what is trustworthy, as

My servant Job *has*" yet Job retracted what he said. How are we to understand all this?

- Job praised the LORD in His Sovereignty! Can you define Sovereignty and what it means?
- How can we reconcile the Sovereignty of God and the moral agency of Man?
- How can we reconcile the Sovereignty of God and the problem of Evil?
- Can and does God violate mans will?




We've reached the end of our study. Notice the contrast! Things are NOT as they appear!

Job, partly naked and in sackcloth, ashes and destitution! Children dead, all his wealth stolen, in deep physical agony and misery and jepression, YET God speaks with him and not his well-dressed pompous friends judging him as worthy of his suffering! He is only hours away form a radical promotion!

They all heard God speak to Job

This flat out rebukes the health, wealth prosperity movement!



The 1st speech Ch.40 focuses on <u>Gods Counsel or wisdom (His competency or</u> <u>worth</u>!),

the 2nd ch.42 is focused on <u>His justice or fairness</u>

Gods Omniscience and wisdom and Authority/Rights are established since they've been called into question

[Job 1:22 NASB20] 22 Despite all this, Job did not sin, nor did he blame God. [Job 2:10 NASB20] 10 But he said to her, "You are speaking as one of the foolish women speaks. Shall we actually accept good from God but not accept adversity?" Despite all this, Job did not sin with his lips.

[Jas 1:26 NASB20] 26 If anyone thinks himself to be religious, yet does not bridle his tongue but deceives his [own] heart, this person's religion is worthless.

[Jas 3:5-6, 8 NASB20] 5 So also the tongue is a small part [of the body,] and [yet] it boasts of great things. See how great a forest is set aflame by such a small fire! 6 And the tongue is a fire, the [very] world of unrighteousness; the tongue is set among our body's parts as that which defiles the whole body and sets on fire the course of [our] life, and is set on fire by hell. ... 8 But no one [among] mankind can tame the tongue; [it is] a restless evil, full of deadly poison.

God, master of the universe! Condescends to talk with a mere man! God honors Jobs <u>Struggle</u>, <u>Honesty</u> and <u>prayer</u>. God answers prayer!!!

"What is Man"? Mercy and Grace!!

God simply does NOT owe us answers! We DO owe Him answers! "We serve at the pleasure of our creator"!

At Addies bday party, 8?, she was asked to put something away and Addie responded "Why don't you do it for once"

[Job 7:17 NASB20] 17 "What is man that You exalt him, And that You are concerned about him,

[Job 15:14 NASB20] 14 "What is man, that he would be pure, Or he who is born of a woman, that he would be righteous?

[Psa 8:4 NASB20] 4 What is man that You think of him, And a son of man that You are concerned about him?

[Psa 144:3 NASB20] 3 LORD, what is man, that You look after him? Or a son of man, that You think of him?

[Heb 2:6 NASB20] 6 But someone has testified somewhere, saying, "WHAT IS MAN, THAT YOU THINK OF HIM? OR A SON OF MAN, THAT YOU ARE CONCERNED ABOUT HIM?

The phrase "ours is not to reason why; ours is but to do and die" is a slightly altered version of lines written by Lord Alfred Tennyson in his 1854 poem, The Charge of the Light Brigade, about a failed British military action

[Mat 11:1-8 NASB20] 1 When Jesus had finished giving instructions to His twelve disciples, He went on from there to teach and preach in their cities. 2 Now [while] in prison, John heard about the works of Christ, and he sent [word] by his disciples, 3 and said to Him, "Are You the Coming One, or are we to look for someone else?" 4 Jesus answered and said to them, "Go and report to John what you hear and see: 5 [those who are] BLIND RECEIVE SIGHT and [those who] limp walk, [those] with leprosy are cleansed and [those who are] deaf hear, [the] dead are raised, and [the] POOR HAVE THE GOSPEL PREACHED TO THEM. 6 "And blessed is any person who does not take offense at Me." 7 As these [disciples of John] were going [away,] Jesus began speaking to the crowds about John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed shaken by the wind? 8 "But what did you go out to see? A man dressed in soft [clothing?] Those who wear soft [clothing] are in kings' palaces!

[Gen 18:27 NASB20] 27 And Abraham replied, "Now <u>behold, I have ventured to</u> <u>speak to the Lord, although I am [only] dust and ashes</u>.

[Gen 32:10 NASB20] 10 I am unworthy of all the favor and of all the faithfulness, which You have shown to Your servant; for with [only] my staff I crossed this Jordan, and now I have become two companies.

[2Sa 24:10 Now David's heart troubled him after he had counted the people. So David said to the LORD, "I have sinned greatly in what I have done. But now, LORD, please overlook the guilt of Your servant, for I have acted very foolishly." [1Ki 19:4 NASB20] 4 But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a broom tree; and he asked for himself to die, and said, "Enough! Now, LORD, take my life, for I am no better than my fathers." [Ezr 9:6, 15 NASB20] 6 and I said, "My God, I am ashamed and humiliated to lift up my face to You, my God, for our wrongful deeds have risen above our heads, and our guilt has grown even to the heavens. ... 15 "LORD God of Israel, You are righteous, for we have been left an escaped remnant, as [it is] this day; behold, we are before You in our guilt, for no one can stand before You because of this." [Neh 9:33 NASB20] 33 "However, You are righteous in everything that has happened to us; For You have dealt faithfully, but we have acted wickedly. [Psa 51:4-5 Against You, You only, I have sinned And done what is evil in Your sight, So that You are justified when You speak And blameless when You judge. 5 Behold, I was brought forth in guilt, And in sin my mother conceived me. [Isa 6:5 NASB20] 5 Then I said, "Woe to me, for I am ruined! Because I am a man of unclean lips, And I live among a people of unclean lips; For my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of armies."

[Dan 9:5, 7 we have sinned, we have done wrong, and acted wickedly and rebelled, even turning aside from Your commandments and ordinances. ... 7 "Righteousness [belongs] to You, Lord, but to us open shame, as [it is] this day--to the men of Judah, the inhabitants of Jerusalem, and all Israel, those who are nearby and those who are far away in all the countries to which You have driven them, because of their unfaithful deeds which they have committed against You.

[Luk 5:8 NASB20] 8 But when Simon Peter saw [this,] he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!"

[Luk 15:18-19 NASB20] 18 'I will set out and go to my father, and will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven, and in your sight; 19 I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me as one of your hired laborers."

[Luk 18:13 NASB20] 13 "But the tax collector, standing some distance away, was even unwilling to raise his eyes toward heaven, but was beating his chest, saying, 'God, be merciful to me, the sinner!'

[1Ti 1:15 NASB20] 15 It is a trustworthy statement, deserving full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, among whom I am foremost.

[Job 9:31-35 NASB20] 31 Then You would plunge me into the pit, And my own clothes would loathe me. 32 "For [He is] not a man, as I am, that I may answer Him-

- That we may go to court together! 33 "<u>There is no arbitrator between us, Who</u> can place his hand upon us both. 34 "Let Him remove His rod from me, And let not the dread of Him terrify me. 35 "[Then] I would speak and not fear Him; But I am not like that in myself.

[Job 16:21 NASB20] **21 That one might plead for a man with God As a son of man** with his neighbor!

[Job 23:4-7 NASB20] 4 "I would present [my] case before Him And fill my mouth with arguments. 5 "I would learn the words [which] He would answer, And perceive what He would tell me. 6 "Would He contend with me by the greatness of [His] power? No, surely He would pay attention to me. 7 "There the upright would argue with Him; And I would be free of my Judge forever.

[Job 31:37 NASB20] 37 "I would declare to Him the number of my steps; <u>Like a</u> prince, I would approach Him.

[Job 34:32 NASB20] 32 Teach me what I do not see; If I have done wrong, I will not do it again'?


[Rom 3:19 NASB20] 19 Now we know that whatever the Law says, it speaks to those who are under the Law, so that every mouth may be closed and all the world may become accountable to God;

[Psa 24:3 NASB20] 3 Who may ascend onto the hill of the LORD? And who may stand in His holy place?


[Psa 24:4 NASB20] 4 One who has clean hands and a pure heart, Who has not lifted up his soul to deceit And has not sworn deceitfully.

[Psa 130:1-4 NLT] 1 A song for pilgrims ascending to Jerusalem. From the depths of despair, O LORD, I call for your help. 2 Hear my cry, O Lord. Pay attention to my prayer. 3 LORD, if you kept a record of our sins, who, O Lord, could ever survive? 4 But you offer forgiveness, that we might learn to fear you.

[Job 38:1-2 NASB20] 1 Then the LORD answered Job from the whirlwind and said, 2 "Who is this who darkens [the divine] plan By words without knowledge? [Job 42:3 NASB20] 3 <u>'Who is this who conceals advice without knowledge?</u>' Therefore I have declared that which I did not understand, Things too wonderful for me, which I do not know.

[Job 40:3-5 NASB20] 3 Then Job answered the LORD and said, 4 "Behold, I am insignificant; what can I say in response to You? I put my hand on my mouth. 5 "I have spoken once, and I will not reply; Or twice, and I will add nothing [more.]"

[Job 42:1-6 NASB20] 1 Then Job answered the LORD and said, 2 "I know that You can [do] all things, And that no plan is impossible for You. 3 'Who is this who conceals advice without knowledge?' Therefore I have declared that which I did not understand, Things too wonderful for me, which I do not know. 4 'Please listen, and I will speak; I will ask You, and You instruct me.' 5 "I have heard of You by the hearing of the ear; But now my eye sees You; 6 Therefore I retract, And I repent, [sitting] on dust and ashes."

Job repeated and reaffirmed what God was saying - Look at His engineering brilliance in the masterpiece of creation! Job heard the main points and restated and affirmed them! Do we do that?!!

Job repeated Gods exact words and confessed his guilt to Gods rhetorical charge!

Job repents! Admits Sin and asks forgiveness for


Most people deflect, argue the point, yeah BUT...or one of a thousand other debate points. Ask your partner or parent, "Am I a good listener"?!





the horses' mouths so that they will obey us, we direct their whole body as well.

[Job 19:25-27 NASB20] 25 "Yet as for me, I know that my Redeemer lives, And at the last, He will take His stand on the earth. 26 "Even after my skin is destroyed, Yet from my flesh I will see God, 27 Whom I, on my part, shall behold for myself, And [whom] my eyes will see, and not another. My heart faints within me!

Is God inscrutable? Is he so wise and good? How dare you question God! Is God above us and Beyond questioning? Its absurd to even suggest it!


Does God violate the will of humans? Is that fair? Job didn't want this!!! Why do we expect God to stop evil men then?

Does Gods honor require keeping His promises/will? Eventually Gods righteousness must reign! God will and will keep a people for Himself!



- God's Patient Will, All His Will, WILL be done!
- God's Decrees! His ultimate plan cannot be thwarted!
- He is the Author and Finisher of our faith! We ARE Saved! Secure! We have His word on it! - Ephesians 1
- Are you bowing to His Will? Or demanding yours?

God is suffering too! In a sense. He is suffering our insolence, impertinence, impudence, insubordination and rejection!

Gods Permissive Will. Satan asked permission! God permits suffering, evil and sin...for only so long! Gods longsuffering is meant to bring us to repentance! [Rom 2:4 NASB20] 4 Or do you think lightly of the riches of His kindness and restraint and patience, not knowing that the kindness of God leads you to repentance?





But while Gods sovereignty, along with His wisdom and love, is the foundation of our trustin Him, prayer is the expression of that trust




