

Look to your ledgers, they tell who you love and where you put your trust. Your checkbook is the barometer of your heart!



You can be a rich/miserable, empty hearted, friend poor person or a Poor/rich man in Christ!

This poll shows that 6 in 10 Americans believe money can buy happiness, with a hefty price tag of \$284,000 a year and \$1.2 million in the <u>bank</u>. (19%) of evangelicals give no money at all to church or charity. (2021) The average evangelical gave \$1,923 to church and \$622 to charity for a grand total of \$2,545 in the past twelve months. However, this includes many who gave nothing at all. If we just consider those who donate to church, the average giving to church is \$2,603. The average giving to charity is \$1,067 among those who give to charity.

For instance, among those who read the Bible at least once a week, 83% gave money to church in the last year. Among those who read the Bible irregularly, 53% did so. Among those who rarely or never read the Bible, only 30% gave money to a church. This pattern is repeated over and over for both church and charity with Bible readership, church attendance, online Bible study, and small group participation

half of all American evangelical Protestants give less than 1% of their household

income to church or charity.

The very youngest evangelicals show an average generosity level of 2.7% of household income, and for those 40 to 54

years old, it is actually a touch lower, at 2.5%. But this rises to 3.4% among the 55 to 69 age group, then to 5.1% for those 70 and older.

Put another way, 26% of evangelicals 70 and older qualify as tithers in our estimates, giving 8% or more of their income to church/charity. Compare this with

14% in the 55 to 69 age group, 9% who are 40 to 54, and 10% under 40.

Bankrate analyzed the spending habits of everyday Americans. In total, survey respondents (who revealed their household income and said they purchased the products included in the study) reported spending more than \$2,400, on average, per year on lottery tickets, alcohol, tobacco (or e-cigarette products) and gambling.

Randy Alcorn reckons that "15 percent of everything Christ said relates to this topic—more than his teachings on heaven and hell combined." You lack one thing: go, sell all that you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow me. (Mark 10:21)

Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. . . . But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation. (<u>Luke 6:20, 24</u>)

Any one of you who does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple. (<u>Luke</u> 14:33)



Why does Jesus express such a remarkable concern with what we do with our

money? The reason for this, it seems, is the basic principle that Jesus laid down: "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matt. 6:21; Luke 12:34). In other words, the reason money is so crucial is that what we do with it signals where our heart is. "Where our heart is" means where our worship is. When the heart is set on something, it values it, cherishes it, treasures it. That is what worship means.



Where's your treasure?


- Tithe 10% 1st! Then pay your bills



How the Grinch Stole Christmas! - 1957

How the Grinch Stole Christmas! is a Christmas children's book by Theodor "Dr. Seuss" Geisel written in rhymed verse with illustrations by the author. It follows the Grinch, a cranky, solitary creature who attempts to thwart the public's Christmas plans by stealing Christmas gifts and decorations from the homes of the nearby town of Whoville on Christmas Eve. Miraculously, the Grinch realizes that Christmas is not all about money and presents.

The story was published as a book by Random House in 1957, and at approximately the same time in an issue of Redbook. [2] The book criticizes the commercialization of Christmas and the holiday season. [3]

Dr. Seuss wrote the book quickly and was mostly finished with it within a few weeks. [8] Biographers Judith and Neil Morgan wrote that it was the easiest book of his career to write, except for its conclusion. [5]

Dr. Seuss claimed he was the inspiration for the character, as his wife's health problems and his dismay with the commercialization of Christmas made him feel "very Grinchish" as he looked in the mirror one year on December 26. [6][7] Cohen notes that Seuss drove a car with a license plate that read "GRINCH". [15]

According to Dr. Seuss:

I got hung up getting the Grinch out of the mess. I got into a situation where I

sounded like a second-rate preacher or some biblical truism... Finally in desperation... without making any statement whatever, I showed the Grinch and the Whos together at the table, and made a pun of the Grinch carving the 'roast beast'. ... I had gone through thousands of religious choices, and then after three months it came out like that. [5]



Why its believed this book was deeply biblical-spiritual

- Use of a Bible name
- It's a story of Redemption, even so much as the rich! Mt.19:23-26
- The opening story line <u>Marley was dead</u>. We are dead in our trespasses and sins
- It occurs on Christmas
- Tiny Tims comment in Church!
- Mention of an Idol

"It matters little," she said, softly. "To you, very little. Another idol has displaced me; and if it can cheer and comfort you in time to come, as I have tried to do, I have no just cause to grieve . . . I have seen your nobler aspirations

fall off one by one, until the master-passion, Gain, engrosses you. Have I not." (Charles Dickens, 1843).

We learn of the object of this faith when, arriving home from church on Christmas Day, Bob Cratchit shares with the family how that Tiny Tim "hoped the people saw him in the church, because he was a cripple, and it might be pleasant to them to remember upon Christmas Day, who made lame beggars walk, and blind men see" (Dickens).

For Scrooge, upon seeing the certain hopeless end of the path he'd chosen and feeling the convicting finger point "from the grave to him, and back again", he uttered a cry of repentance and pleaded for some hope of salvation: "hear me! I am not the man I was'... For the first time the hand appeared to shake... 'Assure me that I yet may change these shadows you have shown me, by an altered life!" (Dickens).

Sadly, Ebenezer Scrooge doesn't get any positive assurance to this end, though the final stanza of the carol shows Scrooge a changed man and intimates that, as he changed, so his end would change.

As for us, we have a certain hope. God's Word assures us "that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved" (Romans 10:9).

They are cheapskates, skinflints, stiffs, tightwads.

"Samuel took a stone and set it up between Mizpah and Shen. He named it Ebenezer, saying, 'Thus far the LORD has helped us'" (verse 12). Ebenezer means "stone of help."

Scrooge's story is timeless because it is a spiritual story. His transformation echoes that of Zaccheus (<u>Luke 19</u>), the counterpoint to the rich young ruler whose inability to loosen his grasp on the things of this world introduces Christ's teaching that "it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God" (<u>Matthew 19:24</u>). When we first meet Scrooge, he is that rich man. His love of money has nearly extinguished the sparks of love and joy that sputter fitfully among the gathering shadows of his dark heart. His lamentable condition is brought into stark relief by being examined in the glow of Christmas, "a kind, forgiving, charitable, pleasant time" when shut-up hearts are opened to let in the light of kindness and reflect it back again.

[Luk 19:1-10 NASB20] 1 [Jesus] entered Jericho and was passing through. 2 And there was a man called by the name of Zaccheus; he was a chief tax collector and he was rich. 3 [Zaccheus] was trying to see who Jesus was, and he was unable due to the crowd, because he was short in stature. 4 So he ran on ahead and climbed up a sycamore tree in order to see Him, because He was about to pass through that [way.] 5 And when Jesus came to the place, He looked up and said to him, "Zaccheus, hurry and come down, for today I must stay at your house." 6 And he hurried and came down, and received Him joyfully. 7 When [the people] saw [this,] they all [began] to complain, saying, "He has gone in to be the guest of a man who is a sinner!" 8 But Zaccheus stopped and said to the Lord, "Behold, Lord, half of my possessions I am giving to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone, I am giving back four times as much." 9 And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, because he, too, is a son of Abraham. 10 "For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost."
