
Jas 5:11 tells the story of Job in a way some people find hard to believe, do you? Jas 5:11 We count those blessed who endured. You have heard of the endurance of Job and have seen the outcome of the Lord's dealings, that the Lord is full of compassion and [is] merciful.

Job: the Lord is full of compassion and is merciful

Ja.5:11, **Job 42:7-17**

- The book of Job is a hard road but we've finally arrived, how do you read the final result?
- Jas 5:11 tells the story of Job in a way some people find hard to believe, do you?
- Job 42:9 says "the LORD accepted Job." What does this say to us and especially in context?

- Please list all that God gave Job double of! What was not stated in Ch.42 that was in Ch.1:3? What else did he receive that wasn't listed? Job 1:3, Job 42:12, Job 42:13
- Why was Job only blessed with 10 new children when he had 10 before, isn't he supposed to receive double, 20 new children? Is it to show that some things cant be replaced? Or is this something else?
- Ja.5:11 uses a few different words for Jobs character, depending on the translation you use. What different words are used and how does it impact your understanding?
- Job is also highly regarded in Eze 14:20 and vs.14. Who is he mentioned with and why?
- "Then all his brothers, all his sisters, and all who had known him before came to him". Why did the scripture not mention them until now? Job 19:13-14,
- Verse 11 says "all the adversities that the LORD had brought on him" but Job 1-2 tells us it was Satan's doing, at Gods permission. So how do we reconcile the 2 passages?
- Job 42:17 "And Job died, an old man and full of days." reminds us that death is inevitable, even when blessed!

in the presence of the Lord, and He will exalt you.

[Job 22:29 NASB20] 29 "When they have brought [you] low, you will speak with confidence, And **He will save the humble person**.



even four generations.

[Job 42:12, 16-17 NASB20] 12 **The LORD blessed the latter [days] of Job more than his beginning**; and he had fourteen thousand sheep, six thousand camels, a thousand yoke of oxen, and a thousand female donkeys. ... <u>16 After this, Job lived 140 years</u>, and saw his sons and his grandsons, four generations. 17 And Job died, an old man and <u>full of days.</u>

Parents; Would you want 10 more babies, after having raised 10 children to adulthood? 50's at least!

What did he tell the new children? Did the new kids ask about their dead siblings? And How they died?! And what that means for them?

His age here also gives a hint as to the epoch of time, around Abraham

Job was accepted, restored and doubled!

- Job 42:9 the LORD accepted Job. (prayer?)
- Job 42:10 the <u>LORD also restored the fortunes of</u> <u>Job</u> when he prayed for his friends, and <u>the LORD</u> increased double all that Job had.
- Why Double? Is it about stuff? H/W/P?
- Elisha said, "Please let a double portion"
 Deut 21:17
- What blessing wasn't mentioned as being doubled?

Would it have been difficult for Job to pray for his friends after all their accusations against him? He called them miserable comforters!

H/W/P Health/Wealth/Prosperity

[Job 42:8-9 NASB20] 8 "Now therefore, take for yourselves seven bulls and seven rams, and go to My servant Job, and offer up a burnt offering for yourselves, and My servant Job will pray for you. For I will accept him so as not to do with you [as your] foolishness [deserves,] because you have not spoken of Me what is trustworthy, as My servant Job [has.]" 9 So Eliphaz the Temanite, Bildad the Shuhite, [and] Zophar the Naamathite went and did as the LORD told them; and the LORD accepted Job.

Job 42:10 NASB20] 10 The LORD also restored the fortunes of Job when he prayed for his friends, and the LORD increased double all that Job had.


[Job 42:10 NASB20] 10 The LORD also restored the fortunes of Job when he prayed for his friends, and the LORD increased double all that Job had.

[Job 42:12 NASB20] 12 The LORD blessed the latter [days] of Job more than his beginning; and he had fourteen thousand sheep, six thousand camels, a thousand yoke of oxen, and a thousand female donkeys.

[Job 42:13 NASB20] 13 He also had seven sons and three daughters.

[Job 42:14-15 He named the first <u>Jemimah</u>, the second Keziah, and the third Keren-happuch. 15 In all the land no women were found as beautiful as Job's daughters; and their father gave them inheritances among their brothers.

<u>and very many servants</u>; and <u>that man was the greatest of all the men of the east</u>. LEGENDARY!!

While likely having <u>double the servants</u> (needed and affordable now) but He is known NOW as THE Servant of the Lord!

Now he is the greatest of all the men in the Bible/time/world

10 children before, NOT 20 now?
Exactly 7 sons and 3 daughters, like before!
Their names and beauty were accentuated!
Their lot was improved, equal shares to their brothers!
Christianity has done more for women thru history than any other Religion/movement!!!

Heres a Question to Consider: IF God would've first offered Job the choice to go through all this to get DOUBLE the Stuff, would he have accepted? Maybe for the next 10 children??

What IF God would've offered Job the choice knowing how God would use his life and story to inform and equip the saints for 4000 years to face their own suffering? And bring Glory to God! Would job have accepted then?

Job would not likely have accepted this test for douible the donkeys and camels, but he likely would've to be used to bless Gods people and bring God glory

God is a game changer! Reverse the curse!

- 10 children before, NOT 20 now?
- You see, 10 were in Heaven, 10 more on earth! 20!!
- What more could any believer ever ask/desire?
- Job's health?? Doubled? Lived 140 more years!
- Job <u>SAW</u> God! His faith was 2x pure! Or more!
- Job was/IS being used of God way more than before!
- Who was Daniel w/o the lions, David w/o Giants ...

What works? Look at the end result!


What more could any believer ever ask/desire? Than to know ALL your children are in heaven!!!

According to Genesis 25:7-8, <u>Abraham was 175 years old when he died</u> "Abraham lived a hundred and seventy-five years. Then Abraham breathed his last and died at a good old age, an old man and full of years; and he was gathered to his people."



Did you KNOW?!! Job's example and story is so famous, he is commended 2x more in scripture in Elite company! Noah, Daniel and Elijah!

Eze 14:14, 20 NASB20] 14 even [though] these three men, <u>Noah, Daniel, and Job</u> were in its midst, by their [own] righteousness they could [only] save themselves," declares the Lord GOD. ...

20 even [though] Noah, Daniel, and Job were in its midst, as I live," declares the Lord GOD, "they could not save either [their] son or [their] daughter. They would save only themselves by their righteousness."

Could ONLY save themselves has always been true, See Ezek.18

All of these Men Suffered greatly. Noah for 120 or 70 years of building an Ark/mocked, but Hearing the screams of the drowning would've been awful, Daniels whole life from youth in captivity, Jobs was mire acute/intense but only days/weeks?

Genesis 6:3, where God declared that man's days shall be 120 years: "And the Lord said, My spirit shall not always strive with man, for that he also is flesh: yet his days shall be an hundred and twenty years."

Noah didn't have his first son of record until he was 500 years old, and the Flood

came 100 years later (Genesis 7:6).

Eze 14:14, 16, 18, 20-23 NASB20] 14 even [though] these three men, Noah, Daniel, and Job were in its midst, by their [own] righteousness they could [only] save themselves," declares the Lord GOD. ...

16 [though] these three men were in its midst, as I live," declares the Lord GOD, "they could not save either [their] sons or [their] daughters. They alone would be saved, but the country would be desolate. ...

[Eze 18:2-5, 9-11, 13-14, 17-26, 29 NASB20] 2 "What do you [people] mean by using this proverb about the land of Israel, saying, 'The fathers eat sour grapes, But [it is] the children's teeth [that] have become blunt'? 3 "As I live," declares the Lord GOD, "you certainly are not going to use this proverb in Israel anymore. 4 "Behold, all souls are Mine; the soul of the father as well as the soul of the son is Mine. The soul who sins will die. 5 "But if a man is righteous and practices justice and righteousness, ... 9 [if] he walks in My statutes and keeps My ordinances so as to deal faithfully--he is righteous [and] will certainly live," declares the Lord GOD. 10 "However, he may father a violent son who sheds blood, and does any one of these things to a brother 11 (though he himself did not do any of these things), that is, he even eats at the mountain [shrines,] and defiles his neighbor's wife, ... 13 lends [money] at interest and takes interest; will he live? He will not live! He has committed all these abominations, he shall certainly be put to death; his blood will be on himself. 14 "Now behold, he has fathered a son who saw all his father's sins which he committed, but he has seen [them] and does not do likewise. ... 17 he keeps his hand from the poor, does not take [any kind of] interest [on loans, but] executes My ordinances, [and] walks in My statutes; he will not die for his father's guilt, he will certainly live. 18 "As for his father, because he practiced extortion, robbed [his] brother, and did what was not good among his people, behold, he will

die for his guilt. 19 "Yet you say, 'Why should the son not suffer [the punishment] for the father's guilt?' When the son has practiced justice and righteousness [and] has kept all My statutes and done them, he shall certainly live. 20 "The person who sins will die. A son will not suffer [the punishment] for the father's guilt, nor will a father suffer [the punishment] for the son's guilt; the righteousness of the righteous will be upon himself, and the wickedness of the wicked will be upon himself. 21 "But if the wicked person turns from all his sins which he has committed and keeps all My statutes and practices justice and righteousness, he shall certainly live; he shall not die. 22 "All his offenses which he has committed will not be remembered against him; because of his righteousness which he has practiced, he will live. 23 "Do I take any pleasure in the death of the wicked," declares the Lord GOD, "rather than that he would turn from his ways and live? 24 "But when a righteous person turns away from his righteousness, commits injustice [and] does according to all the abominations that the wicked person does, will he live? All his righteous deeds which he has done will not be remembered for his treachery which he has committed and his sin which he has committed; for them he will die. 25 "Yet you say, 'The way of the Lord is not right.' Hear now, house of Israel! Is My way not right? Is it not your ways that are not right? 26 "When a righteous person turns away from his righteousness, commits injustice and dies because of it, for his injustice which he has committed he dies. ... 29 "But the house of Israel says, 'The way of the Lord is not right.' Are My ways not right, house of Israel? Is it not your ways that are not right?

Noah, Daniel and Job represent ...

- 3 <u>different epochs of time</u>; before flood, time of the Hebrews, after the promised land and in Exile
- All were <u>notable men of character</u>! Noah had a flaw. Job is listed last here but 2nd in history, personal pain!
- Each were persecuted for their faith, miracles saved

[Eze 14:14, 20 NASB20] 14 even [though] these three men, <u>Noah, Daniel, and Job</u> were in its midst, by their [own] righteousness they could [only] save themselves," declares the Lord GOD. ...

20 even [though] <u>Noah, Daniel, and Job</u> were in its midst, as I live," declares the Lord GOD, "they could not save either [their] son or [their] daughter. They would save only themselves by their righteousness."

All 3 men were mocked by men but in the end were blessed! Noah's mockers drowned, Daniels mockers were eaten by lions! Jobs mockers were prayed for and spared

2 had children; Noah and Job, Noah is my great, greatgrandpa!

2 had books of Bible named after them; Job and Daniel

2 Suffered over Long periods of time: Noah and Daniel

Probably No one would desire the full measure of any of their callings Its also interesting to note Families saved for Noah and Job, when the text says they couldn't save their families!!

Also interesting to Note Daniel didn't have a family, he may have been a Eunuch!?!!

Daniel 1:3 indicates Daniel and his friends were under the authority of the "chief eunuch"

2 Kings 20:18) 'And they shall take away some of your sons who will descend from you, whom you will beget; and they shall be eunuchs in the palace of the king of Babylon.'

[Isa 56:3 NASB20] 3 Let not the foreigner who has joined himself to the LORD say, "The LORD will certainly separate me from His people." Nor let the eunuch say, "Behold, I am a dry tree."

Noah knew God wasn't angry with him, Daniel didn't feel it personally, job did!

Noah gave us a Rainbow and the story of the 1st GLOBAL Judgment Daniel gave us Gods working in His people while Captive and the best prophecies for the end of the world, the 2nd GLOBAL judgment Job gave us hope for the individual in personal suffering but also more info about life after death than most of the OT, Daniel adds a verse!

Each of them knew the Lord in pronounced and personal ways!! <u>Each were Prophets!</u> Job didn't think of himself as one How many of us would've loved the glory/privileges of these men?!! But would we still now that we know the cost?!!!

Each of these men Were Tip of the spear! They had no friends or were the Patriarchs, go to guys! No one above them!


No one listened to Noah! Except his kids/wives, While other Jews compromised, Daniel resolved to not! Job was criticized by his close friends and abandoned by the rest!

Job 5:18-20 "For He inflicts pain, and gives relief; He wounds, but His hands [also] heal. 19 "In six troubles He will save you; Even in seven, evil will not touch you. 20 "In famine He will redeem you from death, And in war, from the power of the sword.

Job 22:24-25 NASB20] 24 And put [your] gold in the dust, And [the gold of] Ophir among the stones of the brooks, 25 Then the Almighty will be your gold And abundant silver to you.

Noah, Daniel and Job represent ...

- Each were **persecuted for their faith**, miracles saved
- Different types of judgement, yet God Saves His own!
 - Noah God's wrath on entire planet, over a year on ark
 - Daniel the World, jealous/hateful power-hungry men
 - · Job Satan himself assaulted him!



<u>G5278</u> ὑπομείναντας ὑπομένω hypomenō endured, patience, perseverance, patient continuing, Steadfastness

This verse has 4 words translated differently

- 1. We **count/consider** them
- 2. Blessed/Happy
- 3. Patience/Persevered/Endured/Steadfastness
- 4. Pitiful/Compassion

[Jas 5:11 KJV] 11 Behold, we count them <u>happy</u> which <u>endure</u>. Ye have heard of <u>the patience</u> of Job, and have seen the end of the Lord; that the Lord is very <u>pitiful</u>, and of <u>tender mercy</u>.

[<u>Jas 5:11 NIV</u>] 11 As you know, we count as blessed those who have <u>persevered</u>. You have heard of Job's <u>perseverance</u> and have seen what the Lord finally brought about. The Lord is full of <u>compassion and mercy</u>.

[Jas 5:11 NASB20] 11 We count those <u>blessed</u> who <u>endured</u>. You have heard of <u>the endurance</u> of Job and have seen the outcome of the Lord's dealings, that the Lord is full of <u>compassion and [is] merciful</u>.

ESV Behold, we consider those blessed who <u>remained steadfast</u>. You have heard

of <u>the steadfastness</u> of Job, and you have seen the purpose of the Lord, how the Lord is compassionate and merciful.

NLT We give **great honor** to those who **endure** under suffering. For instance, you know about Job, a man of **great endurance**. You can see how **the Lord was kind** to him at the end, for the Lord is **full of tenderness and mercy**.

[1Co 13:4 NASB20] 4 Love is patient, love is kind, it is not jealous; love does not brag, it is not arrogant.

NKJV <u>Love suffers long</u> and is kind; love does not envy; love does not parade itself, is not puffed up;

- 1. <u>Ja.5 Context is to encourage US Saints As we see the Apocalypse arriving to also be Patient!! Hes coming Again!</u>
- 2. Also to see the power of prayer, including confession and intercession for others!
- 3. Don't complain!
- 4. And as Ja. 1 says,
- 5. Finally, trials are blessings IF it brings people to salvation!!! Elijah prayed for it not to rain! the one who has turned a sinner from the error of his way will save his soul from death and cover a multitude of sins.

Jas 5:7-20 NASB20] 7 Therefore be patient, brothers [and sisters,] until the coming of the Lord. The farmer waits for the precious produce of the soil, being patient about it, until it gets the early and late rains. 8 You too be patient; strengthen your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is near. 9 Do not complain, brothers [and sisters,] against one another, so that you may not be judged; behold, the Judge is standing right at the door. 10 As an example, brothers [and sisters,] of suffering and patience, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord. 11 We count those blessed who endured. You have heard of the endurance of Job and have seen the outcome of the Lord's dealings, that the Lord is full of compassion and [is] merciful. 12 But above all, my brothers [and sisters,] do not swear, either by heaven or by earth or with any other oath; but your yes is to be yes, and your no, no, so that you do not fall under judgment. 13 Is anyone among you suffering? [Then] he must pray. Is anyone cheerful? He is to sing praises. 14 Is anyone among you sick? [Then] he must call for the elders of the church and they are to pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; 15 and the prayer of faith will restore the one who is sick, and the Lord will raise him up, and if he has committed sins, they will be forgiven him. 16 Therefore, confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another so that you may be healed. A prayer of a righteous person, when it is brought about, can accomplish much. 17 Elijah was a man with a nature like ours, and he prayed earnestly that it would not rain, and it did not rain on the earth for three years and six months. 18 Then he prayed again, and the sky poured rain and the earth produced its fruit. 19 My brothers [and sisters,] if anyone among you strays from the truth and someone turns him back, 20 let him know that the one who has turned a sinner from the error of his way will save his soul from death and cover a multitude of sins.

[Mar 13:13 NASB20] 13 "And you will be hated by everyone because of My name, but it is the one who has endured[G5278] to the end who will be saved.

[Rom 12:12 NASB20] 12 rejoicing in hope, persevering[G5278] in tribulation, devoted to prayer,

[1Co 13:7 NASB20] 7 it keeps every confidence, it believes all things, hopes all things, endures[G5278] all things.

[2Ti 2:10, 12 NASB20] 10 For this reason I endure[G5278] all things for the sake of those who are chosen, so that they also may obtain the salvation which is in Christ Jesus [and] with [it] eternal glory. ... 12 If we endure[G5278], we will also reign with Him; If we deny Him, He will also deny us;

[Heb 10:32 NASB20] 32 But remember the former days, when, after being enlightened, you endured[G5278] a great conflict of sufferings,

[Heb 12:2-3, 7 looking only at Jesus, the originator and perfecter of the faith, who for the joy set before Him endured[G5278] the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. 3 For consider Him who has endured[G5278] such hostility by sinners against Himself, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart. ... 7 It is for discipline that you endure[G5278]; God deals with you as with sons; for what son is there whom [his] father does not discipline? [Jas 1:12 NASB20] 12 Blessed is a man who perseveres[G5278] under trial; for once he has been approved, he will receive the crown of life which [the Lord] has promised to those who love Him.

[Jas 5:11 NASB20] 11 We count those blessed who endured[G5278]. You have heard of the endurance of Job and have seen the outcome of the Lord's dealings, that the Lord is full of compassion and [is] merciful.

[1Pe 2:20 For what credit is there if, when you sin and are harshly treated, you endure[G5278] it with[G5278] patience[G5278]? But if when you do what is right and suffer [for it] you patiently[G5278] endure[G5278] it, this [finds] favor with God.

[Luk 8:15 NASB20] 15 "But the [seed] in the good soil, these are the ones who have heard the word with a good and virtuous heart, and hold it firmly, and produce fruit with perseverance[G5281].

[Luk 21:19 NASB20] 19 "By your endurance[G5281] you will gain your lives.

[Rom 2:7 NASB20] 7 to those who by perseverance[G5281] in doing good seek glory, honor, and immortality, [He will give] eternal life;

[Rom 5:3-4 NASB20] 3 And not only [this,] but we also celebrate in our tribulations, knowing that tribulation brings about perseverance[G5281]; 4 and

perseverance[G5281], proven character; and proven character, hope; [Rom 8:25 NASB20] 25 But if we hope for what we do not see, through perseverance[G5281] we wait eagerly [for it.]

Symbolism, Themes, and Metaphors in "Moby Dick" Essay

The novel Moby Dick written by Herman Melville is very ambiguous and is full of symbolism, themes, and metaphors. The characters of the book resonate from the Bible and the novel begins with a Biblical quote from the book of Job. Moby Dick explains the relationship between human beings and others, the value of life, and a whaling lore. The novel is told by Ishmael who divulges of a journey on the Pequod ship with Captain Ahab. Captain Ahab is the main protagonist of the story and is pursuing a whale; Moby Dick. Ishmael is on the quest to find the real meaning of life and thus follows life at sea. The whale, Moby Dick a great deal of chaos among the ship and is chased by several other ships when he is seen. Moby Dick is a novel that is rich in ironic themes. The purpose of this paper is to analyze some of the themes and characters from this novel.

Defiance is a theme that can be found pervasively in Moby Dick. Father Mapple, a former whale man and current preacher, prepares the reader to consider the theme of defiance through his sermon derived from Jonah and the Whale in Chapter 9. Jonah was called on by God to preach in Nineveh. Instead, he attempts to run away to another country where God does not rule. As Jonah tries to escape, his punishments become harsher and harsher. It later occurs to Jonah that God is everywhere. When Jonah is swallowed by a whale, he prays to God in it's belly. He submits to preaching in Nineveh and only then does God bring Jonah to safety. Jonah later comes to learn that for one to follow God, one must lay aside their vanity and wishes to follow the will of God. Father Mapple states that for "one to obey God, he should first disobey himself." The telling of Jonah's preaching is parallel to Ishmael's eventual whaling story where he is the lone survivor of the Pequod's ship.

Captain Ahab is an ungodly man who shows defiance by fighting against God's will and the rules of nature. After Starbucks suggested that it was "blasphemous" to seek revenge on Moby Dick for attacking him, Ahab states that he would even hit the sun if it insulted him, further illustrating his egotistic character. He wears his defiance proudly and does not worship or acknowledge any superior forces. The whale, Moby Dick is used symbolically to represent the regime that Ahab is fighting against. The leadership and experiences of Father Mapple implies that God himself is the pilot of the ships, further suggesting that the White
