




By looking at your tongue a doctor can tell a lot about our physical condition.


Ever have an instantaneous verbal response that came from your mouth that surprised even you? What was it? Are you shocked or shamed?

Who of us hasn't said things we were ashamed of?



Silence returned to the house, so the burglar crept forward again. 'Jesus is watching you',


the voice rang out again. The thief stopped dead again. He was frightened out of his wits. Frantically, he looked all around. In a dark





[Pro 4:23-24 NASB20] 23 <u>Watch over your heart with all diligence</u>, For from it [flow] the springs of life. 24 Rid yourself of a deceitful mouth And keep devious speech far from you.

[Pro 10:19 NASB20] 19 When there are many words, wrongdoing is unavoidable, But one who restrains his lips is wise.

[Pro 12:13 NASB20] 13 An evil person is ensnared by the offense of his lips, But the righteous will escape from trouble.

[Eph 6:1-3 NASB20] 1 Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. 2 HONOR YOUR FATHER AND MOTHER (which is the first commandment with a promise), 3 SO THAT IT MAY TURN OUT WELL FOR YOU, AND THAT YOU MAY LIVE LONG ON THE EARTH. [Col 3:20 NASB20] 20 Children, obey your parents in everything, for this is pleasing to the Lord.

[Exo 23:6-7 NASB20] 6 "You shall not pervert the justice [due] to your needy [brother] in his dispute. 7 "Keep far from a false charge, and do not kill the innocent or the righteous, for I will not acquit the guilty.

[Lev 19:11, 16 NASB20] 11 'You shall not steal, nor deal falsely, nor lie to one another. ... 16 'You shall not go about as a slanderer among your people; [and] you are not to jeopardize the life of your neighbor. I am the LORD.

[Deu 19:15-16 NASB20] 15 "A single witness shall not rise up against a person regarding any wrongdoing or any sin that he commits; on the testimony of two or three witnesses a matter shall be confirmed. 16 "If a malicious witness rises up against a person to testify against him of wrongdoing,

[Psa 15:3 NASB20] 3 He does not slander with his tongue, Nor do evil to his neighbor, Nor bring shame on his friend;

[Eph 4:31 NASB20] 31 All bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor, and slander must be removed from you, along with all malice.




Throat, Tongues, Lips, Mouth

[Rom 3:11-12 THERE IS <u>NO ONE WHO UNDERSTANDS</u>, THERE IS <u>NO ONE WHO</u> <u>SEEKS OUT GOD</u>; 12 THEY HAVE <u>ALL TURNED ASIDE</u>, <u>TOGETHER THEY HAVE</u> <u>BECOME CORRUPT</u>; THERE IS <u>NO ONE WHO DOES GOOD</u>, THERE IS <u>NOT EVEN</u> <u>ONE."</u>

So that every mouth may be Silenced!

 Romans 3:19 - ... now we know that whatever the Law says, it speaks to those who are under the Law, so that every mouth may be closed and all the world may become accountable to God;



Col 3:8 But now you also, rid yourselves of all of them: anger, wrath, malice, slander, [and] obscene speech from your mouth.

[Eph 5:4 NASB20] 4 and [there must be no] filthiness or foolish talk, or vulgar joking, which are not fitting, but rather giving of thanks.

[Eph 5:3 NASB20] 3 But sexual immorality or any impurity or greed must not even be mentioned among you, as is proper among saints;

[Col 3:9 NASB20] 9 Do not lie to one another, since you stripped off the old self with its [evil] practices,

[Eph 4:31-32 NASB20] 31 All bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor, and slander must be removed from you, along with all malice. 32 Be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving each other, just as God in Christ also has forgiven you. - Job 40:4-5 "Behold, I am insignificant; what can I say in response to You? I put my hand on my mouth. I have spoken once, and I will not reply; or twice, and I will add nothing [more]." -2:10

<u>Even 3 of the Greats sinned with their lips</u>! It may have been their only visible sin

[Isa 6:5-6 NASB20] 5 Then I said, "Woe to me, for I am ruined! Because I am a man of unclean lips, And I live among a people of unclean lips; For my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of armies." 6 Then one of the seraphim flew to me with a burning coal in his hand, which he had taken from the altar with tongs.


[Job 40:4-5 NASB20] 4 "Behold, I am insignificant; what can I say in response to You? I put my hand on my mouth. 5 "I have spoken once, and I will not reply; Or twice, and I will add nothing [more.]"

[Job 42:3, 6 NASB20] 3 'Who is this who conceals advice without knowledge?' Therefore I have declared that which I did not understand, Things too wonderful for me, which I do not know. ... 6 Therefore I retract, And I repent, [sitting] on dust and ashes."

[Job 1:22 NASB20] 22 Despite all this, Job did not sin, nor did he blame God. [Job 2:10 NASB20] 10 But he said to her, "You are speaking as one of the foolish women speaks. <u>Shall we actually accept good from God but not accept</u> <u>adversity?" Despite all this, Job did not sin with his lips.</u>

[Mat 16:13-19, 22-24 NASB20] 13 Now when Jesus came into the region of Caesarea Philippi, He was asking His disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" 14 And they said, "Some [say] John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; and [still] others, Jeremiah, or one of the [other] prophets." 15 He said to them, "But who do you vourselves say that I am?" 16 Simon Peter answered, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." 17 And Jesus said to him, "Blessed are you, Simon Barjona, because flesh and blood did not reveal [this] to you, but My Father who is in heaven. 18 "And I also say to you that you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build My church; and the gates of Hades will not overpower it. 19 "I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; and whatever you bind on earth shall have been bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall have been loosed in heaven." ... 22 And [yet] Peter took Him aside and began to rebuke Him, saying, "God forbid it, Lord! This shall never happen to You!" 23 But He turned and said to Peter, "Get behind Me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to Me; for you are not setting your mind on God's purposes, but men's." 24 Then Jesus said to His disciples, "If anyone wants to come after Me, he must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow Me.

[Mat 26:35, 48, 60-61, 69-75 NASB20] 35 Peter said to Him, "Even if I have to die with You, I will not deny You!" All the disciples said the same thing as well. ... 48 Now he who was betraying Him gave them a sign [previously,] saying, "Whomever I kiss, He is [the one;] arrest Him." ... 60 They did not find [any,] even though many false witnesses came forward. But later on two came forward, 61 and said, "This man stated, 'I am able to destroy the temple of God and to rebuild it in three days." ... 69 Now Peter was sitting outside in the courtyard, and a slave woman came to him and said, "You too were with Jesus the Galilean." 70 But he denied [it] before them all, saying, "I do not know what you are talking about." 71 When he had gone out to the gateway, another [slave woman] saw him and said to those who were there, "This man was with Jesus of Nazareth." 72 And again he denied [it,] with an oath: "I do not know the man." 73 A little later the bystanders came up and said to Peter, "You really are [one] of them as well, since even the way you talk gives you away." 74 Then he began to curse and swear, "I do not know the Man!" And immediately a rooster crowed. 75 And Peter remembered the statement that Jesus had made: "Before a rooster crows, you will deny Me three times." And he went out and wept bitterly.






Proverbs 18:21, "Death and life are in the power of the tongue: and they that love it shall eat the fruit thereof."

[Pro 15:7 NASB20] 7 The lips of the wise spread knowledge, But the hearts of fools are not so.

[Pro 16:24 NASB20] 24 Pleasant words are a honeycomb, Sweet to the soul and healing to the bones.

[Pro 25:11 NASB20] 11 [Like] apples of gold in settings of silver, Is a word spoken at the proper time.

[Pro 24:26 NASB20] 26 One who gives a right answer Kisses the lips.


[Ecc 12:10 NASB20] 10 The Preacher sought to find delightful words and to write words of truth correctly.

[Isa 50:4 NASB20] 4 The Lord GOD has given Me the tongue of disciples, So that I may know how to sustain the weary one with a word. He awakens [Me] morning by morning, He awakens My ear to listen as a disciple.

[1Pe 3:14-16 NASB20] 14 But even if you should suffer for the sake of righteousness, you are blessed. AND DO NOT FEAR THEIR INTIMIDATION, AND DO NOT BE IN DREAD, 15 but sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts, always [being] ready to make a defense to everyone who asks you to give an account for the hope that is in you, but with gentleness and respect; 16 and keep a good conscience so that in the thing in which you are slandered, those who disparage your good behavior in Christ will be put to shame.

Seasoned with salt

• Colossians 4:6 - Your speech [must] always [be] with grace, [as though] seasoned with salt, so that you will know how you should respond to each person.



"I didn't mean it" ??? Then why did you say it?

Like a Maniac shooting flaming arrows of death is one who deceives their neighbor and says I was only joking!

[Pro 26:18-28 NASB20] 18 Like a maniac who shoots Flaming arrows, arrows, and death, 19 So is a person who deceives his neighbor, And says, "Was I not joking?" 20 For lack of wood the fire goes out, And where there is no gossiper, quarreling quiets down. 21 [Like] charcoal to hot embers and wood to fire, So is a contentious person to kindle strife. 22 The words of a gossiper are like dainty morsels, And they go down into the innermost parts of the body. 23 [Like] an earthenware vessel overlaid with silver impurities Are burning lips and a wicked heart. 24 One who hates disguises [it] with his lips, But he harbors deceit in his heart. 25 When he speaks graciously, do not believe him, Because there are seven abominations in his heart. 26 [Though his] hatred covers itself with deception, His wickedness will be revealed in the assembly. 27 One who digs a pit will fall into it, And one who rolls a stone, it will come back on him. 28 A lying tongue hates those it crushes, And a flattering mouth works ruin.

Pro 12:18 There is one who speaks rashly like the thrusts of a sword, But the

tongue of the wise brings healing.

[Pro 25:18 NASB20] 18 [Like] a club, a sword, and a sharp arrow Is a person who gives false testimony against his neighbor.

[Psa 52:2 NASB20] 2 Your tongue devises destruction, Like a sharp razor, you worker of deceit.

William McPherson--the man who read the Bible with his tongue

I. How much do you value a Bible?

A. This man made an effort.

William McPherson was severely injured when a charge of dynamite exploded in front of his face. Although he survived the blast, he lost both hands, both eyes, and the feeling in parts of his face. He was a new Christian and he realized how much the Bible meant to him. He needed its strength now more than ever, but he couldn't read it. William heard that a woman in Britain had learned to read Braille with her lips, so he ordered portions of the Bible in Braille. When it arrived, he was dismayed to discover that the explosion had deadened the nerves in his lips so that no sense of touch remained. But then he found his tongue was able to feel the raised dots. Although the metal left his lips and tongue bleeding and very sore, he prayed to God to help him continue to learn just one letter of the alphabet. A teacher was able to help him learn the Moon Type system of Braille, which uses simplified figures instead of dots. In the 65 years that followed, this Kansas City man read the Bible through four times with his tongue. Sometimes hearing other people's passion for God's Word helps inspire our own. One person—William McPherson—had a commitment to Scripture that was remarkable.

He was a Scottish quarry worker who came to America in 1893 and settled outside of Denver. A hard worker, William eventually earned the spot of quarry superintendent. Though he had a number of admirable traits, he tended to be a bit impatient at times.

One day his impatience got the best of him and he grabbed a live stick of dynamite. It exploded while he was hovered over it. They were hours away from a doctor, but thanks to the efforts of his coworkers, he didn't die.

Unfortunately, though, the accident left him with no hands, little feeling in his face, and no eyesight. From that moment on, he was blind.

Up to this point in his life he had lived for himself, reckless and free. Now, he was entirely dependent on others to help him get by. On several occasions before, others had tried to share Christ with him; now, due to his accident, he was in a place to listen.

He gave his heart to the Lord in the coming months but was not satisfied by simply having someone read Scripture to him. He longed for the ability to read it for himself.

His injury was taxing to those around him, though— emotionally, physically, and financially. Eventually, his family found themselves unable to take care of him so he entered a home in Illinois for the aged and disabled.

Day in and day out he lived in darkness and solitude. He lived out the repetitive mornings, the same-song afternoons, and the identical evenings, armed with little more than his new-found hope in Christ.

It was desperately lonely, and he had little hope that anything about his life would change until he died.

At the nearby school, lecturers would come and speak about various topics that the people in the home were facing. One day he learned of a young blind girl who had learned Braille and was able to read her Bible with her fingertips. William couldn't do this because the explosion had taken his hands.

Over time, this young girl lost the feeling in her own hands and was distraught. She brought the Bible to her lips one day to kiss it goodbye, and to her amazement, felt something. She discovered that she could feel the raised letters with her lips!

The story of this young girl had William pondering whether there was hope for him. He had lived in blackness for five years when God sent a blind girl named Anna Johnson to the home to work with some of the blind patients.

Working with William proved to be frustrating, though: he had no hands, so conventional reading wouldn't work. He had no feeling in his face, so the technique the little girl had adopted wouldn't work either, although they tried many times.

One day William asked Anna when she was about to go home for the day, if she could leave with him one of the little cards they had been practicing with.

He kept trying to feel the little raised bumps with different parts of his body, when he realized he had not prayed and asked God for help. So he earnestly begged God for help. The next time he raised the card to his lips, his tongue slipped out and brushed the paper. To his astonishment, he could feel the raised letters with his tongue! He couldn't wait for Anna to come back so he could tell her.

With Anna's help, William learned how to read braille with his tongue. In the 65 years that followed, and after much bleeding and soreness, William McPherson read the entire Bible four times with his tongue.

I am absolutely blown away by this man. His example leaves those of us who can see with no excuse. God forbid we die and stand next to William in heaven, and we can't say that we have read the Bible once with all parts of our body functioning properly. That would be a true tragedy.

The year I heard this, I happened to be in the middle of reading the Bible in its entirety for the first time. At the end of the year, on December 31, I went to Robby in tears and told him, "If I die and stand next to William, I can say I have one under my belt. He would have four and I would have one."

Then the next year came and on December 31, I went to Robby and I said, "If I die and stand next to William, he will have four and I have two." It became a sort of benchmark for me, a small way to measure how devoted I was to spending time in God's Word.


I wasn't rushing through, I wasn't using Bible reading as a measure of my relationship, but rather as something of a barometer for my passion. By the end of the third year I could tell William if I saw him in heaven that I had read God's Word three times through.

Though that was a feat by itself, something even more remarkable had happened: I had cultivated a passion for the Word of God.

As the years have gone on, I have learned that I don't have to read the Bible in its entirety every year. It's not about the quantity of Scripture we read, but the quality time spent in it. As my focus shifted from reading large quantities of Scripture to smaller, I've noticed that I now read "less" in order to digest more. But this is all just a part of my journey.

If you have never read the Bible through, I cannot stress enough how enriching of an experience it is. You get a full view of the work that God has done in His people and see how His plan fits together perfectly—and continues to this day. If you've never read it through, it is never too late to begin.

The Chicago Tribune published an article about William on April 27, 1913. In it, William commented that he believed that he was uplifted spiritually by being struck down physically. Though his vision was dark, his awakened soul could see beauties of life and the fullness of God. Sightless, he could see more than many blessed with vision. The Lord crushed him so that He might use him. God's Word brought hope where there was once despair. God's Word reveals knowledge, wisdom, and truth for this life—the kind of Truth that will set you free.







[Act 2:1-21 NASB20] 1 When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. 2 And suddenly a noise like a violent rushing wind came from heaven, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. 3 And tongues [that looked] like fire appeared to them, distributing themselves, and [a tongue] rested on each one of them. 4 And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to **speak with different tongues**, as the Spirit was giving them [the ability] to speak out. 5 Now there were Jews residing in Jerusalem, devout men from every nation under heaven. 6 And when this sound occurred, the crowd came together and they were bewildered, because each one of them was hearing them speak in his own language. 7 They were amazed and astonished, saying, "Why, are not all these who are speaking Galileans? 8 "And how [is it that] we each hear [them] in our own language to which we were born? 9 "Parthians, Medes, and Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea, and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, 10 Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya around Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, 11 Cretans and Arabs--we hear them speaking in our [own] tongues of the mighty deeds of God." 12 And they all continued in **amazement and great perplexity**, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" 13 But others were jeering and saying, "They are full of sweet wine!" 14 But Peter, taking his stand with the [other] eleven, raised his voice and declared to them: "Men of Judea and all you who live in Jerusalem, know this, and pay attention to my words. 15 "For these people are not drunk, as you assume, since it is [only] the third hour of the day; 16 but this is what has been spoken through the prophet Joel: 17 'AND IT SHALL BE IN THE LAST DAYS,' God says, 'THAT I WILL POUR OUT MY SPIRIT ON ALL MANKIND; AND YOUR SONS AND YOUR DAUGHTERS WILL PROPHESY, AND YOUR YOUNG MEN WILL SEE VISIONS, AND YOUR OLD MEN WILL HAVE DREAMS; 18 AND EVEN ON MY MALE AND FEMALE SERVANTS I WILL POUR OUT MY SPIRIT IN THOSE DAYS, And they will prophesy. 19 'AND I WILL DISPLAY WONDERS IN THE SKY ABOVE AND SIGNS ON THE EARTH BELOW, BLOOD, FIRE, AND VAPOR OF SMOKE. 20 'THE SUN WILL BE TURNED INTO DARKNESS AND THE MOON INTO BLOOD, BEFORE THE GREAT AND GLORIOUS DAY OF THE LORD COMES. 21 'AND IT SHALL BE [THAT] EVERYONE WHO CALLS ON THE NAME OF THE LORD WILL BE SAVED.'

Tongues of Fire

 Ephesians 5:18-20 - And do not get drunk with wine, in which there is debauchery, but <u>be filled</u> (drunk) with the Spirit, speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody with your hearts to the Lord; always giving thanks for all things in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to [our] God and Father;



Lips/Mouths full of Praise!

[Luk 19:38-40 NASB20] 38 shouting: "BLESSED IS the King, THE ONE WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF THE LORD; Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" 39 And [yet] some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Him, "Teacher, rebuke Your disciples!" 40 Jesus replied, "I tell you, if these stop speaking, the stones will cry out!"

[Psa 145:1 NASB20] 1 [A Psalm] of Praise, of David. I will exalt You, my God, the King, And I will bless Your name forever and ever.

[Eph 5:20 NASB20] 20 always giving thanks for all things in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to [our] God and Father;

[Col 1:12 NASB20] 12 giving thanks to the Father, who has qualified us to share in the inheritance of the saints in light.

[Col 3:16 NASB20] 16 Let the word of Christ richly dwell within you, with all wisdom teaching and admonishing one another with psalms, hymns, [and] spiritual songs, singing with thankfulness in your hearts to God.

The Sin of Silence

[Act 20:26-28, 31 NASB20] 26 "Therefore, I testify to you this day that I am innocent of the blood of all people. 27 "For I did not shrink from declaring to you the whole purpose of God. 28 "Be on guard for yourselves and for all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God which He purchased with His own blood. ... 31 "Therefore, be on the alert, remembering that night and day for a period of three years I did not cease to admonish each one with tears.

[Pro 31:8-9 NASB20] 8 Open your mouth for the people who cannot speak, For the rights of all the unfortunate. 9 Open your mouth, judge righteously, And defend

the rights of the poor and needy.

[Act 1:8 NASB20] 8 but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be My witnesses both in Jerusalem and in all Judea, and Samaria, and as far as the remotest part of the earth."

[Mar 16:15 NASB20] 15 And He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation.

[Pro 24:11-12 NASB20] 11 Rescue those who are being taken away to death, And those who are staggering to the slaughter, Oh hold [them] back! 12 If you say, "See, we did not know this," Does He who weighs the hearts not consider [it?] And does He who watches over your soul not know [it?] And will He not repay a person according to his work?

Martin Niemöller (1892-1984) emerged as an outspoken foe of Adolf Hitler. First they came for the Socialists, and I did not speak out— Because I was not a Socialist.

Then they came for the Trade Unionists, and I did not speak out— Because I was not a Trade Unionist.

Then they came for the Jews, and I did not speak out– Because I was not a Jew.


Then they came for me and there was no one left to speak for me.

As premier of the Soviet Union, Nikita Khrushchev denounced the atrocities of Joseph Stalin. Once, as he censured Stalin in a public meeting, a heckler interrupted him, saying, "You were one of Stalin's colleagues. Why didn't you stop him?"

"Who said that?" roared Khrushchev. An agonizing silence followed. Nobody in the crowd dared move a muscle. Then Khrushchev replied, "Now you know why."[2]
