Week 6 – Worship Several manuscripts of Matthew include an additional phrase known as a doxology to conclude the Lord's Prayer. It is listed as a footnote in the ESV:
"For Yours is the kingdom, the power, and the glory forever. Amen." (Matthew 6:13 note ESV)
Doxology – a "word" of "glory" (cf. 1 Chronicles 29)
