

## High Hope Session 8 – Hope & Prayer

I. Introduction/review

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<u>Jeremiah 29:11 (NKJV)</u> – For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, says the LORD, thoughts of peace and not of evil, to give you a future and a hope.

**Jeremiah 29:11 (GWT)** – I know the plans that I have for you, declares the LORD. They are plans for peace and not disaster, plans to give you a future filled with hope

- II. The Hope/Prayer Connection
  - A. The Significance of Prayer
    - 1. <u>**1** Thessalonians 5:17 (KJV)</u> Pray without Ceasing.

**<u>1 Thessalonians 5:17 (NIV)</u>** – Pray Constantly.

**<u>1 Thessalonians 5:17 (CEV)</u>** – Never Stop Praying.



- 2. <u>Luke 18:1 (KJV)</u> And he spake a parable unto them to this end, that men ought always to pray, and not to faint.
  - a. Prayer is in contrast to fainting.
  - b. Prayer is the key to not fainting. If I don't want to faint, I need to pray.
  - c. **Faint Def** = *G*r. To be utterly spiritless/ to be wearied out/ exhausted. To be weak and to faint.
  - d. Last week we discussed the importance of catching the second wind.
  - e. **Prayer = is connected to catching the second wind of hope and faith.** *Many times, I have caught my second wind of hope in a time of prayer.*
  - f. Paul said, pray always/without ceasing.
  - g. Jesus said, pray always/and it will keep you from fainting/being given to exhaustion/losing heart/losing strength/becoming wearied out.
  - h. For Hope to have its complete work in my life, I must learn how to work my hope together with prayer.
- III. An Examples of Hope Renewal through Prayer

## A. Habakkuk

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- 1. Habakkuk lived in troubled times when sin was increasing all around him.
- 2. In prayer he questioned God about His judgment of those who seemed to be getting away with their sin.
- 3. When God showed him the things that were about to happen, he was filled with anxiety and fear.



- 4. <u>Habakkuk 3:16 (NLT)</u> I trembled inside when I heard this; my lips quivered with fear. My legs gave way beneath me, and I shook in terror. I will wait quietly for the coming day when disaster will strike the people who invade us.
  - a. Habakkuk had every reason in the natural to lose his hope.
  - b. He didn't limit his prayer to just declaring the problem.
  - c. Many people's prayers are consumed with the problem.
  - d. Habakkuk took his prayer a step further.
- 5. <u>Habakkuk 3:17-18 (NLT)</u> <sup>17</sup>Even though the fig trees have no blossoms, and there are no grapes on the vines; even though the olive crop fails, and the fields lie empty and barren; even though the flocks die in the fields, and the cattle barns are empty, <sup>18</sup>yet I will rejoice in the LORD! I will be joyful in the God of my salvation!
  - a. **Rejoice** I will triumph in the Lord Habakkuk – All of these things are coming, but I will triumph in the Lord!
  - b. I will be **JOYFUL** = Joy Gr. Root to spin around under the influence of any violent emotion.
  - c. Habakkuk was taking control of his emotions in prayer. He was driving out fear He was choosing Joy.
  - d. <u>Habakkuk 3:18 (AMP)</u> Yet I will [choose to] rejoice in the LORD; I will [choose to] shout in exultation in the [victorious] God of my salvation!
  - e. <u>Habakkuk 3:19 (AMP)</u> The Lord GOD is my strength [my source of courage, my invincible army]; He has made my feet [steady and sure] like hinds' feet and makes me walk [forward with spiritual confidence] on my high places [of challenge and responsibility].
  - f. **Strength** = Ability, efficiency, force, army.
  - g. <u>Brenton Septuagint Translation</u> The Lord God is my strength, and he will perfectly strengthen my feet; he mounts me upon high places, that I may conquer by his song.
  - h. What's happening here? Habakkuk is renewing his hope. He is renewing his faith.



*He is renewing his strength. How? By declaring his HOPE in prayer/Worship.* 

## IV. Conclusion

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- **A.** When the issues of life become tough, I will not faint. I will not lose my strength.
- B. I Will pray!
- C. I will stir up my hope by declaring hope in the Lord!
- D. David knew the secret of Declaring Hope in prayer.

**Palms 3:1-8 (ERV)** – <sup>1</sup>LORD, I have so many enemies. So many people have turned against me. <sup>2</sup>They say to themselves, "God will not rescue him!" Selah <sup>3</sup>But you, LORD, protect me. You bring me honor; you give me hope. <sup>4</sup>I will pray to the LORD, and he will answer me from his holy mountain. Selah <sup>5</sup>I can lie down to rest and know that I will wake up, because the LORD covers and protects me. <sup>6</sup>So I will not be afraid of my enemies, even if thousands of them surround me. <sup>7</sup>LORD, get up! My God, come rescue me! If you hit my enemies on the cheek, you will break all their teeth. <sup>8</sup>LORD, the victory is yours! You are so good to your people.
