# BIBLICAL PROSPERITY Session 4 – Overcoming a Spirit of Poverty

- I. Review God's covenant of Prosperity and His Purpose for Prosperity
  - A. Genesis 12:2 "I will bless you.... and you shall be a blessing"
    - 1. This blessing is carried over throughout the old covenant into the new covenant.
    - 2. **Galatians 3:29** <sup>29</sup> And if ye be Christ's, then are ye Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise.
  - B. **Deuteronomy 8:18** <sup>18</sup>But thou shalt remember the LORD thy God: for it is he that giveth thee power to get wealth, that he may establish his covenant which he sware unto thy fathers, as it is this day.
    - 1. Each of us has been given the ability to create wealth so that we may participate in establishing His covenant/work in the earth
    - 2. The biblical purpose for prosperity is that you be blessed so you can be a channel of blessing to others.
    - 3. God provides bread for food something for us
    - 4. God provides seed to sow something for others
    - 5. Whenever we are believing for our need, we should increase our faith to believe for something more to give

## II. Overcoming the Spirit of Poverty

- A. **Proverbs 10:15** <sup>15</sup>The rich man's wealth is his strong city: the destruction of the poor is their poverty.
  - 1. A Rich man's strength and protection from poverty is not just from his present financial condition, but that he sees himself wealth.
    - a. A Spirit of prosperity rules his heart
  - 2. The poor man's destruction is not just his present condition of lack, but he sees himself poor
    - a. A spirit of poverty rules his heart
  - 3. Whatever spirit rules our heart determines the fruit we will consistently experience in our lives.
- B. Recognizing the Spirit of Poverty You might have a spirit of poverty controlling your life if....
  - 1. You break into cold sweats whenever there is a downturn in the economy, or you receive a negative financial report
  - 2. Your close friends refer to you as "tightwad" Tightwad = penny pincher, miser, scrooge
  - 3. You are constantly complaining about how much things cost
  - 4. You are always trying to get things for less or free

- 5. You are holding on to and hoarding things you should be letting go of.
- 6. The blessing and good fortune of others bothers you
- 7. What others think about what you drive, where you live, and what you wear is a big deal to you
- 8. You are obsessed with success and the accumulation of stuff
- 9. You feel secure only if you have a certain amount of money in the bank.

### III. Revisit the Bible's Definition of Prosperity

- **2 Corinthians 9:8** <sup>8</sup>And God is able to make all grace abound toward you; that ye, always having all sufficiency in all things, may abound to every good work:
- A. You will always have all sufficiency in all things
  - 1. Always having enough in every situation
  - 2. We must give attention to this, and meditate on it until it becomes real to us enough and extra
  - 3. The spirit of poverty paints an entirely different picture on the canvas of our hearts. Which picture do you see in your heart poverty or prosperity?
  - 4. The spirit of poverty will always tell us there is not enough in any situation.

- 5. When you listen to the voice of poverty, you are left to yourself to do whatever you can to try to make ends meet.
- 6. The reason some people have a hard time letting go of specific things is because they believe they acquired them by their own self effort alone.
- 7. The voice of prosperity says, "I didn't acquire them on my own" but, God as my source provided everything I own.
- 8. QUESTION: How do you see yourself and your situation? Enough or not enough?
- B. You have an abundance for every good work
  - 1. This does not fit into the mindset of someone who is controlled by the spirit of poverty
  - 2. A poverty mentality will always take care of himself and make certain that his nest egg has been achieved and financial comfort zone has been protected. Then he can give a little bit to charity but never beyond his comfort zone. What is your giving comfort zone?
  - 3. A poverty mentality toward giving is tipping . They tip God, the poor and various charities to impress others or to feel better about themselves.
  - 4. Jesus took notice of the heart of the widow who gave the greatest gift, although it was small in comparison to other gifts.
  - 5. Jesus measures giving by percentage not by the size of the gift
  - 6. One who is ruled by the spirit of poverty will rarely stretch themselves to give beyond their comfort zone. *Why? Fear of lack*.

## IV. Practical Steps to Overcoming the Spirit of Poverty

- A. Pray about it
- B. Change your mindset to exclude any thoughts that could give place to the spirit of poverty
- C. Practice biblical giving
  - 1. Tithe
  - 2. Offerings
- D. Practice hearing what the Holy Spirit is saying to you regarding giving
- E. Add faith to your giving (Comfort zone giving requires no faith)
- F. Remind yourself of the promises of God's provision and abundance
- G. Speak aloud God's financial promises until they become sown deep into your heart.

#### V. Declarations for finances

- I am a cheerful giver and I sow under the direction of the Holy Spirit (2 Cor 9:7)
- God gives me the power to get wealth so that He may establish His covenant upon the earth through me (Deut 8:18)
- God is my only source, I put my trust in God, not in man (Jeremiah 17:5-7)
- My God makes all grace abound toward me in every favor and earthly blessing so that I have all sufficiency in all things and abound to every good work. (2 Cor 9:8)
- I willingly obey the Lord in the tithe and in offerings. The windows of heaven are opened so that I am receiving blessings that there is not room enough to receive and the devourer is rebuked for my sake. (Mal 3:10)
