1. The Division of Soul and Spirit.

The necessary process of being led. Separation, severing, and division of soul and spirit.

2. The Spirit's leading through the renewed mind.

The more my mind is renewed by the Word of God, the Spirit will be able to lead me with greater accuracy and precision.

II. The Supply of the Spirit.

Philippians 1:19-20 (NKJV) – ¹⁹For I know that this will turn out for my deliverance through your prayer and the supply of the Spirit of Jesus Christ, ²⁰according to my earnest expectation and hope that in nothing I shall be ashamed, but with all boldness, as always, so now also Christ will be magnified in my body, whether by life or by death.

Philippians 1:19 (AMP) – for I know [with confidence] that this will turn out for my deliverance and spiritual well-being, through your prayers and the [superabundant] supply of the Spirit of Jesus Christ [which upholds me].

A. Other translations – “Supply of the Spirit”

1. Provision of the Spirit

2. Help of the Spirit

3. **Supply – Gr** – the furnishing – the contribution

To supply all things necessary – to furnish abundantly.

B. Paul declares that He is confident of his victory because of the prayers of the church and the supply of the Spirit.

1. Whatever supernatural power/ability He needs, it is in the supply of the Spirit.

2. The praying church will enhance and increase the supply of the Spirit.

C. Whatever we need, it is in the supply of the Spirit.

Strength, ability, direction, victory, strategies, wisdom, etc.

NOTE: *What we need is not in the provision of the flesh, it is in the Supply of the Spirit. WE must become MORE dependent upon this supply – and more skillful at accessing it!*

Philippians 4:19 (NKJV) – *But my God **shall supply** all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus.*

How? Through the supply of the Spirit

2 Corinthians 9:10 (NIV) – *Now **he who supplies** seed to the sower and bread for food will also **supply** and increase your store of seed and will enlarge the harvest of your righteousness*

How? Through the supply of the Spirit

D. The life of the Spirit is living dependent upon the supernatural supply of the Spirit.

The type and shadow of Aarons Rod

Hebrews 9:2-4 (NIV) – ²A tabernacle was set up. In its first room were the lampstand and the table with its consecrated bread; this was called the Holy Place. ³Behind the second curtain was a room called the Most Holy Place, ⁴which had the golden altar of incense and the gold-covered ark of the covenant. This ark contained the gold jar of manna, Aaron's staff that had budded, and the stone tablets of the covenant.

Note: There are many types and shadows here. However, one of the most significant is Aarons rod that supernaturally budded. This rod budded and produced leaves by supernatural means – not being connected to the soil of earth. It drew its nourishment and strength from a supernatural source – Likewise – we do not draw our spiritual strength from the things associated with flesh – we draw from a supernatural source - THE SUPPLY OF THE SPIRIT!
(See Numbers 17)

Numbers 17:7-8 (NKJV) – Now it came to pass on the next day that Moses went into the tabernacle of witness, and behold, the rod of Aaron, of the house of Levi, had sprouted and put forth buds, had produced blossoms and yielded ripe almonds

III. How do we access the supply of the Spirit?

A. We access the supply of the Spirit by staying close to God.

Psalm 91:1-2 (NKJV) – ¹He who dwells in the secret place of the Most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty. ²I will say of the LORD, “He is my refuge and my fortress; My God, in Him I will trust.”

1. THE BENEFITS OF THIS COVENANT PSALM

- Deliverance – from the snare
- Deliverance from pestilence
- Shielded from the arrows of the enemy by day and night
- 1000 shall fall at one side and 10,000 at the other
- No plague shall come near your dwelling

- Angels are given charge to protect you
- You shall be satisfied with long life.

2. Dwelling in the secret place and abiding under the shadow of the almighty is being led by the Spirit.

- a. To dwell and abide CLOSELY is necessary for being led by the Spirit.
NOTE: *Too many are trying to be led by visiting the presence of the Lord. Being led only comes by staying close! Those who stay close – will hear his voice – and be kept safe!*
- b. We access the supply of the Spirit by staying close to God.

B. We are supplied with the Spirit by the hearing of faith

Galatians 3:5 (NKJV) – *Therefore He who supplies the Spirit to you and works miracles among you, does He do it by the works of the law, or by the hearing of faith?*

We are supplied with the Spirit by the hearing of the Word that produces faith.

As we hear the Word of God – Spirit and Life are imparted to us.

1. **John 6:63 (NKJV)** – *It is the Spirit who gives life; the flesh profits nothing. The words that I speak to you are spirit, and they are life*

NOTE: *The Words that I speak to you SUPPLY Spirit and Life. Failure to give time to the Word of God limits your supply of the Spirit.*

2. **2 Peter 1:2-4 (NKJV)** – ²*Grace and peace be multiplied to you in the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord, ³as **His divine power** has given to **us all things** that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of Him who called us by glory and virtue,⁴by which have been given to us **exceedingly great and precious promises, that through these** you may be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust.*

Note: His divine power – is the supply of the Spirit.
His divine power has supplied us with EVERYTHING needed.
We can partake of that supply of the Spirit/divine power – through
the exceedingly great and precious promises – THE WORD GIVES US
ACCESS TO THE SUPPLY OF THE SPIRIT.

C. We receive of the supply of the Spirit as we pray in tongues.

Romans 8:26-27 (NIV) – ²⁶In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans. ²⁷And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for God's people in accordance with the will of God.

Romans 8:26 (AMP) – In the same way the Spirit [comes to us and] helps us in our weakness. We do not know what prayer to offer or how to offer it as we should, but the Spirit Himself [knows our need and at the right time] intercedes on our behalf with sighs and groanings too deep for words.

Note: Words that are too deep for our natural earthly language. Words, groans, and sounds that come from the Spirit within and are spoken as we yield our voice to them.

1. Praying in tongues is speaking directly to the Father – Rom 8:27, 1 Cor 14:2
2. Praying in tongues allows the Spirit to pray the perfect will of God. Rom 8:27
3. Tongues gives access to the supernatural – 1 Cor 14:14-15
4. Tongues strengthen the inner man. Jude 1:20
5. Tongues bring you into greater intimacy with God.

6. Tongues bring you into alignment with the plan of God, 1 Cor 14:4
7. Tongues open the door for being led by the Spirit – 2 Cor 14:2, *He that speaks in an unknown tongue speaks mysteries*
8. Tongues are intercession for yourself and others.
9. Speaking and singing in tongues is a form of worship. 1 Cor 14:14-15

Pastor's Note: *Paul states 1 Cor 14:5 – I wish you all spoke with tongues. He further states, “Do not forbid to speak in tongues,” 1 Cor 14:39. Paul references his own speaking in tongues as a testimony to us in 1 Cor 14:18 – “I thank my God that I speak with tongues more than you all”.*

These three references by the Apostles Paul endorse the practice of speaking in tongues which should be active in the life of every believer. Making this type of prayer and worship a part of your life will enhance the supply of the Spirit in your life.
