Session 6 – "The Fruit of Faithfulness"

Galatians 5:16-23 (NKJV) – ¹⁶ I say then: Walk in the Spirit, and you shall not fulfill the lust of the flesh. ¹⁷ For the flesh lusts against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh; and these are contrary to one another, so that you do not do the things that you wish. ¹⁸ But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law. ¹⁹ Now the works of the flesh are evident, which are: ^[a]adultery, ^[b]fornication, uncleanness, lewdness, ²⁰ idolatry, sorcery, hatred, contentions, jealousies, outbursts of wrath, selfish ambitions, dissensions, heresies, ²¹ envy, ^[c]murders, drunkenness, revelries, and the like; of which I tell you beforehand, just as I also told you in time past, that <u>those who</u> <u>practice such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.</u> ²² But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, <u>faithfulness</u>, ²³ ^[d]gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law.

II. The Fruit of Faithfulness

A. Faithfulness Definition – Trustworthy, sure, true, loyal, reliable.

- 1. Faithfulness means I must be TRUE and LOYAL to and/or represent accurately the one I am being faithful to.
- 2. Cambridge Dictionary The quality of being faithful to someone or something
- 3. Webster Steadfast in affection or allegiance LOYAL
- B. Faithfulness was strongly emphasized and required throughout the Bible.
 - 1. <u>2 Timothy 2:2 (KJV)</u> "And the things that thou hast heard of me among many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also."

<u>2 Timothy 2:2 (CSB)</u> – "What you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses, commit to faithful men who will be able to teach others also."

- a. This passage describes the quality of a person we are to commit ministry and leadership to; one who has developed the fruit of faithfulness
- <u>1 Corinthians 4:1-2 (NIV)</u> ¹This, then, is how you ought to regard us: as servants of Christ and as those entrusted with the mysteries God has revealed. ²Now it is required that those who have been given a trust must prove faithful.
- Faithfulness is one of the primary character traits that must be found in individuals who are entrusted with leadership and managing the Lord's business



- 4. Matthew 22:14 (KJV) For many are called, but few are chosen.
- a. Why are many called and few chosen? We are not separated unto our call until we are counted faithful.
- b. <u>Revelation 17:14 (NIV)</u> They will wage war against the Lamb, but the Lamb will triumph over them because he is LORD of lords and King of kings-and with him will be his <u>called</u>, chosen and faithful <u>followers</u>
- c. Few are chosen because few are faithful
- d. One primary reason why people do not fulfill their God-given potential is because they do not comprehend the full scope of faithfulness and they do not embrace it. <u>FAITHFULNESS IS IMPORTANT!</u>
- 5. <u>**1 Timothy 1:12 (KJV)**</u> And I thank Christ Jesus our LORD, who hath enabled me, for that he <u>counted me faithful</u>, putting me into the ministry;
 - a. Paul states that God counted him faithful and put him in the ministry
 - b. Enablement, ability and promotion are connected to the fruit of faithfulness manifested in our lives.
- 6. Examples of Faithfulness
 - a. Faithfulness to Jesus
 - b. Faithfulness to your spouse and family
 - c. Faithfulness to your employer
 - d. Faithfulness in handling money/finances
 - e. Faithfulness to church family and spiritual authority
 - f. Faithfulness is being true to your words in each of these areas.



III. Essential Keys to Developing Faithfulness in your life

A. <u>2 Timothy 2:1 (KJV)</u> – Thou therefore, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus.

TRUSTING GOD – DEVELOPMENT IN FAITHFULNESS

- 1. Faithfulness to God and others begins with strong dependence upon the Lord.
- 2. To be strong in the grace of God is the opposite of dependence upon yourself or others.
- 3. Relying on yourself and your ability to perform will cause you to eventually wear out, burn out, or fail.
- 4. The more I trust God to take care of me, the more I become developed in the fruit of faithfulness.
- 5. I am faithful to the one I trust!
- B. Be strong by staying within the measure of what God has assigned you to.
 - 1. Remain faithful to what you know God has assigned you to.
 - 2. God's grace is available to perform everything He has called you to; not those things He never called you to.
 - 3. Without God's grace the fruit of faithfulness will not be present; His grace is available in those things He assigns us to.
 - 4. MANY find it impossible to be faithful because they have taken upon themselves TASKS/ASSIGNMENTS that God never called them to.



C. <u>2 Timothy 2:3 (KJV)</u> – Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ.

- 1. The ability to ENDURE HARDNESS = promotion
- 2. EXAMPLE = soldiers in basic training are harassed and pressured in order to be prepared for battle.
- 3. Our reaction to HARDNESS determines whether we ENDURE and are PROMOTED or WIMP OUT and get busted.
- 4. God doesn't put WIMPS on the front lines and certainly not into leadership. (Consider how God reduced Gideon's army)
- 5. The Fruit of Faithfulness keeps us going when times are tough or when the opposition is great.
- 6. Consider the early church leaders and the struggles they faced. They were faithful even unto death.
- D. <u>2 Timothy 2:4 (NIV)</u> No one serving as a soldier gets entangled in civilian affairs, but rather tries to please his commanding officer.
 - 1. Faithful people and good soldiers make PLEASING GOD a higher priority than their involvement with the necessities of life.
 - 2. A good and faithful soldier does not live for himself
 - 3. A solider who lives for himself will justify running from a fight
 - 4. A good and faithful soldier in God's army does not entwine himself with other stuff that will keep him from obeying the Lord.
 - 5. FAITHFULNESS involves being available to the lord more than any other priority in life.
 - 6. NEB = "He must be wholly at his commanding officer's disposal".
- E. <u>2 Timothy 2:5 (NIV)</u> Similarly, anyone who competes as an athlete does not receive the victor's crown except by competing according to the rules
 - 1. Training and Discipline are a MUST!
 - 2. Training and discipline are connected to FAITHFULNESS
 - 3. Training must be consistent/not in spurts



- 4. Part of our training involves discipline =
 - a. Reading the Word
 - b. Studying the Word
 - c. Attending church regularly
 - d. Walking in love
 - e. Walking in forgiveness
 - f. Giving of our finances and ourselves
- 5. Winning at anything involves practice, hard work, disappointment and trials.
- 6. Every winner realizes that FAITHFULNESS and DISCIPLINE accomplishes something/REWARD.
- 7. There are NO SHORTCUTS to faithfulness
- IV. Rewards of the Fruit of Faithfulness
 - A. We are entrusted with precious things and qualified to lead -2 Tim 2:2
 - B. We will develop and be able to teach and disciple others
 - C. We develop understanding in all things 2 Tim 2:7
 - **D. PROMOTION and eternal reward = Matthew 25:21** Well done, good and faithful servant – you were faithful over a few things, I will make you ruler over many things. Enter into the Joy of your Lord.
