- II. Jesus The Good Shepherd
 - A. The Comparison of God as Shepherd is seen in the Old and New Testament.
 - 1. In Psalm 23 David "The Lord is my Shepherd".
 - 2. In John 10:11 Jesus, "I am the Good Shepherd".
 - 3. Since both Old and New Testaments make reference to the shepherd analogy, there must be something of great value in looking at the Lord as a shepherd.
 - B. Jesus Reference to Himself as Shepherd
 - 1. <u>John 10:10-11 (NKJV)</u> ¹⁰The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly. ¹¹"I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd gives His life for the sheep.
 - a. In the Old Testament, David simply states, "The Lord is my Shepherd".
 - b. In the New Testament, Jesus adds emphasis by using the word "GOOD" to declare His nature.



- c. <u>John 10:14 (NKJV)</u> I am the good shepherd; and I know My sheep, and am known by My own.
- d. **Good Definition** beautiful, excellent, choice, surpassing, precious and useful Good and excellent in its nature and characteristics.
- e. Jesus representing the Father declares that as shepherd of the sheep, HE is GOOD and excellent in all things his nature and characteristics are GOOD!
- f. As my shepherd, the Lord is always leading me into GOOD never the opposite.
- g. **Notice** In John 10:10, Jesus contrast himself with the devil. Our shepherd should never be confused with our enemy the devil.

C. The Revelation of a what a Good Shepherd does in Psalm 23.

- 1. Psalm 23:1 (NKJV) The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want.
 - a. Want Definition to lack, be without or decrease. To be lacking or have a need also implies failure
 - b. Philippians 4:19 (KJV) "But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus."
 - c. <u>Luke 22:35 (NKJV)</u> And He said to them, "When I sent you without money bag, knapsack, and sandals, did you lack anything?" So they said, "Nothing."
 - d. <u>Matthew 6:33 (NKJV)</u> But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you.
 - e. The Lord as my good shepherd is my provider and He always has good and plentiful provision for his sheep.
 - f. **Jehovah Jireh** The Lord Will Provide The nature of the Good Shepherd is to provide. *It is His nature to provide for me.*
 - g. <u>Psalms 37:25 (KJV)</u> I have been young, and now am old; yet have I not seen the righteous forsaken, nor his seed begging bread.

<u>Psalms 37:25 (AMP)</u> – I have been young and now I am old, Yet I have not seen the righteous (those in right standing with God) abandoned Or his descendants pleading for bread.



- 2. <u>Psalms 23:2 (NKJV)</u> He makes me to lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside the still waters.
 - Green Pastures Still Waters refer to the quality of His provision. Whatever He provides is Good or leading to more good.
- 3. <u>Psalms 23:3 (NKJV)</u> He restores my soul; He leads me in the paths of righteousness For His name's sake.
 - Paths of Righteousness the right path that leads to the blessed life.
- 4. <u>Psalms 23:4 (NKJV)</u> Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; For You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me.
 - Wherever and whatever I find in throughout the journey of life, HE is with me- His rod and staff are at work on my behalf.
- 5. Psalms 23:5-6 (NKJV) ⁵You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; You anoint my head with oil; My cup runs over. ⁶Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me All the days of my life; And I will dwell in the house of the LORD Forever
 - a. **Goodness** good excellence prosperity and happiness, good things, good benefits
 - b. **Follow** To pursue chase to be behind you, to follow after or running after you.
 - c. Because the Lord is my Shepherd, Goodness is running after me to overtake me.



III. Closing Thoughts

- A. The quality of the life of the sheep is determined by the shepherd.

 Our shepherd takes GOOD CARE of His sheep!
 - 1. God doesn't want His sheep to lack.
 - 2. God doesn't want His sheep to be weak and sickly.
 - 3. God doesn't want His sheep to fail.
 - 4. God doesn't want His sheep to be prey for enemies.
 - 5. God's covenant plan for His people was always to bless them.
- **B.** <u>Matthew 9:36 (NKJV)</u> But when He saw the multitudes, He was moved with compassion for them, because they were weary and scattered, like sheep having no shepherd.
 - 1. Jesus did not want the people to live their lives without a shepherd.
 - 2. To live without a shepherd was the opposite of the blessed life.
 - Scattered abroad = They were in need of care. without care.
