I. INTRODUCTION AND SCRIPTURES

A. Dominion Defined:

- Authority or rule over something.
- A king has authority or rule over a kingdom.
- Control or authority over it.

1. In the beginning, God gave man dominion over the earth.

Genesis 1:26

KJV "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth..."

PASTOR'S NOTE: *Man gave up his dominion to Satan when he transgressed God's only rule and ate of the forbidden fruit in the garden. Ultimately, **dominion was restored to us in Christ.** Our God-given authority was restored through our new spiritual identity in Christ.*

2. Jesus' words on authority:

Luke 10:19

NKJV "Behold, I give you the authority to trample on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing shall by any means hurt you."

AMPC "Behold! I have given you authority *and* power to trample upon serpents and scorpions, and [physical and mental strength and ability] over all the power that the enemy [possesses]; and nothing shall in any way harm you."

TPT "Now you understand that I have imparted to you my authority to trample over his kingdom. You will trample upon every demon before you and overcome every power Satan possesses. Absolutely nothing will harm you as you walk in this authority."

3. Romans 5:17

NKJV “For if by the one man’s offense death reigned through the one, much more those who receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness will reign in life through the One, Jesus Christ.”

GNT “It is true that through the sin of one man death began to rule because of that one man. But how much greater is the result of what was done by the one man, Jesus Christ! All who receive God’s abundant grace and are freely put right with him will rule in life through Christ.”

New Revised Standard Version “If, because of the one man’s trespass, death exercised dominion through that one, much more surely will those who receive the abundance of grace and the free gift of righteousness exercise dominion in life through the one man, Jesus Christ.”

II. DOMINION AND COVENANT

While dominion was lost to mankind at the Fall, through covenant God always gave man dominion. The ultimate restoration of dominion comes to us through the New Covenant in Christ. However, the Old Testament saints enjoyed dominion as well. If THEY had it, WE must have it so much more!

A. Jesus Spoke of TREADING Upon Scorpions and Serpents and ALL the Power of the Enemy

1. Tread: Spiritual authority over evil; protection and victory. We are to walk in protection and victory.
 - To march, walk, or trample.
 - To trample down or crush.
 - Defeating the enemy underfoot.
 - To have authority over something.
 - Walking or stepping over.

2. Rather than being walked upon or stepped upon by the enemy, we will always be able to STEP ON or STEP OVER our enemy.
 - To have dominion is to have the advantage over.
 - Covenant gives us an edge / advantage.
 - Covenant always puts us over.

PASTOR'S NOTE: *Walking in the Word (having revelation of the covenant promises of God) puts us over.*

B. Wherever the Soles of Your Feet Shall Tread

1. Deuteronomy 11:24

NKJV “Every place **on which the sole of your foot treads** shall be yours: from the wilderness and Lebanon, from the river, the River Euphrates, even to the Western Sea, shall be your territory.”

2. Joshua 1:2-5

NKJV “Moses My servant is dead. Now therefore, arise, go over this Jordan, you and all this people, to the land which I am giving to them—the children of Israel. **Every place that the sole of your foot will tread upon I have given you, as I said to Moses.** From the wilderness and this Lebanon as far as the great river, the River Euphrates, all the land of the Hittites, and to the Great Sea toward the going down of the sun, shall be your territory. No man shall *be able to stand before you* all the days of your life; as I was with Moses, so I will be with you. I will not leave you nor forsake you.”

3. EVERY place.

- a. Wherever you go, wherever you show up, DOMINION SHOWS UP. Not just by promise, but by STEPPING INTO IT / SHOWING UP in faith with the promise.
- b. David showed up to face Goliath with the promises. It wasn't enough just to have the promise. He had to STEP OUT—in faith—and show up to the place of battle in faith.
 - Who got trampled?
 - Who had favor?
 - Who reigned and had dominion?
 - The one who stepped out in faith to believe God's covenant of assistance and protection.
- c. When I step out on the Word spiritually, the soles of my feet are touching territory.

4. Wherever a covenant person shows up, dominion shows up.
 - a. Unusual things occur.
 - b. Unusual favor.
 - c. Things work that aren't supposed to work in the natural.
 - d. Dominion puts you over when in the natural you should be under. All because of covenant.

5. Deuteronomy 28:13

NKJV "And the LORD will make you the head and not the tail; you shall be above only, and not be beneath, if you heed the commandments of the LORD your God, which I command you today, and are careful to observe *them*."

NIV "The LORD will make you the head, not the tail. If you pay attention to the commands of the LORD your God that I give you this day and carefully follow them, you will always be at the top, never at the bottom."

- a. If you will believe for it.
- b. If you will have faith in what God has said.
- c. Wherever, whenever you show up, wherever the soles of your feet show up, dominion and authority will always put you over!
 - On the job
 - On the highway
 - At school
 - At the airport
 - At the mall
 - At Walmart
 - At the post office
- d. You don't live expecting the worst to occur.
- e. You live expecting the supernatural to always surround you.

6. Psalm 103:4

NKJV "Who redeems your life from destruction, Who crowns you with lovingkindness and tender mercies..."

- a. "Crown" = Surround

- b. Wherever the SOLES OF MY FEET SHOW UP, I am surrounded by covenant action / protection / assistance.
 - c. Because of this, I dominate over rather than being dominated over!
7. Examples of how this dominion worked for Old Testament people:
- a. Jacob
 - **Genesis 30:27**

NKJV “And Laban said to him, ‘Please *stay*, if I have found favor in your eyes, *for* I have learned by experience that the Lord has blessed me for your sake.”

Other Translations: “...the Lord has blessed me because of you...”
 - Because Jacob was walking in the covenant God made with Abraham his father, wherever the soles of his feet showed up blessing showed up.
 - When your feet show up on the job, blessing should come to that place.
 - b. Isaac
 - **Genesis 1:1-6**

NKJV “There was a famine in the land, besides the first famine that was in the days of Abraham. And Isaac went to Abimelech king of the Philistines, in Gerar. Then the Lord appeared to him and said: ‘Do not go down to Egypt; live in the land of which I shall tell you. Dwell in this land, and I will be with you and bless you; for to you and your descendants I give all these lands, and I will perform the oath which I swore to Abraham your father. And I will make your descendants multiply as the stars of heaven; I will give to your descendants all these lands; and in your seed all the nations of the earth shall be blessed; because Abraham obeyed My voice and kept My charge, My commandments, My statutes, and My laws.’ So Isaac dwelt in Gerar.”
 - **Genesis 26:12-14**

NKJV “Then Isaac sowed in that land, and reaped in the same year a hundredfold; and the Lord blessed him. The man began to prosper, and continued prospering until he became very prosperous; for he

had possessions of flocks and possessions of herds and a great number of servants. So the Philistines envied him.”

PASTOR’S NOTE: *FAMINE was in the land. The land would not produce a harvest / no rain / dry season. No one else would sow—they were eating their seed because it was useless to sow it because of famine.*

- Isaac **SHOWED UP** where God told him to go.
- When the soles of the feet of a covenant man touched the parched dry famine-ridden land, DOMINION OVER FAMINE SHOWED UP.
 - He sowed.
 - He reaped.
 - He reaped greatly.
- What happened?
 - Because he had covenant dominion working for him, the famine that worked against everyone else wouldn’t work on him.

PASTOR’S NOTE: *You need to develop this mindset:*

- *Things that work against others will not work against me.*
- *Things the enemy can get an advantage on with others will not work on me.*
- *When I enter a place—no matter what—if God sent me, and is with me, BLESSING OVERRIDES THE CURSE.*
- *THIS IS DOMINION.*

8. New Testament examples:

- a. Chains couldn’t hold Paul and Silas.
 - The soles of their feet were in stocks; however, theirs were covenant feet.
 - The moment they entered the prison, the prison lost its authority and the dominion of Christ entered.
- b. Paul on the ship:
 - Paul couldn’t sink, although the ship sank.
 - A man of dominion was on board.

- c. The snakebite:
 - The poison of a snake that had killed many on the Island of Malta couldn't touch Paul.
 - Why? When the soles of his feet stepped on shore, POISON SNAKES WERE UNDER HIS DOMINION.
- d. John was boiled in oil and thrown on the Isle of Patmos.
- e. Paul was stoned and left for dead, but the Lord raised him up.

- 9. Pastor's personal examples:
 - a. Delta
 - b. New Bethel Church

III. BEGIN TO SEE YOURSELF AS A COVENANT PERSON

A. The Promised Land

- 1. When Joshua was given command to enter the Promised Land, God told him to tell the people over and over "only be strong and very courageous / be of courage".
 - a. They had to walk by faith. Step by faith.
 - b. Wherever we go, we must step by faith. Stay full of courage.
- 2. The first generation of Israelites did not exercise dominion and lost the Promised Land.
 - a. Their lack of stepping and possessing and not seeing themselves victorious as people of dominion cost them their lives.
 - b. Rather than dominating over the wilderness, the wilderness dominated over them.
 - c. This world will DOMINATE OVER YOU unless you see yourself as ABLE.

IV. DECREEING, DECLARING, PROCLAIMING, AND ESTABLISHING

A. Decree

- 1. "Decree" = to determine.
 - a. Decrees are binding and authoritative.

2. Scriptures:

a. **Job 22:28**

KJV "Thou shalt also decree a thing, and it shall be established unto thee: and the light shall shine upon thy ways..."

AMPC "You shall also decide *and* decree a thing, and it shall be established for you; and the light [of God's favor] shall shine upon your ways."

b. **Matthew 16:19**

NKJV "And I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven."

TPT "I will give you the keys of heaven's kingdom realm to forbid on earth that which is forbidden in heaven, and to release on earth that which is released in heaven."

c. **Matthew 18:18**

NKJV "Assuredly, I say to you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven."

AMPC "Truly I tell you, whatever you forbid *and* declare to be improper and unlawful on earth must be what is already forbidden in heaven, and whatever you permit *and* declare proper and lawful on earth must be what is already permitted in heaven."

B. Declare & Proclaim

1. "Declare" = to acknowledge; to confess; to make known; to proclaim.
2. "Proclaim" = to announce something publicly and officially, often with confidence or authority.
 - a. This is what David did to Goliath: an official announcement of defeat.
 - b. This is what Paul did when the ship was going down: an official announcement of victory (if they stayed with the ship).

- c. This is what Jehoshaphat did in the face of his enemy: - "...for the Lord is good and His mercy [HESED] endureth forever."

3. Scriptures:

a. **Psalm 118:17**

KJV "I shall not die, but live, and declare the works of the LORD."

NIV "I will not die but live, and will proclaim what the LORD has done"

b. **1 Corinthians 15:57**

NKJV "But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ."

C. Establish

1. "Establish" = to make something firm or unshakable; to make it sure and everlasting.

-
- **Proclaim:** Speak truth about God and His promises.
 - **Decree:** Align your words with faith and Scripture.
 - **Establish:** In proclaiming and decreeing, we are establishing dominion, making the WILL of God sure, unshakable, and everlasting.
-

V. CLOSING NOTE

- God has given to us authority and dominion. It is His will for us to walk in this realm of authority every day and in every way.
- As we go—stepping forward—wherever the soles of our feet carry us, we expect His dominion to go before us, preparing the way, and establishing our steps.
- Safety belongs to us. Protection belongs to us. Provision and divine assistance belong to us.
- However, WE must decree and declare as we go, unlike the first generation of Israelites who decreed their own defeat by the things they spoke.
