II. Wholly Following God

A. The Example of Caleb

Joshua 14:6-14 (NKJV) – ⁶Then the children of Judah came to Joshua in Gilgal. And Caleb the son of Jephunneh the Kenizzite said to him: "You know the word which the LORD said to Moses the man of God concerning you and me in Kadesh Barnea. ⁷I was forty years old when Moses the servant of the LORD sent me from Kadesh Barnea to spy out the land, and I brought back word to him as it was in my heart. ⁸Nevertheless my brethren who went up with me made the heart of the people melt, **but I** wholly followed the LORD my God. ⁹So Moses swore on that day, saying, 'Surely the land where your foot has trodden shall be your inheritance



and your children's forever, **because you have wholly followed the LORD my God**.' ¹⁰And now, behold, the LORD has kept me alive, as He said, these forty-five years, ever since the LORD spoke this word to Moses while Israel wandered in the wilderness; and now, here I am this day, eightyfive years old. ¹¹As yet I am as strong this day as on the day that Moses sent me; just as my strength was then, so now is my strength for war, both for going out and for coming in. ¹²Now therefore, give me this mountain of which the LORD spoke in that day; for you heard in that day how the Anakim were there, and that the cities were great and fortified. It may be that the LORD will be with me, and I shall be able to drive them out as the LORD said." ¹³And Joshua blessed him, and gave Hebron to Caleb the son of Jephunneh as an inheritance. ¹⁴Hebron therefore became the inheritance of Caleb the son of Jephunneh the Kenizzite to this day, **because he wholly followed the LORD God of Israel**

- **1.** Three references to the fact that Caleb WHOLLY followed the Lord.
- 2. Wholly to fill or to be full fullness abundance to accomplish to the end. Completely entirely thoroughly in every respect

3. Other Versions

NIV – *he followed the Lord, the God of Israel, wholeheartedly*

AMP – He followed the Lord, the God of Israel completely

ISV – He fully followed the Lord

4. How you follow makes a difference in what you receive.

- a. Wholly following produces wholeness in our lives.
- b. Following at a distance or only as it is convenient limits our ability to receive.
- 5. The cost of following Jesus

Luke 9:57-62 (NLT) – ⁵⁷As they were walking along, someone said to Jesus, "I will follow you wherever you go." ⁵⁸But Jesus replied, "Foxes



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have dens to live in, and birds have nests, but the Son of Man has no place even to lay his head." ⁵⁹He said to another person, "Come, follow me." The man agreed, but he said, "Lord, first let me return home and bury my father." ⁶⁰But Jesus told him, "Let the spiritually dead bury their own dead! Your duty is to go and preach about the Kingdom of God." ⁶¹Another said, "Yes, Lord, I will follow you, but first let me say good-bye to my family." ⁶²But Jesus told him, "Anyone who puts a hand to the plow and then looks back is not fit for the Kingdom of God."

Note: Jesus wanted them to understand that to truly follow him – they would have to put him entirely first! *How you follow makes a difference!*

- B. How did Caleb WHOLLY follow the Lord?
 - 1. He had God's Word in his heart.
 - a. <u>Joshua 14:7 (NKJV)</u> I was forty years old when Moses the servant of the LORD sent me from Kadesh Barnea to spy out the land, and I brought back word to him as it was in my heart.
 - b. God's promises were in abundance in his heart.
 - c. <u>Matthew 12:34b (NKJV)</u> for out of the abundance of the heart, the mouth speaks
 - d. Caleb had the Word of God abundantly in his heart and it came out of this mouth.
 - e. His heart was wholly following.
 - f. His mouth was wholly following.
 - 2. He followed God despite the majority who didn't.
 - a. <u>Joshua 14:8 (NKJV)</u> Nevertheless my brethren who went up with me made the heart of the people melt, but I wholly followed the LORD my God
 - b. Faith must be willing to go against the majority. 10 out of 12 were not following God in their heart or in their mouth.
 - c. To wholly follow means, I follow God regardless of if anyone else does or not.



- 3. Caleb continued to WHOLLY follow God for forty years before he saw the manifestation of his promise.
 - a. For 45 years he watched every person in his generation die (Other than Joshua).
 - b. For 45 years he had to wander in the wilderness with those who had been cursed because of unbelief.
 - c. He didn't allow what he heard or saw to distract his faith. He continued to WHOLLY follow the Lord in faith until his day came 45 years later.
 - d. Joshua 14:10-12 (NKJV) ¹⁰And now, behold, the LORD has kept me alive, as He said, these forty-five years, ever since the LORD spoke this word to Moses while Israel wandered in the wilderness; and now, here I am this day, eighty-five years old. ¹¹As yet I am as strong this day as on the day that Moses sent me; just as my strength was then, so now is my strength for war, both for going out and for coming in. ¹²Now therefore, give me this mountain of which the LORD spoke in that day; for you heard in that day how the Anakim were there, and that the cities were great and fortified. It may be that the LORD will be with me, and I shall be able to drive them out as the LORD said.
 - e. **Forty--five years is a long time to stay in faith.** *Think back to where you were 45 years ago.*
 - f. Caleb continued to wholly follow God until he received his promise.

Joshua 14:13-14 (NKJV) – ¹³And Joshua blessed him, and gave Hebron to Caleb the son of Jephunneh as an inheritance. ¹⁴Hebron therefore became the inheritance of Caleb the son of Jephunneh the Kenizzite to this day, because he wholly followed the LORD God of Israel

C. How do I wholly follow the Lord?

- 1. Keep His covenant promises alive in your heart.
- 2. Keep releasing the Word of God out of your mouth.



- 3. Refuse to be moved by the circumstances that are going on around you.
- 4. Stay in faith regardless of how long it takes.
- 5. When your day arrives, believe for the supernatural sustaining power of God to allow you to receive the fullness of your promise. *It doesn't matter if I am 45 years older; God can sustain me in age.*

Joshua 15:14 (NKJV) – Caleb drove out the three sons of Anak from there: Sheshai, Ahiman, and Talmai, the children of Anak.
