SECOND LESSON

Revelation 5: 6-14 New Revised Standard Version

Then I saw between the throne and the four living creatures and among the elders a Lamb standing as if it had been slaughtered, with seven horns and seven eyes, which are the seven spirits of God sent out into all the earth. He went and took the scroll from the right hand of the one who was seated on the throne. When he had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell before the Lamb, each holding a harp and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints. FOUNDERS DAY PROCLAMATION

Founders Day is July 18th every year since July 18th, 1640 when the settlers acquired the land that is now Old Greenwich from the local indigenous people. Because the law in those days was that you could not have a town without a church first being established, 1665 is the date our church uses as its founding date. It took 25 years to have enough people in town to be able to afford the salary of a minister. The town of Greenwich uses the 1640 date for its founding.
