When Jesus learned that the Pharisees had heard he was baptizing more disciples than John, he left Judea and started back toward Galilee. But he had to go through Samaria. Tired from his journey, he sat beside Jacob's well at noon.

A Samaritan woman came to draw water, and Jesus asked her for a drink. Surprised, she said, "How can you, a Jew, ask a drink of me, a Samaritan woman?" Jesus answered, "If you knew the gift of God, you would have asked me, and I would have given you living water." She said, "Sir, you have no bucket, and the well is deep." Jesus replied, "Those who drink this water will thirst again, but those who drink the water I give will never be thirsty. It will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life." The woman said, "Sir, give me this water."

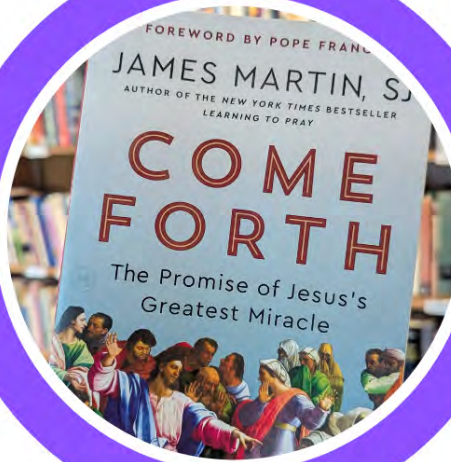
