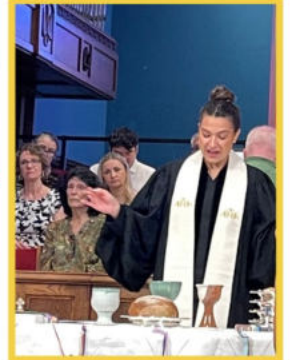
First Church Welcomes *You.*
