

### CHILDREN'S MESSAGE

(During the response, the children will return to their seats.)



On the day the Lord God made earth and sky— before any wild plants appeared on the earth, and before any field crops grew, because the Lord God hadn't yet sent rain on the earth and there was still no human being to farm the fertile land, though a stream rose from the earth and watered all of the fertile land— the Lord God formed the human from the topsoil of the fertile land and blew life's breath into his nostrils. The human came to life. The Lord God planted a garden in Eden in the east and put there the human he had formed. ## CELEBRATING DIVERSE WORSHIP EXPERIENCES: INTRODUCING THE SENSORY SANCTUARY

At FCCOG, we welcome that everyone worships in unique ways, and honor the diverse needs of our community. For many, sensory items can both greatly enhance their worship experience and also provide belonging and acceptance in the worship space. That's where the Sensory Sanctuary comes in: a dedicated resource library designed to support sensory worship needs.

The Sensory Sanctuary Resource Library offers a variety of items to help create a more inclusive worship environment, including: Noise-Canceling Headphones: To help reduce overwhelming sounds and create a more focused experience. Fidgets: A range of tactile items such as crochet hooks and yarn, finger labyrinths, thera-putty, and more, allowing individuals to engage their hands while they worship. Focusing Visual Aids: Tools that assist in maintaining attention and grounding oneself during worship. An Alternative Seating Option: Rocking chairs, catering to individual preferences and needs.

The Sensory Sanctuary is part of our ongoing commitment to providing the tools and resources that everyone deserves to make the Meetinghouse accessible and welcoming for all. We already do this through offerings like auditory aids and closed captioning, ramps and the Liftovator, and now, also through sensory implementations. Located at the back of the Meetinghouse, the Sensory Sanctuary Resource Library is available for all worshippers. We invite you to explore these resources and enrich your worship experience in a space that values and embraces diversity. No matter who you are, where you are on life's journey, or your sensory requirements, you are welcome at First Church.

### VISION TASK FORCE SURVEY RESULTS AND NEXT STEPS

The Vision Task Force (VTF) presented the results of the Congregational Visioning Survey, Leadership Survey, and Community Leader interviews on Sunday, June 30, with agency partner Convergence. The survey link and

password can be found in the Friday email blast.

As we enter the next phases of discussions, it's important to get as many people as possible involved in the process of dreaming and discerning. There was a wealth of information shared at the June presentation, so check your eblast and take some time to refresh your memory or explore it if you were not able to be at the June meeting.

- Two "recap" dates for that survey information will be after church around 11:15 a.m. for 45-60 minutes: September 15 & September 22. This will also be a chance to give feedback and ask questions about the results of the survey.
- Two Webinars led by Convergence Founder/CEO Rev. Cameron Trimble will be: Sunday, September 29 –

with repeat sessions **Tuesday**, **Oct** 1 (evening) and **Wednesday**, **Oct** 2 (morning) **The Great Unveiling** - This is a webinar where we look at the shifts happening in our culture, generating fundamental shifts in how we structure our communities, businesses, congregations, and families.

### Sunday, October 20 -

with repeat sessions Tuesday, Oct 22 (evening) and Wednesday, Oct 23 (morning) Creative Churches: A Virtual Tour of Growing Churches Changing Their Communities This webinar will tour creative churches around the country and learn from their ministries. We will explore how these churches have improved their communities, built coalitions for change, crossed interfaith divides, shaped dynamic worship experiences, embraced missional outreach and deepened their members' spirituality.

Our third session, with Convergence, is on **Saturday November 16, 10 am to 2 pm** with Rev. Cameron Trimble joining us in person. ### OPPORTUNITIES FOR ADULTS


