1. Introduction:

- a. Taking a look back:
 - 1) Matthew traded the old life for a new life when Jesus said, "Follow me."
 - 2) The hardness of heart of the religiously righteous here grieved and angered Jesus.
- 3) Guarding the heart for the believer against being hardened through life's situations and circumstances ought to be a high priority.
- b. Taking a look ahead:
 - 1) We get to walk in the midst of another crowd that has assembled to see and hear Jesus.
 - 2) Are you READY? Is your heart surrendered to the Lord in all things?
- 2. Jesus keeps on keeping on: Mark 3:7-12
 - a. Jesus walks toward the water: Verse 7-8
 - 1) There is a good but dangerous side to these crowds forming and following Jesus.
 - 2) Verse 10 have a boat ready -
 - 3) **Verse 9** in case the crowd presses Him back toward the water.
 - b. Some are set free from the power of satan.
 - 1) **Verse 11** some were delivered from being possessed by demons.
 - a) How did they know Him?
 - 2) **Verse 12** Jesus commanded the evil spirits to be quiet.
 - c. Application:
 - 1) We have those who have been sick, maybe even lame and now –
 - 2) We have those who are hearing the truth and -
 - 3) We have some who are religious zealots standing with -
 - 4) We have some you hear a shrieking and falling to the ground crying out -
 - 5) The important questions here:
 - a) What will those who were healed do now?
 - b) What will those who witnessed the healing do now?
 - c) What about those who sensed Jesus was speaking directly to their heart?
 - d) What will the religious zealots do now?
 - d. Application:
 - 1) What did you do the day Jesus set you free?
 - 2) As your knowledge of what God did for you that day increased, how are you responding moment by moment and day by day?
- 3. Jesus chooses 12 to train and send: Mark 3:13-19
 - a. First thing Jesus does:
 - 1) When you study the Gospels chronologically you sometimes see important steps being taken before important decision are made.
 - a) Luke 6:12 -
 - 2) Application do you pray before making big decisions in your life?
 - b. Twelve men just like you and me:
 - 1) Why say that?
 - a) We can relate to these men -

2) I Corinthians 1:26-31

- a) What strikes you about this passage?
- b) **Verse 26** Jesus doesn't call the "**wise**", skilled in letter and learned or the "**mighty**", mighty in wealth and influence, or the "**noble**", high and noble birth.
- c) **Verse 27** God has chosen the "**foolish things**", those without learning or extensive reading to "**confound**" or put to shame the "**wise**" of this world. God has chosen the "**weak**", those destitute of power among men to confound the "**mighty**", those who wield power among men by their rank, authority and riches.
- d) **Verse 28** God has chosen the "**base**", the person of no name or reputation, men held of no account and also things which are "**despised**", those of no account, utterly despised are the ones God has chosen to serve and lead.
- e) Verse 29 This is why God does this.
- f) Verse 30-31 Where does my help come from?
- 4. It is dangerous to be deceitful: Mark 3:19
 - a. Judas Iscariot:
 - 1) How can you explain this whole situation?
 - 2) Judas is described as being a traitor.
 - 3) Application Do you think it is possible to be near Christ and even associate with Him closely and yet become utterly hardened by sin?
 - 4) Application Do you think that Judas could have turned to Jesus?
 - b. Judas the outsider.
 - 1) "Judas" means "Jehovah leads"
 - 2) Does this surprise you? No one except Jesus knew who the traitor was.
 - 3) Judas had given his life to follow Jesus, but he never gave Jesus his heart.
 - 4) Judas, like many who attend church, had many opportunities to turn from sin.
 - 5) Application you need to think about these things –
 - c. Being deceitful, a temptation we all face.
 - 1) What truly concerns me about this is that -
