Southside Baptist Church Wednesday Night Worship – 8-2-23 Matthew Chapter 13 Part 4 The Parable of the Tares and Wheat

1. Introduction:

- a. Taking a look back:
 - 1) **Matthew 13 characteristics** of the kingdom in this present age.
 - a) Parables help us to see how God is going to work and the course of the Gospel in this world.
 - 2) "The kingdom of heaven is likened to..." means compare, become similar, resemble.
 - 3) In the Parable of the Sower:
 - a) The one sowing is moving. Not sowing in one place. Spreading Gospel.
 - b) The "seed" is the Word of God.
 - c) The "heart" the center of human life, your intellect, emotions, and will.
 - d) The true test of the heart/soil FRUIT!
 - e) The "wayside" regularly traveled path. Soil is hardened by the many who walk on it.
 - f) The fowls are a picture of satan.
 - g) "catcheth away" verse 19 satan seeks to reinforce by his influence that whatever the person is or however they are living that they are ok.
 - 4) Seeds sown on the "stony" (shallow) heart:
 - a) Without root no endurance when tribulation and persecution come.
 - b) Because of the shallowness of the soil quick and fruitless response.
 - c) Pictures an emotionally based response to the Gospel.
 - d) Root speaks of stability, grounded.
 - 5) Seeds sown among the "thorns" "thorn choked" heart:
 - a) Thorns upon the ground, some lying hidden. Thorns are weeds that naturally grow.
 - b) Thorns rob the seed of life. "Choke the word"
 - c) Thorns picture the "cares of this world" distractions. "deceitfulness of riches" the hold money and riches can have.
 - 6) We ended with a question last time, why do you think there is such a difference in the fruit produced? **Matthew 13:8, 23**.

b. Taking a look ahead:

- 1) Tonight, wrap up the Parable of the Sower.
- 2) Move into the Parable of the Tares and Wheat.

2. The "good ground (soil)" - the ready heart. Vs. 8 and vs. 23

- a. The Gospel is heard, it is received, and the Spirit of God begins to work in this new heart.
 - 1) The soil is ready, the seed is responding and the result is FRUIT!.
 - 2) What contributes to the different fruit that is produced?
 - a) Some suggestions would include -
 - 3) The seed is responding to the soil.
 - a) Is it possible that some soil is healthy and other soil, not so much?

b. A little different perspective:

- 1) The question is simply, what is it that can cause a seed to grow and produce maximum fruit?
- 2) I think there is a correlation between the amount of fruit and the care of the soil.

- 3) Application That prompted two questions that to be honest I am still thinking through.
 - a) First How do we care for the soil of people's hearts?
 - b) Second How do they care for their hearts?
- c. Jesus ended the parable: Verse 9
 - 1) "who hath ears to hear, let him hear."
- 2. The Parable of the "tares" and the "wheat": Matthew 13:24-30; 36-43
 - a. In this parable about the kingdom:
 - 1) Verse 24 "kingdom of heaven is likened unto a man which sowed" in verse 37 we are told that this man, the one who "soweth the good seed is the Son of man."
 - 2) Verse 24 "good seed" in verse 38 we find that the "good seed are the children of the kingdom" those who responded by faith to the truth of the Word.
 - 3) Verse 24 "**field**" in verse 38 we are told the "**field is the world**" for clarification the field is not the church.
 - 4) Verse 25 "his enemy" in verse 39 we are told that the "enemy that sowed them is the devil."
 - 5) Verse 25 "tares" in verse 38 we are told that the "tares are the children of the wicked one."
 - 6) Verse 30 "harvest" In verse 39 we are told the "harvest is the end of the world."
 - 7) Verse 30 "reapers" In verse 39 we are told the "reapers are the angels."
 - b. So important to keep in mind:
 - 1) The King has been rejected by Israel therefore
 - a) These parables help us to see how God is going to work and the course of the Gospel in the world.
 - c. Jesus is sowing "good seed" Verse 24 -
 - 1) In verse 24 the "man" referenced is the "Son of man" that is Jesus.
 - 2) The "good seed" that is sown in this parable isn't the Word of God, but it speaks of the "children of the kingdom". The "field" speaks of the "world".
 - 3) What do you see here?
 - d. The enemy is sowing "tares" Verse 25 -
 - 1) "while men slept" speaks of -
 - 2) Jesus reveals:
 - a) "The enemy" Jesus tells us it is the devil.
 - b) "tares" "children of the wicked one"
 - 3) What do you see?
 - 4) This may seem like a harsh and judgmental statement.
 - a) First, let me remind you here that it is Jesus who is doing the speaking.
 - b) Jesus pointed out that the enemy plants false Christians and false teachers where the "good seed" is, true believers.

- e. Think about these "tares":
 - 1) "tares" something that is sowed that looks like the real thing but actually is not and does not bear fruit.
 - 2) "tares" the real hypocrite in the Church for they resemble Christians, and some can even live their lives in such a way that it makes it hard to tell them from true believers.
 - 3) Just to be clear this hypocrisy we speak of is rooted in the work of satan.
 - 4) They are this way because of several possibilities.
 - 5) The sowing of these "tares" is interesting to me because it seems that it was easy?
 - 6) "and went his way" -

f. Time here is the key: Verse 26

- 1) There was a period of time when the two were functioning and growing together but when the fruit was produced, the tares were now visible.
- 2) The tares and the wheat grew together.

g. Someone was watching: Verse 27

- 1) Thank the Lord someone was watching.
- 2) If we see that this is a problem maybe in this time of grace we could pray for those among us that the Spirit would draw them and that their eyes would be opened.

h. These servants were ready and willing: Verse 28

1) The servants were ready and willing to go into the fields and get the tares out.

i. A warning to the "tares: Verse 29-30:

- 1) The harvest is coming.
- 2) Verse 30 "Let both grow together until the harvest: and in the time of harvest I will say to the reapers, gather ye together first the tares, and bind them in bundles to burn them: but gather the wheat into my barn."
