- 1. Introduction:
  - a. Taking a look back:
    - 1) We know the principle of the fence and the gate and how they were convicted of sin.
    - 2) We have seen the sin offering and the trespass offering.
    - 3) How do you respond to being forgiven?
      - a) The Burnt Offering, The Meal Offering and the Peace Offering
  - b. Taking a look ahead:
    - 1) Did you find out what it is within you that prompts/inspires/ignites you to worship the Lord?
    - 2) Worship is a chosen attitude of the mind and heart!
    - 3) We move closer to the door of the Tabernacle today!
- 2. The Bronze Laver: Exodus 30:17-21
  - a. Last piece of furniture in the Court of the Tabernacle.
    - 1) "laver" large basin designed for ceremonial washing.
    - 2) Exodus 30:17-21 made from bronze
      - a) Clean to worship and to serve!
- 3. The Laver's Contents: Exodus 30:18-20
  - a. It is filled with water:
    - 1) Why water and not blood?
    - 2) The water within the Laver is a picture of the Word of God.
      - a) Psalms 119:9 -
      - b) John 15:3 -
      - c) Ephesians 5:25-26
      - d) Titus 3:5 -
      - e) Hebrews 10:22 -
    - 3) The water is a picture of the power and the word of God's Word in our lives.
    - 4) Why does the Word have power?
      - a) Sanctification ongoing process in the believer's life –
- 4. The Laver's Purpose: Exodus 29:4; 30:19
  - a. The Initial Cleansing: Exodus 29:4
    - 1) "wash them completely" What does that imply?
      - a) This was done for them and not by them.
      - b) This was not repeated for this purpose.
    - 2) What does this sound like to you?
      - a) Once you have been washed completely by faith you need not be washed that way again.
    - 3) Aaron and his sons were born into the priesthood, so each believer, through the new birth is also born into the priesthood.
    - 4) But this prompts a question then, why the Laver and the washing of the hands and feet?
  - b. The Continual Cleansing:
    - 1) What did God command?
    - 2) John 13:1-11
      - a) Verse 6-7 Peter is thinking in humility, but Jesus tells him –

- b) Verse 9 Look at what Peter said this time?
- c) Verse 10 "He that is **washed** needeth not save to **wash** his feet, but is clean every whit, and ye are clean, but not all."
- d) "washed" means to bathe one's body completely
- e) "wash" speaks of those who wash their hands and feet.
- 3) Why did Jesus speak of hands and feet?
  - a) Are your hands and feet clean?
- 5. What we don't know, speaks very loud!
  - a. Don't miss this about the Laver:
    - 1) Was there something missing about the Laver?
    - 2) No measurements were given for the Laver. Why?
      - a) Could it be that it speaks of the unlimited provision that has been made by God for our cleansing?
    - 3) Something that is missing that we did not study today.
      - a) No directions for covering the Laver when they journeyed from camp to camp.
      - b) Could it be that the purifying Word of God is ever available and that we need it daily in our lives?
