## 1. Introduction:

- a. Taking a look back:
- 1) The Book of Acts reminds us of some important truths.
- a) Faith in Jesus Christ is real and life changing.
- b) The Church is alive.
- c) Believers are growing and being a witness.
- d) The enemy is at work.
- 2) Do we believe that what Jesus has done for us and desires to do through us is worth giving our lives for?
- 3) When you follow the Spirit of God, things happen.
- 4) Be sure you know the evidence. II Timothy 2:15
- 5) There is a correlation between our faith growing as our knowledge, understanding and application of the Word grows.
- b. Taking a look ahead:
- 1) Peter has caused a stir by speaking the truth.
- 2) Think about the battle in Peter's mind at this moment.
- 2. It's a new day. Acts 4:5-8
  - a. Examination time. Verses 5-6
  - 1) This has brought out some specific people.
  - 2) Can you feel the tension between Peter, John and these leaders?
  - 3) Verse 7
    - a) What is the point of this inquiry by the council?
    - b) They want to know "by what power, or by what name have ye done this?"
  - b. Answer time. Verses 8-10
  - 1) Verse 8 -
  - a) Peter is responding to the leading of the Holy Spirit as he opens his mouth.
  - b) This is an act of faith, right?
  - c) Could you see yourself doing this?
- 3. The hearts of those on this council get confronted. Acts 4:8-12
  - a. Listen to what the Spirit of God gave him to say. Verse 8
  - 1) "Ye rulers of the people, and elders of Israel"
  - b. Are you talking about the lame man?
  - 1) Verse 9 -
  - c. It was Jesus!
  - 1) Verse 10 -
  - a) "whom ye crucified" -
  - b) "whom God raised from the dead" -
  - c) "him" -
  - d) "does this man stand before you whole" -
  - 2) The problem here
    - a) To them, Jesus was dead.

- b) This lame man standing in front of them is EVIDENCE!
- d. Application:
- 1) Every person needs to consider the evidence of scripture.
- 2) Sometimes professing Christians reject the evidence that is right in front of them.
- 3) The leaders rejected the work and leading of the Holy Spirit, and Christians can just as easily be guilty of the same thing.
- 4) II Peter 1:3-4 -
- e. Application:
- 1) The flesh is really dangerous.
- 2) Galatians 5:17 -
- 3) What our flesh wants is against what God's Spirit wants, and what God's Spirit wants is against what we in our flesh want.
  - a) The flesh is dangerous because it always opposes what God wants.
- 4) What should Peter do?
- 4. The "stone". Acts 4:11-13
  - a. What does this mean?
  - 1) Verse 11 –
  - 2) Peter spoke of another evidence of scripture.
    - a) Peter refers to Jesus as "the stone" which was rejected by them.
    - b) What did this mean?
  - b. Evidence demands a verdict. Acts 4:12
  - 1) Verse 12 Evidence that demands a decision.
  - 2) Scripture gives us a unique look into the thoughts of these religious leaders.
    - a) Verse 13 -
    - b) They knew by their testimony and by listening that these men had been with Jesus.
- 5. Today's Take Away:
  - a. Verse 12 is still true today. Evidence is important and demands a verdict.
  - b. Are you practicing each day responding to the leading of the Holy Spirit in obedience?
  - c. Is your faith growing knowledge, understanding and application of God's Word?
  - d. Do you think anyone notices that you walk with Jesus each day?
