

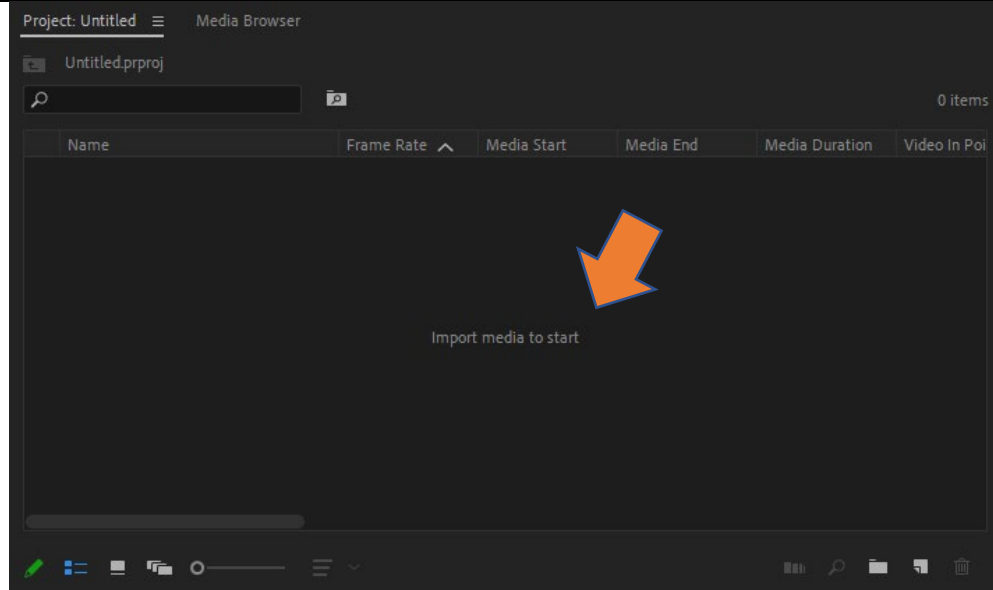


Attach Two Clips Together in Premiere Pro

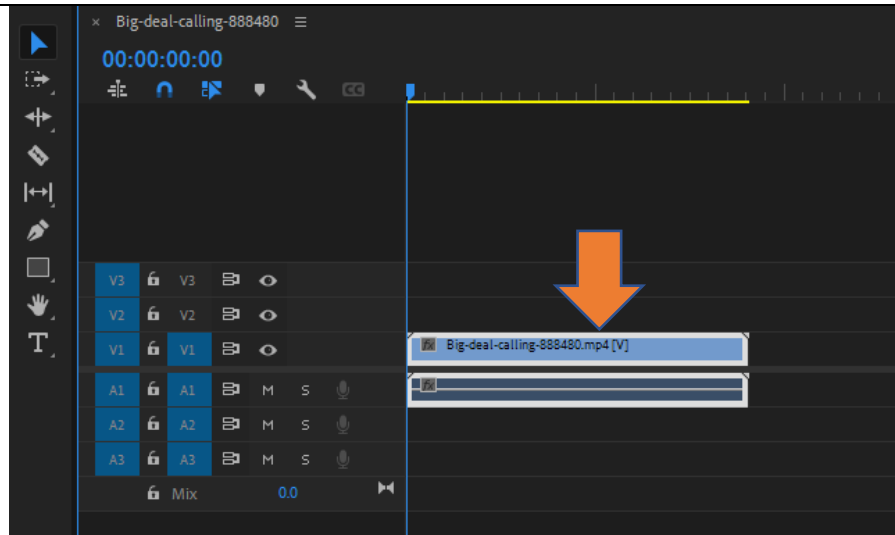




Double click on the 'Import media to start' area.

Drag the video to the timeline sequence.

<p>From the gap in between your clips, right click and select the Ripple Delete option.</p>	
<p>OPTIONAL: You can also use the same method of Ripple Delete whenever you use the Razor tool to split or delete a section of a video.</p>
