

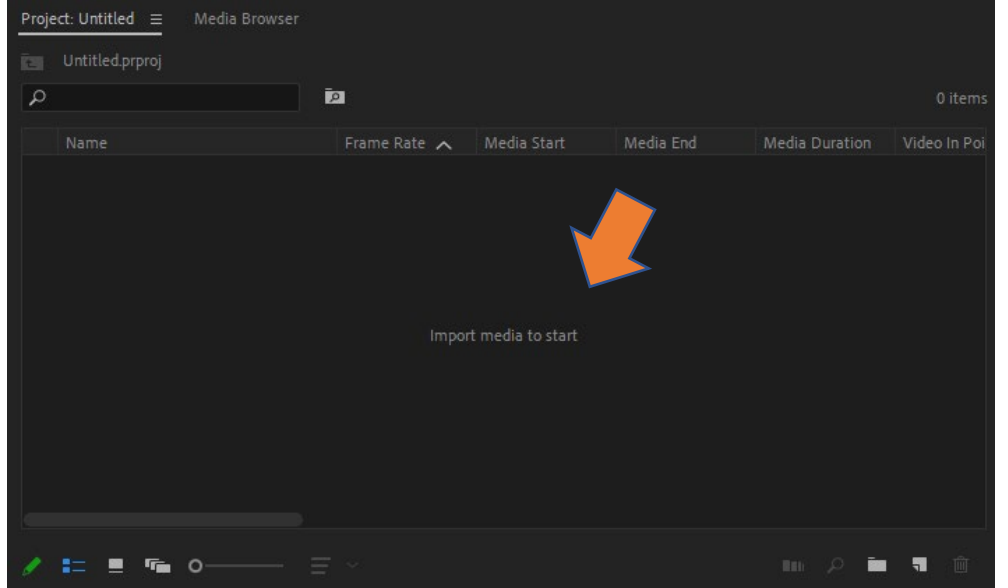


How to Clip a Video Using Adobe Premiere Pro

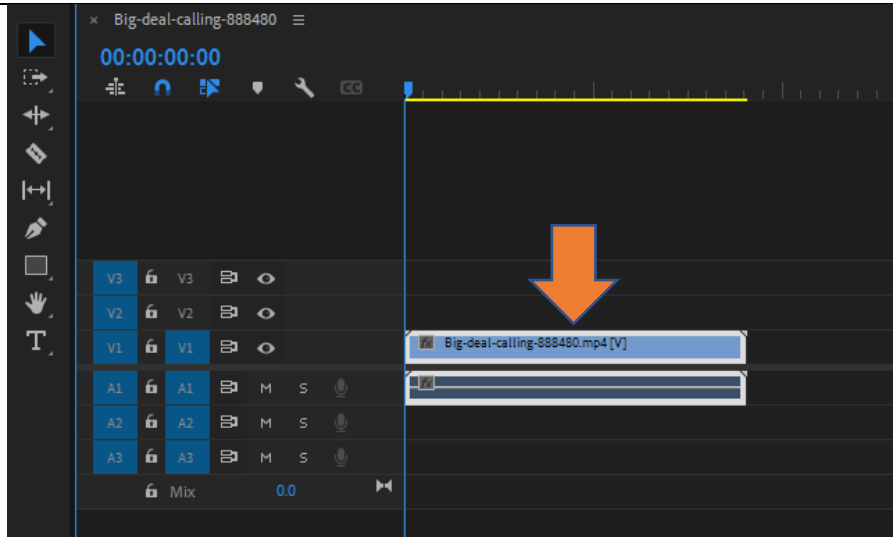

Double click on the 'Import media to start' area.

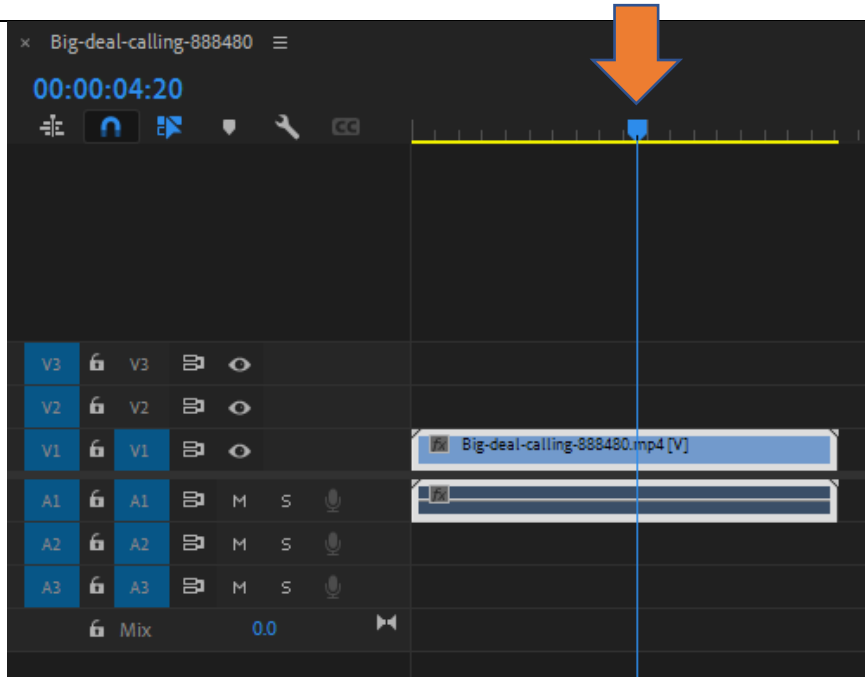


Find a video file you want to use for your project, then select Open.

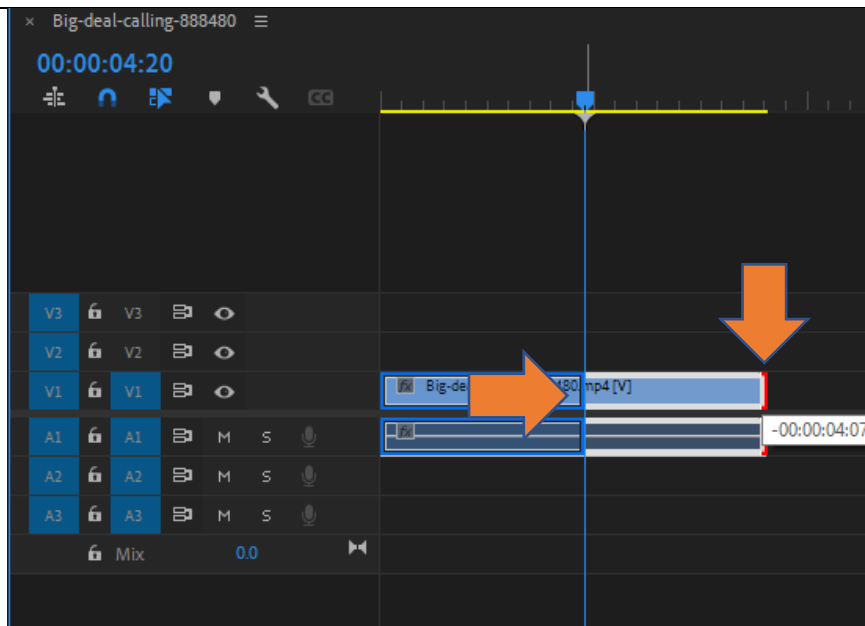
Drag the video to the timeline sequence.

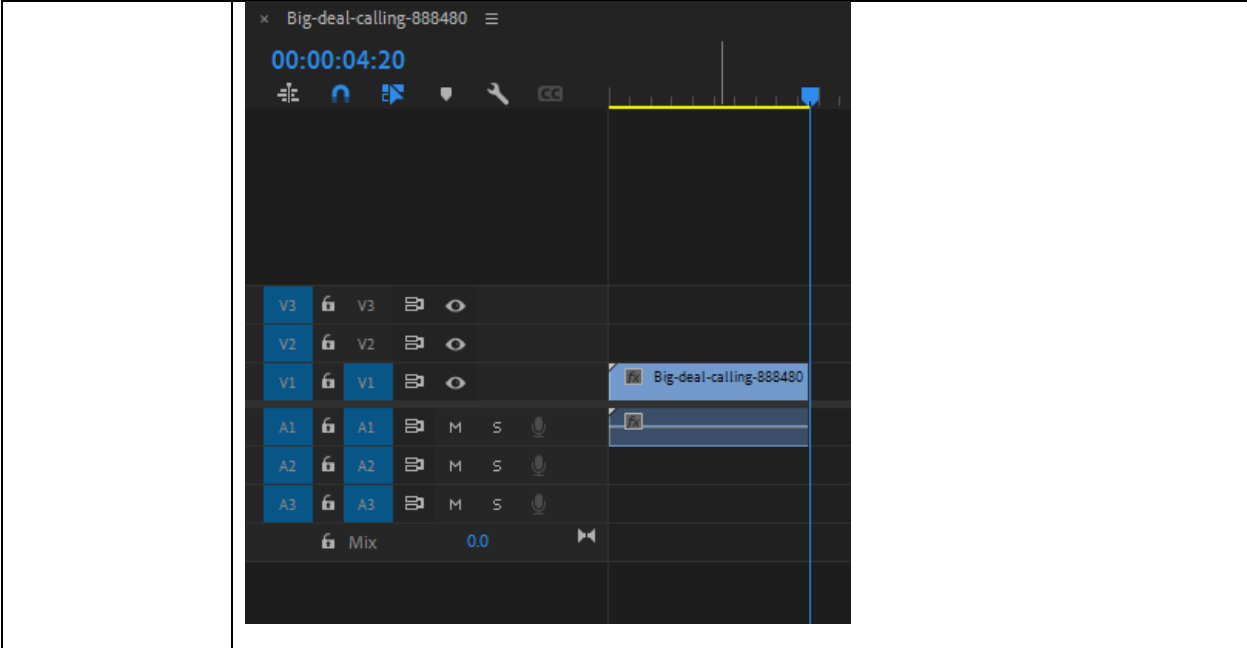


Move to the point in the video where you want to clip it.

Select either the beginning or end of the clip and drag it to where your cursor is.

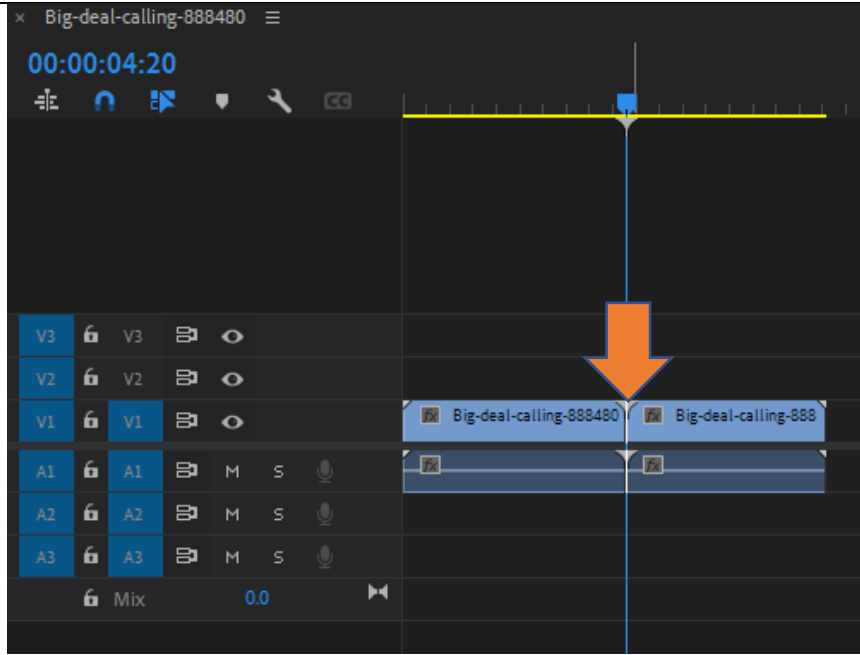




Option 2A:
