Prayer

Take a few moments to connect with one another. Share something exciting that God has been showing you lately!

My Story

Have you ever felt left out of something, but then felt welcomed by someone inviting you to feel included? Tell of a time you experienced the feeling of a warm invitation.

Starting Off

- 1) In the church, we often described our lives as a “faith journey” and “living the walk of faith”. What does it look like for a Christian to be living a life marked by their faith?
- 2) **Read Colossians 1:21-22.** In what ways do your own mind and behaviors keep you alienated from God? And how does the message of the gospel now turn you from an enemy of God, into a child of God?
- 3) **Read Colossians 1:23.** What does it mean to be a servant to the gospel message? Would you define your own faith journey with the language of servitude?

Digging Deep

- 4) Looking at the world around you, why is reconciliation such an important part of the Christian gospel? How do we maintain our future hope that God will restore all things while living out our walk of faith in a broken world?
- 5) Read Colossians 1:13-14. Without Jesus, we are dead to our sin and unable to rescue ourselves from the dominion of darkness. Why do people often attempt to redeem themselves rather than trusting in Jesus?
- 6) Read Colossians 1:9a-12. These verses describe an ongoing lifestyle that is a **RESULT** of being reconciled to Christ, and not needing to earn ones’ salvation. How do these traits reflect our need to be reliant on God for our walk of faith?

Taking it Home

- 7) What does it look like to stay strong in the faith amid false gospels and worldly thinking? What is one specific area you want to grow in?
- 8) God’s love is the premise for everything he does. God’s love is why he pursues us, redeems us, and sanctifies us in this life into the next. How should our love for God look like as a response towards that unconditional love?
