PRAYER

Pray a prayer of gratitude for the Good News of Jesus Christ and ask the Lord to guide your time together.

DIGGING DEEP

- 1) What about Sunday's message encouraged you, challenged you, or really made you think?
- 2) If a non-Christian were to ask you why you were a part of Creekside Christian Church, how would you respond? Would you talk more about the personal benefits or more about our church's local and global outreach and impact?
- 3) Read Galatians 6:2 and Acts 1:8. How can a church balance the needs of its own members while also seeking its duty to evangelize domestically and internationally? How do we as individuals within the church play a role?
- 4) What is a missional church? What are some characteristics that would differ between a church fulfilling its duty to be a missional church vs. a church that is not being missional?

DIGGING DEEPER

5) What is missional living? Read Matthew 28:18-20 and Matthew 5:16. Which of these two comes easiest to you: *sharing* the Good News or *showing* the Good News of Jesus? Explain.

- 6) Read John 1:14. Discuss how the incarnation of the Son of God on earth reflects the heart of God. How does Jesus' example point the way to missional living?
- 7) Read John 20:21 and Matthew 28:18-20. According to these verses, what is God's mission for your life? How much attention do you currently give to spreading the gospel of Jesus Christ? Do you sense the Holy Spirit prompting you to adjust any priorities or behaviors regarding this personal mission? If so, explain.

TAKING IT HOME

- 8) Read 1 Corinthians 15:1-4. This passage is a clear description of the gospel message and the importance of sharing it. Would those who know you well (family, friends, neighbors or coworkers) be able to see the truth of these verses applied in your life? Why or why not? What behaviors may need to change?
- 9) Name a person in your life that may not know many other Christians besides you. Pray for them. How do you think God wants to use your relationship with that person to bring the message of the Good News of Jesus Christ to them?
