Prayer

Take a few moments to catch up with everyone. Open your time in prayer and ask the Lord to create an environment for meaningful conversations to occur.

My Story

Think back to when you were a child. Who was your best friend? Why was that relationship so important to you?

Digging Deep

- 1) What are some of your biggest fears or anxieties when meeting new people? How do you try to overcome them?
- 2) Read Mark 12:28-31 & 1 John 4:12,20. How is our relationship with God connected to our relationship with the people around us?
- 3) Discuss what it means to be connected, committed and growing in a community of like-minded believers. Considering your own gifts, passions and experiences, what does it look like for you personally to be growing in your relationships with others?

Digging Deeper

- 4) Read Genesis 1:26-27 & 2:18. The 3 persons of the Godhead (Father, Son and Spirit) created mankind in their collective image, which is a community-bearing image. Our triune God is a relational God and created us to have "community DNA." Why is it so important for us to lean into this created design?
- 5) One of the beautiful aspects of the incarnation (i.e., the Son of God coming to Earth in the flesh) is that Jesus chose to set aside His heavenly glory to share life alongside people on Earth. Thinking of Jesus' life and ministry, discuss how He displayed "community DNA?" What clues does His example offer us as we think about relating to those around us?

Discuss what interdependence means to you, as well as potential obstacles we face when we pursue interdependence in our friendships/relationships.
