My Story

What comes to mind when you hear the expression "Christian family?" Describe what you think a Christian family should look like today.

Digging Deep

- 1) Quick Review: Take a minute to look back over your sermon notes. Is there a particular truth, application or part of the message that challenged you or caught your attention?
- 2) If you could go back in time and give your parents a piece of advice from this week's sermon what would it be?
- 3) How would you define the word 'influence?' What kind of influence do you have on the people around you?
- 4) Depending on the kind of environment you were raised in, you likely have had a variety of positive and negative influences in your life. How do the positive influences stay with you? How do you attempt to over come some of the negative influences?

Digging Even Deeper

5) Read Proverbs 22:6. (Remember this is a proverb and not a promise!) In light of the fact that we have no absolute guarantees that our children will choose to walk by faith with God, what do you think this verse actually means? (Hint: Proverbs 22:15 might offer a clue!)

- 6) Read Ephesians 6:4 and Colossians 3:21. What do terms like 'exasperate,' 'embitter' or 'provoke to anger' mean? What is the difference between bending a child's will or breaking their spirit? How could a parent intentionally or unintentionally push their child too far?
- 7) Think of any training or discipline regimen required to get better at something you want to do. What does it look like for parents and those who have influence over children to bring someone up in the 'training and instruction of the Lord?' Discuss as a group practical ways you can influence the next generation for Jesus.
- 8) Read Ezekiel 18:20. How does this verse speak to generational cycles of brokenness within families? Where does ultimate responsibility lie concerning the way kids grow up and live their lives? Where is the hope when generational cycles are unhealthy or dysfunctional?

Taking it Home

- 9) Write down 5-10 names of people in your life with whom you have influence. Now consider Creekside's **definition of a disciple** as 'someone who learns to live and love like Jesus and leads others to do the same.' Now evaluate your current character and life disciplines. Do they model the kind of life you hope others would adopt or imitate? If not, what do you think needs to be addressed first in your life to remedy this challenge?
- 10) Quickly review the 5 ideas offered for increasing your odds of success with children as you leverage influence on them. Instead of giving way to the fear of failure, which of these ideas speaks loudest to you regarding the way you need to exert influence on the next generation for the sake of the kingdom of God? (NOTE: Passing the Torch is an important part of a parent's job description. To do this well we need to remember that many things are better "caught" than "taught.")
