Digging Deep

- 1) Read Jonah 3:1-2. Even after spending three days in the fish and being vomited out, Jonah still needed to be told a second time about his original command of going to Nineveh. Why do you think Jonah was still hesitant to go to Nineveh? What generally stops you from being obedient to God the first time you are asked?
- 2) Why would God still try to use someone as disobedient as Jonah to proclaim His message to Nineveh?

Digging Deeper

3) Read Jonah 3:3-5. As Christians in the world today, we might get caught up in the lie that we have to meet God's standards of righteousness before we can obey. How does Nineveh's response to Jonah's sermon show otherwise?

4) The city of Nineveh was ready to repent from their evil ways and responded quickly to Jonah's short sermon. Have you ever had someone suddenly respond to a message of repentance? Even without knowing God, why do you think they responded so quickly? How does this help you pray for people who are far from God?

- 5) Read Jonah 3:6-10. Recap the king's response. Does this surprise you? If non-believers can see the importance of calling on God to turn away from their sin, why do you think believers sometimes attempt to hide or run away from God? Do you have a story of running that you are willing to share?
- 6) God saw the repentance of the Ninevites and had compassion on them. Did Jonah or the city of Nineveh deserve the second chance that God gave them? When has God given you two chances?
- 7) What have you found helpful in turning back to God? Prayer, confession, attending church, Bible study, help from another believer, etc. How might you use this to help someone who is struggling?

Taking it Home

- 8) Read Titus 2:11-13. Do you believe that God's grace is for all people? Why or why not? How are you living a godly life and sharing God's grace with those around you?
- 9) Jonah never would have have been stuck in the fish for three days had he obeyed God the first time. Where is a potential area of disobedience in your life that is causing you unnecessary pain? Are you willing to share with a friend and ask for prayer in this area?
