Paul Reviewed His Past Ministry (20:18-21)

- properly executed Christian ministry is evident to and can be affirmed by others.
- properly executed Christian ministry encompasses the whole and not just the parts, which means by implication that faithfulness is as important as individual successes.
- properly executed Christian ministry is a duty.
- properly executed Christian ministry is marked by humility, that is, a lowliness of mind that places God and others above one's self.
- properly executed Christian ministry is marked by tears, that is, a godly sorrow over false or inadequate beliefs regarding God, over the condition of the lost, and over the sin of God's people, all things over which Paul sorrowed (Rom. 9:2-3;2 Cor. 2:4; Phil. 3:18).
- properly executed Christian ministry is marked by trials in that it will be resisted by the kingdom of Satan (Ac. 9:16; 14:19-20; 20:3; 2 Cor. 11:24, 26).
- properly executed Christian ministry does not cower or shrink back before opposition but faithfully follows through, in spite of opposition to it.
- properly executed Christian ministry is focused primarily upon the teaching of the Word of God in all and every opportunity.
- properly executed Christian ministry contains both a public ministry and intimate ministry to individuals and families.
- properly executed Christian ministry defends and proclaims the complete gospel of God, both repentance and faith.
